## Public Awareness Campaign On Abuse Of The Sewer Network Kicks Off

The Municipality recently embarked on a series of public awareness sessions in Walvis Bay to educate the public about the role they can play in preventing sewage blockages which lead to constant sewage overflows.

Abuse of the sewerage system has become a chronic problem in recent years, resulting in constant blockages of the system which lead to subsequent overflows of sewage water. Items such as camping chairs, TV sets, tires, cutlery, oil, clothing and fishing nets, to name a few, have been retrieved from the network by the Water Management team, in effort to clear blockages.

Residents in sewage overflow hot spots in residential areas and businesses in the industrial areas, have been invited in phases/groups to information sharing sessions or the past couple of weeks. The first session was held

on 24 March, with business owners operating in the light industrial area in 8th Street East, particularly due to the dumping of oil in this area. Technicians from the water waste section had a chance to educate the business owners regarding the dangers of dumping oil in the sewage system and how it affects other businesses. The business owners had an opportunity to also voice their frustrations, ask questions and give suggestions.

At this occasion, the Engineer for Water, Henok Shikongo said that although the sewage infrastructure is aged, the current rate of sewage abuse is causing the larger percentage of sewage block-

ages. He further noted that in the meantime, council is continuing with programmes to maintain and upgrade the infrastructure. This campaign is ongoing.

campaign is ongoing. To complement these efforts the Health Division is also conducting door to door visits in the residential areas to hand out pamphlets and explain the dangers of disposing foreign objects in the sewage system.

## No more unconditional use of pre-paid SIM cards Eileen van der Schyff

A new draft law by Namibia's Communications Regulatory Authority (CRAN) presented to Parliament in consultation with the Minister of Information and Communications Technology, provides for adjustments to be made for licensees of telecommunications services whereby the revised Communications Act provides that a mobile network provider may not issue or activate a SIM card for a customer unless that customer is contractually registered as the holder of such SIM card.

The new terms, published under Chapter 5 of the Communications Act 2009 (Act 8) in the Government Gazette on 15 march 2021, makes them enforceable. A written contract must be completed with the mobile network service provider, which identifies the user as the legal owner of the SIM card.






