The following conditions (imposed in terms of Section 55(9) of the Act.) apply to this permit:

- a) A buffer zone of 15km radius is to be created and maintained around the Brandberg National Heritage Site. This should be regarded as a NO-GO zone and the proponent is expected to comply with this.
- b) Within the remaining portion of the proposed area of interest, the proponent should comply to the following:
 - A buffer zone of 1km radius should be created and maintained around all rock art paintings within the EPL.
 - A buffer zone of 100m radius should be created and maintained around all burial sites found within the EPL, which are to be fenced off.
 - All burial sites found within the EPL are to be fenced off in consultation with the community.

- d) The consent holder is to report back to the National Heritage Council every six (6) months on compliance with the conditions of this consent.
- e) This Consent does not exempt the holder from any conditions that may be imposed by owners, hosts or any other relevant authorities in consultation with NHC who have a stake in the project area.
- f) NHC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities related to this permit.
- g) This Consent is subject to the provisions of the National Heritage Act (Act 27 of 2004). Should any of the conditions contained herein conflict with the Act; the provisions of the Act as per Section 55 (10) shall prevail.
- h) Adopt the Chance Find Procedures.
- i) This consent is renewable, upon submission of an application at least two months before the current permit lapses

This Consent will be valid from 2nd February 2023 to 1st February 2024.
