The public consultation meeting was attended by 19 farmers (landowners that are directly affected), including one (1) Environmental Impact Assessment Practitioner (Mr. Titus Shuuya) and one (1) Archaeologist (Mr. Roland Mushi) from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS). - Please refer to the attached attendance register.

## 1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

The meeting was opened by the Environmental Consultant with an introduction of the team, who they are, and why they are consulting affected parties of the proposed prospecting and exploration activities on EPLs 7372 and 7373. The meeting attendance register was then circulated for the attendees to write down their names, and contact details so that they could be added to the list of interested and affected parties (I\&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

## 2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

### 2.1 Brief Description of the Project

The Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) and the reason why the Proponent appointed Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS), an independent Environmental Consultant to carry out the ESA and apply for the Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC).

### 2.2 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process, and the Public Role in the Process

The EAP explained to the attendees the purpose of the meeting and why they were invited (about the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation). The EAP further explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an ECC from the Environmental Commissioner.

### 2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Environmental Consultants also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive \& negative environmental and social impacts.

### 2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

The EAP allowed the meeting attendees to raise their concerns/issues and/or comments on the proposed project activities. The concerns/issues and comments recorded are presented in Table 1 below.

| 4. | Commenter 4: The two phases mentioned in the Background Information (BID) from what I have experienced in the past, the first phase must include minimal soil sampling. Phase 1 should be differentiated from Phase 2. Phase 2 involves detailed exploration activities with at least a separate contract agreement, because this is the invasive stage that requires rehabilitation, for example where holes are drilled and caped after. We hope that the proponent of these EPLs will do the same to rehabilitate the area. | EAP: Thank you, for the input, we will incorporate this into our reporting and these will be commitments or conditions that will be stated in the Environmental Management Plan (EMP), which will be the legally binding document. |
| 5. | Commenter 5: My farm has some graves that have been there for centuries now. But is the heritage part not only important if the proponent identifies my farm as one of their target areas for detailed exploration etc? | Archeologist: Thank you for the information, but we need to take note of all the heritage sites and take coordinate those sites and protect them so they can not be destroyed during the prospecting and exploration activities. |

All negative impacts shall have mitigation measures in place, and they will be highlighted in the EMP. |
| 7. | Commenter 7: People have problems with rehabilitating the land, especially with the funds for rehabilitation, how are they going to rehabilitate the affected area? | EAP: The EMP will be used as a tool to monitor compliance with the commitments and, there is a part on how to rehabilitate the affected area and the proponent must adhere. |

Once the review of the draft ESA Report and EMP is done, the documents will be finalized and submitted to the Environmental Commissioner at the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) for evaluation and consideration of an ECC.
