**.PARTICULARS OF CLAIM**  
1. **THE PLAINTIFF IS FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF NAMIBIA LTD.**, a financial institution, with limited liability, duly registered and incorporated as such in terms of the relevant company laws of the Republic of Namibia, duly registered as a commercial bank with registration number 2002/0180, and having its principal place of business at **First National Bank, Head Office, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, @Parkside, 130 Independence Avenue, Windhoek, Republic of Namibia.**

2. **The DEFENDANT is EBERHARD KANYANGA NDARA**, I.D. No. 911116 0093 7, an adult male person, with his chosen *domicilium citandi et executandi* being **Ndama, Rundu, Republic of Namibia.** The full and further particulars of the Defendant are unknown to the Plaintiff. At all material times, the Defendant acted in person.

3. The whole cause of action arose within the area of jurisdiction of this honourable  
**Claim 1: Revolving Loan – 4 000 005 488 535**

4. On or about the 13<sup>th</sup> of September 2018 and at Rundu, the Plaintiff, duly represented by A. Edward, and the Defendant entered into a written revolving loan agreement in terms of which the Plaintiff would grant credit facilities to the Defendant on a revolving loan account, bearing account number 4 000 005 488 535 (hereinafter referred to as "the Revolving Loan Agreement"). A certified copy of the Revolving Loan Agreement is attached hereto, marked as "A", the terms of which are incorporated herein as if specifically pleaded.

5. The express, alternatively tacit, further alternative implied terms of the Revolving Loan Agreement were:  
5.1. The Plaintiff would provide credit facilities to the Defendant on a revolving loan account in the amount

of N\$ 15 000.00;  
5.2. The Defendant would repay the aforesaid amount advanced by the Plaintiff to the Defendant in monthly instalments in the amount of N\$ 425.32 per month, minimum;  
5.3. In the event of the Defendant defaulting on any of his monthly instalments or commits any other act of breach as more fully set out in clause 7 of annexure "A", the whole balance of the full amount owing to the Plaintiff would become due and payable upon such default;  
5.4. The Plaintiff would be entitled to charge the Defendant with interest, at the Rate of 16.80% per annum, compounded monthly in arrears on the daily balance owing by the Defendant to the Plaintiff;  
5.5. The Plaintiff would be entitled to vary the interest rate, should there be unforeseen factors that would necessitate a variation of the interest rate;  
5.6. The period of repayment would vary depending on the variation of the interest rate and/or any additional payments made by the Defendant;  
5.7. The Defendant would pay the legal costs of the Plaintiff arising from the terms and conditions of the Revolving Loan Agreement on an attorney-own-client scale in terms of Clause 9; and  
5.8. A certificate signed by any authorized employee of the Plaintiff (whose appointment or authority will constitute prima facie evidence of the outstanding balance owing, whether due and payable, by the Defendant to the Plaintiff.

6. The Plaintiff duly complied with its obligations in terms of the Revolving Loan Agreement in that it advanced the amount of N\$ 15 000.00 to the Defendant.

7. The Defendant is in material breach of the Revolving Loan Agreement, in that, he has failed to pay the monthly instalments owing to the Plaintiff as and when such instalments become due and payable since October 2020. The Defendant is in arrears with his repayment obligations in terms of the Revolving Loan Agreement.

8. The Defendant is therefore liable to the Plaintiff in the amount of **N\$ 10 543.75 (Ten Thousand Five Hundred and Forty-Three Namibia Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents)** plus interest thereon at the rate of 12% (being the current Prime Rate of 7.5% plus 4.5%) per annum as from the 21<sup>st</sup> of November 2021 to date of final payment as per the certificate of indebtedness attached hereto, marked as "B".

9. Despite demand on or about the 18<sup>th</sup> of January 2022, alternatively Summons constituting demand, the Defendant has failed and/or refused and/or neglected to pay the amount to the Plaintiff, which amount is due, owing and payable to the Plaintiff. The Plaintiff refers to annexure "C" which constitutes a copy of the letter of demand delivered by registered post to the Defendant.

**Claim 2: Personal Loan – 4 000 005 356 671**

10. On or about the 27<sup>th</sup> February 2018 and at Rundu, the Plaintiff, duly represented by S. Mwanthanhele, and the Defendant entered into a partly oral and partly written personal loan agreement in terms of which the Plaintiff would grant credit facilities to the first Defendant on a personal loan, bearing account number 4 000 005 356 671 (hereinafter referred to as "the Personal Loan Agreement"). A certified copy of the written portion of the Personal Loan Agreement is attached hereto, marked as "D", the terms of which are incorporated herein as if specifically pleaded.

11. The express, alternatively tacit, further alternative implied terms of the Personal Loan Agreement were:  
11.1. The Plaintiff would provide credit facilities to the Defendant on a personal loan account in the amount of N\$ 120 310.19.  
11.2. The Defendant would repay the aforesaid amount advanced by the Plaintiff to the Defendant in monthly instalments of N\$ 3 006.61 per month over a period of 60 months;  
11.3. In the event of the Defendant defaulting on any of his monthly instalments, the whole balance of the amount owing will become due and payable upon such default;  
11.4. The Plaintiff would be entitled to charge the Defendant with interest, at the rate of 16.80% per annum, compounded monthly in arrears on the daily balance owing by the Defendant to the Plaintiff, which interest the Plaintiff would be entitled to vary;

11.5. Should the Defendant breach

the Agreement, he would be liable for the costs of enforcing the agreement on a scale as between attorney-client, clause 13 of the terms and conditions of the Agreement;

11.6. The Plaintiff would be entitled to vary the interest rate, would there be unforeseen factors that would necessitate an increase or decrease of the interest rate; and

11.7. A certificate signed by any authorized employee of the Plaintiff (whose appointment or authority will constitute prima facie evidence of the outstanding balance owing, whether due and payable, by the Defendant to the Plaintiff.

12. The Plaintiff duly complied with its obligations in terms of the Personal Loan Agreement in that it lent and advanced the amount of N\$ 120 310.19 to the Defendant.

13. The Defendant breached the Personal Loan Agreement in that he has failed to pay the monthly instalments owing to the Plaintiff as and when such instalments become due and payable, and has missed thirteen instalments as at 25<sup>th</sup> November 2021.

14. The Defendant is therefore liable to the Plaintiff in the amount of **N\$ 81 785.55 (Eighty-One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-Five Namibia Dollars and Fifty-Five Cents)** plus interest thereon at the rate of 12%, being prime rate of 7.50% plus 4.50%, per annum as from the 21<sup>st</sup> of November 2021 to date of final payment as per the certificate of indebtedness attached hereto, marked as "E".

15. Despite written demand on or about the 18<sup>th</sup> of January 2022, alternatively Summons constituting demand, the Defendant has failed and/or refused and/or neglected to pay the amounts the Plaintiff, which amount is due, owing and payable to the Plaintiff. The Plaintiff refers to annexure "C" which constitutes a copy of the letter of demand delivered by registered post to the Defendant.

**Claim 3: Overdraft Cheque Account – 622 545 501 58**

16. On or about the 19<sup>th</sup> of November 2017 and at Rundu, the Plaintiff, duly represented by A. Edward, and the Defendant acting in person, entered into an oral agreement in terms of which the Plaintiff would lend and advance monies to the Defendant on a cheque account, bearing account **622 545 501 58** (hereinafter referred to as "the Overdraft Cheque Agreement").

17. The express, alternatively tacit, further alternative implied terms of the Overdraft Cheque Agreement were:  
17.1. The Plaintiff would provide overdraft credit facilities to the Defendant on his cheque account in the amount of N\$12 000.00 as required from time to time at the special instance of the Defendant;

17.2. The Defendant would maintain the cheque account and same would remain the principal transactional account of the Defendant for the period and/or for as long as the overdraft was outstanding;

17.3. The overdraft facility would become due, owing and payable on demand by the Plaintiff;

17.4. The Plaintiff would be entitled to charge the Defendant with interest, at a variable interest rate equal to the Prime Rate of the Plaintiff (which is currently 7.50%) per annum, compounded monthly in arrears on the daily balance owing by the Defendant to the Plaintiff;

17.5. The Plaintiff would be entitled to charge facility and service fees in respect of the overdraft credit facility and for the general administration of the cheque account of the Defendant, as well as costs and expenses in connection with the preparation of any agreements and securities relating to the overdraft credit facility;

17.6. The Plaintiff would be entitled to cancel the Overdraft Cheque Account should the Defendant breach any of the terms of the Overdraft Cheque Account and/or any other credit facility granted by the Plaintiff to the Defendant; and

17.7. A certificate signed by any authorized employee of the Plaintiff (whose appointment or authority will not need to be proved) will constitute prima facie evidence of the outstanding balance owing, whether due and payable, by the Defendant to the Plaintiff.

18. The Plaintiff duly complied with its obligations in terms of the Overdraft Cheque Agreement in that it granted the credit facilities to the extent of N\$12 000.00 to the Defendant.

19. On or about the 18<sup>th</sup> of January 2022 the Plaintiff demanded payment from the Defendant in the amount of N\$ 11 476.49. The Plaintiff refers to annexure "C" which constitutes a

copy of the letter of demand delivered by registered post to the Defendant.

20. The Defendant has breached the Overdraft Cheque Agreement in that he has failed and/or refused and/or neglected to pay the amount to the Plaintiff upon demand and has breached the terms of the other credit facilities granted to her as pleaded herein.

21. Consequent to the Defendant's breach the Plaintiff has cancelled the Overdraft Cheque Agreement, alternatively cancels same herewith.

22. In the premises, the Defendant is liable to the Plaintiff in the amount of **N\$ 11 476.49 (Eleven Thousand Four Hundred and Seventy-Six Namibia Dollars and Forty-Nine Cents)** plus interest thereon at the rate of 12% per annum as from the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2021 to date of final payment as per the certificate of indebtedness attached hereto, marked as "F".

**WHEREFORE** the PLAINTIFF prays for judgment against the DEFENDANT in the following terms:

The EAP explained to the attendees the purpose of the meeting and why they were invited (about the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation). The EAP further explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an ECC from the Environmental Commissioner.

## **2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts**

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Environmental Consultants also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive & negative environmental and social impacts.

## **2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)**

The EAP allowed the meeting attendees to raise their concerns/issues and/or comments on the proposed project activities. The concerns/issues and comments recorded are presented in **Table 1** below.

Furthermore, the EAP informed the attendees that the draft meeting minutes, Environmental Assessment Report, and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) will be shared with them for review and further comments. These documents will be made available through emails provided on the attendance register.

Once the review of the draft ESA Report and EMP is done, the documents will be finalized and submitted to the Environmental Commissioner at the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) for evaluation and consideration of an ECC.

The meeting adjourned at 11h07.
