# 1 SUMMARY OF PUBLIC MEETINGS AND COMMENTS FROM I&APS

## 1.1 INTRODUCTION

In terms of the Environmental Management Act No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 regulations, Osino Gold Exploration and Mining (Pty) Ltd has contracted Environmental Compliance Consultancy (Pty) Ltd (ECC) on behalf of NamPower to conduct an environmental impact assessment (EIA) for the 66 kV overhead powerline grid from the NamPower Erongo substation to Twin Hills Gold Project on mining licence (ML) 238. Two powerline routes are proposed, with the preferred route covering approximately 20.3 km while the alternative route is approximately 24.6 km.

The Twin Hills Gold Project was issued an environmental clearance certificate in November 2022 to proceed with the Project on ML 238. Therefore, the 66 kV mono steel overhead power grid will supply power required for mining operations on ML 238. As per section 21 of the EMA, the public and relevant stakeholders were engaged with during the early stages of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process. A public meeting was held at the town hall of the Karibib Town Council on the 20<sup>th</sup> of April 2023.

Prior to the public meeting, invitations were sent out to potentially I&APs, local, regional, and national authorities. Notices were published in national newspapers and media outlets to advertise the meeting. Attendees of the meeting were registered as interested and affected parties (I&APs), and their feedback was captured. A summary of public feedback will be issued to stakeholders, including registered I&APs and the competent authorities such as the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) and Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT) for review and commentary before such information is submitted to the government as appendix of the final EIA report, which will ultimately lead to a record of decision (RoD).

## 1.2 PUBLIC MEETING SUMMARY

The public meeting was led by Samuel Shinyemba, the Stakeholder Liaison Officer from Environmental Compliance Consultancy (ECC).

At the start of the public meetings, the attendees were welcomed and introduced to Environmental Compliance Consultancy (ECC) as an independent environmental consulting company commissioned by the Proponent, (Osino) to act as the Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP). ECC was contracted and tasked with conducting the environmental impact assessment and applying for an environmental clearance certificate for the entire Twin Hills Gold Project on ML 238.

As part of the Project's introduction to the public, focal points presented on were:

- Objectives of the public meeting;
- The Project's location;
- The EIA process; and
- Identified impacts during the Project screening phase; and
- Baseline studies conducted thus far on the entire Twin Hills Project.

The presentation from ECC covered a detailed description of the public consultation process. At this stage, I&APs were encouraged and informed of the importance of raising any concerns and comments related to the proposed powerline development from NamPower Erongo substation to ML 238, which ultimately will be considered in the EIA studies and submitted along with the environmental clearance certificate application to the competent authorities and MEFT for a record of decision.

The main components of the environmental assessment identified for consideration in the EIA were discussed. Major concerns raised were based on visual impacts, socio-economic impacts and the technicality of Project deliverables.

The public engagement phase aimed to involve and engage I&APs to develop target-specific Terms of References (TOR) for necessary specialist studies required to address all identified concerns and potential impacts in the assessment report.

### 1.3 KEY FEEDBACK ON ISSUES OF CONCERN – PUBLIC MEETING

The summary of comments received from the public meetings present useful and valuable input in setting out the scope for the environmental assessment through questions asked and points raised. An overall review of the recorded statements and the key common themes of concern that were raised are summarised in the following categories:

#### 1.3.1 VISUAL IMPACTS

Participants inquired on the visual impacts of the powerline, given that both proposed powerlines routes are within 5 nautical miles from the Karibib Air Force Base. Participants argued that route 1 will have minimal visual impacts, however route 2 might cause aircraft landing disruptions at the Air Force Base. The alternative route is close to the landing area of the Air Base and visual impacts are thus foreseen. The environmental practitioner responded that preference is geared towards route 1 which is shorter and crosses only one farm that is not owned by Osino. Additionally, it is further away from the Air Force Base, compared to the alternative route. The visual impacts of route 2 will thoroughly be looked at along with cumulative impacts. During the assessment phase, the practitioner will further take into consideration conditions stipulated in the Namibia Civil Aviation Act No. 6 of 2016 and its technical standards requirements of 2018.

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### 1.3.2 TECHNICAL BID VERSES LITERACY RATIO

Another major concern raised by the I&APs was the technical BID as most of the I&APs do not understand the write ups. The environmental practitioner stressed on the objective of the public meeting in providing a detailed non – technical summary on Project related specifications. The practitioner further explained the need to translate materials into local languages and the importance to further collaborate with town planners, community activist in future projects that would be proposed within the town’s jurisdiction.

### 1.3.3 LOCAL RECRUITMENT

I&APs raised concerns that the Project will only employ people from outside of Karibib. I&APs highlighted that Osino is not considering Karibib as a base town, and that Omaruru is prioritised which is 65 km away from the proposed mine. The chance of gaining future employment for them is limited as they do not have skills and experience. They therefore suggested that initiatives are in place to allow for fair recruitment. The EAP responded that the work demand certain skills which the local communities may not poses. The EMP stress on the need to consider local people for unskilled labour. Additionally, it is on Osino’s discretion to choose its base town, as Omaruru could have been the next best choice considering that other local mines are already using Karibib as the base town and this does not necessarily rule out the chance of contracting service providers from Karibib.

## **2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS**

To conclude the meeting, ECC expressed gratitude towards all I&APs and stakeholders for attending and providing valuable feedback during the public and stakeholder consultation. The Proponent and ECC aimed to create a forum for I&APs to express their concerns and address them thoroughly throughout the public consultation process.

ECC further acknowledged that constructive feedback from I&APs leads to a more robust and improved EIA. This process enables a project that is comprehensible to the community and I&APs. The feedback received from I&APs will assist in identifying potential impacts that require assessment and concerns that need to be addressed as the project advances.

### 2.1 DETAILED COMMENTS AND RESPONSES FROM THE PUBLIC MEETINGS

The formal period for interested and affected party registration started on 17 April 2023, and closed on 30 April, 2023, for initial feedback. Feedback was gathered through the public meeting and email were documented for inclusion in the EIA report. Corresponding responses to this feedback have been included in the tables provided below.

Additional feedback during the I&APs review and commentary period will be captured and addressed into the final EIA reported that will be prepared for submission to competent authorities for a Record of Decision (RoD).

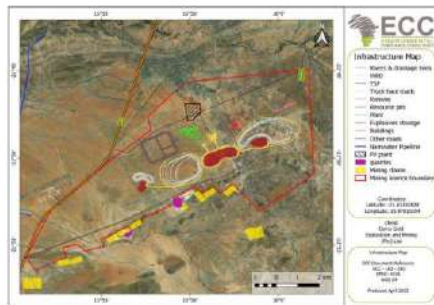

### General Infrastructure Layout – Twin Hills Gold Project



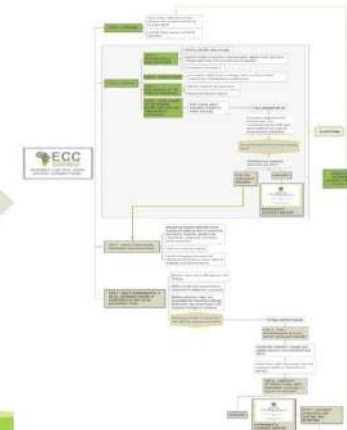
### The proposed 66 kV overhead powerline routes

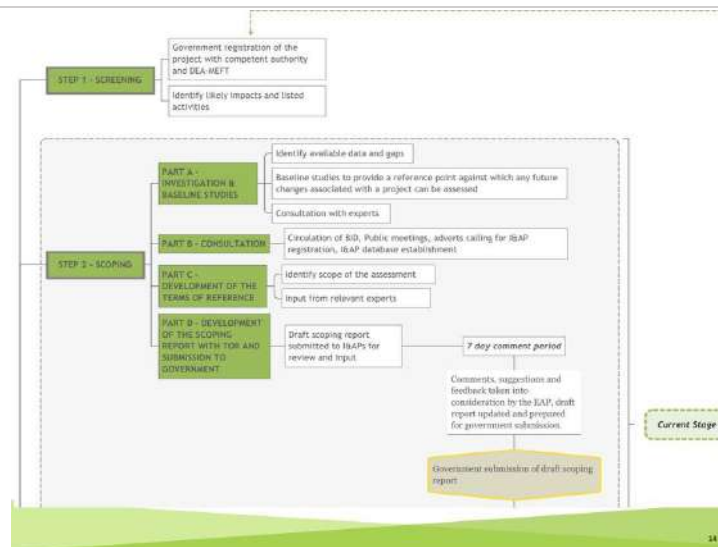

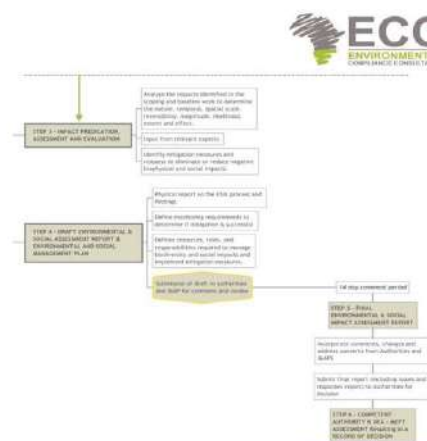
