In a unanimous judgement read out by chief justice Peter Shivute, the court declined to set aside the 2019 presidential election result and order a rerun. This was despite the court ruling that former minister of urban and rural development Charles Namoloh's decision to partly implement the Electoral Act and specifically the parts requiring a verifiable paper trail for EVMs was in conflict with the Constitution and invalid.

The court, however, stated that the validity of the election of office-bearers elected under the 2014 Electoral Act before 21 March 2020 would not be affected by its finding despite declaring the elections conducted with EVMs without verifiable paper trail invalid.

In a statement issued on Tuesday, Itula said the Supreme Court's ruling last week declining their demand to have the outcome of last year's presidential election nullified was "no ruling in law and it is a nullity".

He said the decision of the Supreme Court to order the ECN and the government only to comply with the law in the future would be an injustice to him and other candidates as well as the voters.

"In none of these examples did any of those supreme courts do this. In none did they find an illegality, but then only to stop that in the future years, for future candidates and future voters in future elections. The law must apply," he said.

Itula added that: "You and I hope for the future, but we live now and we strive now. It is what happened in November 2019, which took us to court and about which your cry has gone up. Are we to be subjected to another five years of what we have endured?" he stressed.

Itula is arguing that the suggestion by the Supreme Court that he and other candidates failed to engage the Electoral Commission of Namibia (ECN) on the implementation of the paper trail was inconsistent with the law because it was not argued by the parties.

He said the court failed to raise this issue, upon which part of the judgement was based, with the parties in the matter which should not have been the case.

"It is because the court, in its judgement, prominently relied on a factor never raised as a defence, not argued by the parties and not raised in the hearing by the court itself. This factor is the suggested 'inaction' by me before I tackled the ECN on 21 October 2019, as to where the paper trail was, which it had publicly promised, and which is what the law states must be counted for the results of an election and not the electronic printouts," Itula stressed.

He added that the court had no right to rule on this issue, as it was not raised by the parties. "It [the court] has said so itself, often, in other cases," Itula stressed.

Itula also questioned whether his inaction to challenge the ECN on the implementation of the paper trail could also be held against other applicants in the matter, denying them their relief to set aside

the outcome of the election. He said the argument by the court was not correct, as other applicants have been consistently engaging the ECN on the matter. "They have debated this fact in parliament and written many letters well in advance. Were they too, to receive no effective relief,

because I should have written my letters earlier? Was my 'inaction' theirs too? On what facts raised?" he pondered.

He thus said the Supreme Court should review its judgement and follow examples set by its equivalent in other countries in applying the law.

Itula, a qualified dentist and Swapo Party member, ran as an independent candidate in the presidential election, in which he garnered about 29% of the votes cast, losing to fellow Swapo member and incumbent president Hage Geingob, who received 56% of the votes cast.

The speed with which state-funded legal representation is provided to accused persons is also affecting the delivery of justice in criminal trials, Shivute said.

He remarked: "There is hardly a criminal trial involving a serious offence where an accused person does not seek publicly funded legal representation as they are entitled to do. The delay associated with that process is the stuff of nightmares for judicial officers."

The reasons for these delays include inadequate funding for the Ministry of Justice's Directorate of Legal Aid, which results in it not being able to provide legal aid timeously, Shivute said.

Also, once legal aid has been granted, accused persons often abandon their defence counsel and ask for the services of a new lawyer, causing delays in trial proceedings

in the process, he recounted.

In addition, the police too are affected by budget cuts, which have ripple effects, with the Office of the Prosecutor General not able to decide whether to prosecute or not when incomplete dockets are submitted to it, and the courts perennially being asked to postpone matters for further investigations, the chief justice said.

During 2019, the High Court's judges dealing with criminal matters presided over 160 criminal trials, of which only 42 were concluded, Shivute reported.

The High Court's judges also heard 328 criminal appeals, and finalised 156 criminal appeals, representing a 69% finalisation rate in the court's main division in Windhoek and a 24% completion rate in its division at Oshakati.

In the country's regional courts, 2 570 criminal cases were dealt with during 2019, but only 523 cases were concluded, Shivute said. The regional courts' 2019 finalisation

rate of only 20% during 2019 was still an improvement on a finalisation rate of only 6% during 2018, though, he said.

In the district courts, magistrates presided over 46 460 criminal cases during 2019, of which 24 256 matters were concluded, he also noted.

"As a judiciary, we commit ourselves to making every effort to work down the suffocating backlog in the lower courts," the chief justice said. "I call upon the other stakeholders to bring their part."

The Office of the Judiciary was allocated N\$368 million in the government's budget for the 2019/20 financial year, Shivute noted. That allocation was later cut to N\$360 million, of which 78% (nearly N\$280 million) goes to personnel expenditure on the office's current total of 718 staff members.

The office currently has a shortfall of N\$4 million in its budget for witness fees, he also noted.

While it is possible to become a Namibian citizen through marriage, foreigners are using the opportunity to obtain Namibian passports for malicious activities.

Hinda-Mbuende revealed that sham marriages create a supply of Namibian passports to individuals who use them to travel and commit terrorist activities, as well as drug trafficking.

"Unfortunately, not everyone who desires to become a Namibian does so with good intentions," stated Hinda-Mbuende.

According to chapter two, article four of the Namibian Constitution, those who "in good faith marry a Namibian citizen" are eligible to become a citizen.

A marriage by customary law in this case considered a valid

marriage.

However, due to the rise of sham marriages, the ministry now finds itself in a position where they need to intervene in private marriage matters.

"The Ministry of Home Affairs and Immigration is inundated with reports of sham marriages conducted by those who are entrusted and have taken an oath to uphold the law," Hinda-Mbuende stated.

She further elaborated that pastors have been arrested in regards to the sham marriages and that the ministry has evidence of marriages conducted without the pastor seeing the two parties in person.

In 2013, *The Namibian* reported that the ministry of immigration was investigating a Lutheran pastor for conducting bogus marriages between young Namibian women and men from Arab

countries.

"Cases vary from marriage officials, including pastors, conducting such marriages between strangers," stated the deputy minister.

"We have confirmed cases of Namibians being on payrolls of criminals to maintain sham marriages," she added.

Hinda-Mbuende warned Namibians that engaging in bogus marriages make themselves vulnerable to not only "marriages from hell", but also to domestic abuse, human trafficking and drug trafficking.

She advised citizens who suspect that their spouse has scammed them into a marriage to contact authorities, and those who intend to marry should get clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and Immigration.

It is also important to note

that Namibia does not recognise polygamy, thus a person already married to someone from their country of origin cannot marry a Namibian citizen.

The ministry currently has an administrative process, which includes interviews to combat these sham marriages, but they are urging citizens to come forward, not only with regards to sham marriages, but any other corruption they learn of.

"The Ministry of Home Affairs and Immigration will leave no stone unturned to crack down on criminals," said Hinda-Mbuende.

In 2015, then minister of immigration, Penckenhilivulathana stated that young women have misunderstood the concept of marriage which exposes them to the risk of being used by foreigners in an effort to acquire Namibian citizenship.

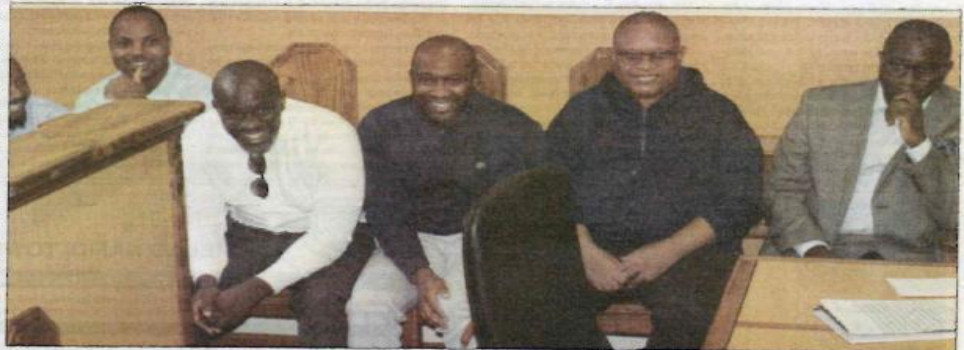

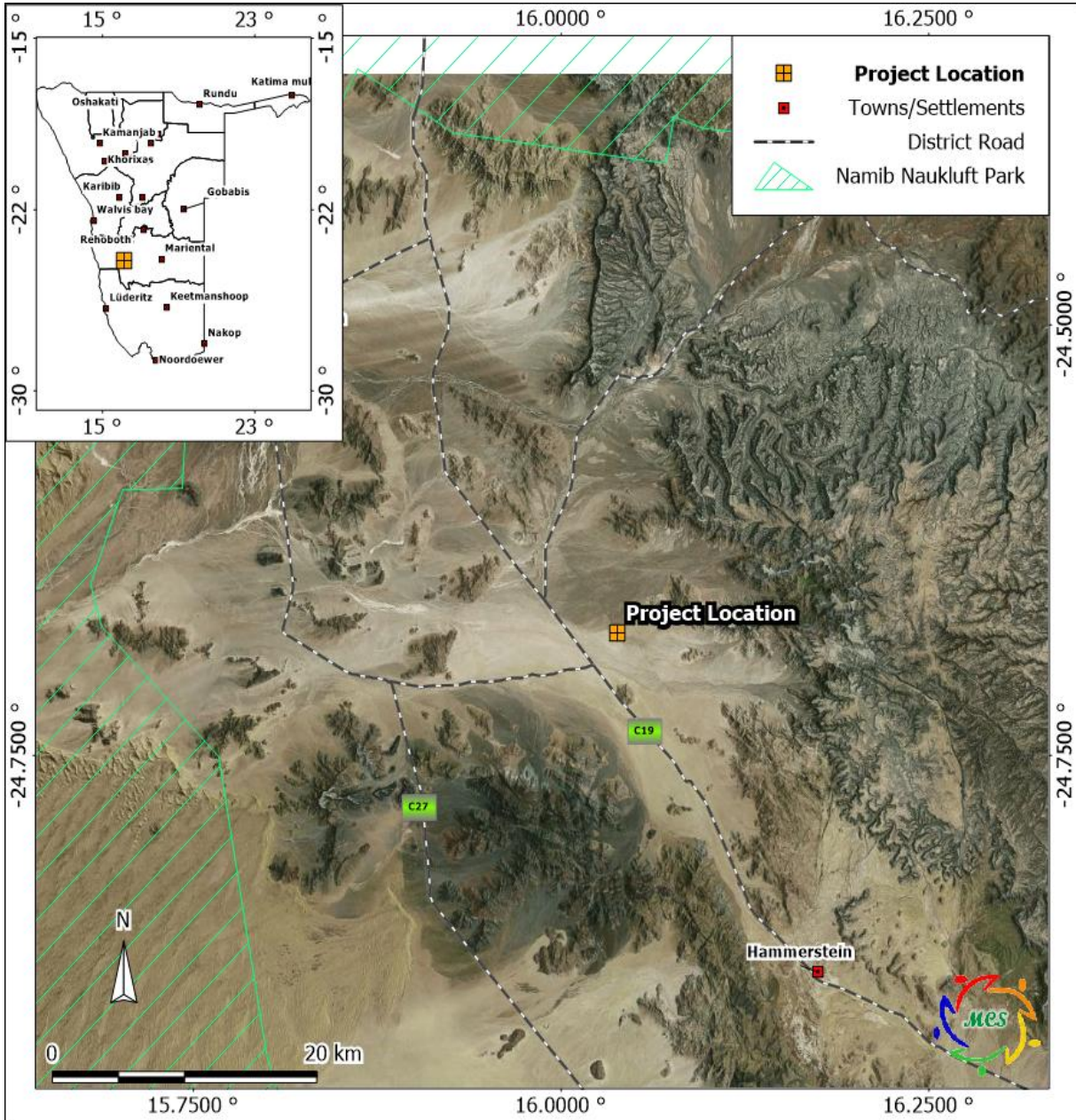


Figure 1. Project locations

The electricity supply to the development will be sourced from renewable energy. Solar power will provide all of the development's energy requirements. Water supply will be sourced from boreholes on the farm and will be reticulated via pipelines to the functions of the development.

Suitable 3-chamber septic tanks with a greywater system will be installed at the development. The greywater system will divert some wastewater away from the septic tank and use it to irrigate lawns, gardens, and other landscape features at the project site.
