No comments, objections or concerns regarding the proposed development were raised from any I&APs informed, and no I&APs were registered for the project.



In a unanimous judgement read out by chief justice Peter Shivute, the court declined to set aside the 2019 presidential election result and or-der a rerun. This was despite the court ruling that former minister of urban and rural develop Charles Namoloh's decision to partly implement the Electoral Actand specifically the parts requiring a verifiable paper trail for EVMs was in conflict with the Constitution and invalid.

elections conducted with BVMs without verifiable paper usal invalid. In a statement issued on Tuesday, Itula said the Supreme Court's ruling last week declining their demand to have the outcome of last year's presi-dential election nullified was "no ruling in law and bit associations.

dential election nullified was "no ruling in law and it is a nullity". He said the decision of the Supreme Court to order the ECN and the government only to comply with the law in the future would be an injustice to him and other candidates as well as the voters. "In none of these examples did any of those supreme courts do this. In none did they find an illegality, but then only to stop that in the future years, for future candidates and future voters in future elections. The law must apply." he said. Itula adde that: "You and I hope for the future, but we live now and we strive now. It is what hap-pened in November 2019, which took us to court and about which your cry has gone up. Are we to be subjected to another five years of what we have endured?" he stressed.

Inula is arguing that the suggestion by the Su-preme Court that he and other candidates failed to engage the Electoral Commission of Namibia (SCN) on the implementation of the paper trail was inconsistent with the law because it was not armed but the namins. argued by the parties.

He said the court failed to raise this issue, upon which part of the judgement was based, with the parties in the matter which should not have been the case.

"It is because the court, in its judgement, promi-"It is because the court, in its judgement, promi-nently relied on a factor never raised as a defence, not argued by the parties and not raised in the hear-ing by the court itself. This factor is the suggested "inaction" by me before 1 tackled the ECN on 21 October 2019, as to where the paper trail was, which it had publicly promised, and which is what the law states must be counted for the results of an election and not the electronic printouts," Itula stressed. He added that the court had no right to rule on this issue, as it was not raised by the parties. "It [the court] has said so itself, often, in other cases," Itula stressed.

"Cases vary from marriage officials, including pastors, con-ducting such marriages between strangers," stated the deputy minister.

We have confirmed cases of Namibians being on payrolls of criminals to maintain sham mar-riages," she added. Hinda-Mbuende warned Na-

mibians that engaging in bogus marriages make themselves vulnerable to not only "marriages from bell", but also to domestic abuse, human trafficking and drug trafficking.

She advised citizens who suspect that their spouse has scammed them into a marriage to contact authorities, and those who intend to marry should get clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and Immigration. It is also important to note

that Namibia does not recognise polygamy, thus a person already married to someone from their country of origin cannot marry a Namibian citizen.

The ministry currently has an administrative process, which includes interviews to combat these sham marriages, but they are unese sharin marringes, but mey are unging citizens to come forward, not only with regards to sharm marringes, but any other corrup-tion they learn of. "The Ministry of Home Affairs and Immigration will leave no stone unnumed to crack down on diminical "citizet."



BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT

1. PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

The purpose of this Background Information Document (BID) is to brief Interested & Affected Parties (I&AP's) and Stakeholders about the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) being undertaken for the proposed Safari House, Cottage and Glamping Camp Units, in the Hardap Region.

The BID also provides an opportunity for I&APs to register for the EIA process and to submit any initial comments or issues regarding the proposed development.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Infinity Nature Holdings Pty (Ltd). hereafter referred to as the proponent is of the intention to undertake the following activities:

- Construction and operations of the luxury Safari house, cottage and glamping camp units.
- Associated bulk services and other support infrastructure will be developed.

In terms of the Environmental Management Act (No. 7 of 2007) and Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (Government Notice No. 30 of 2012), the following listed activities in Table 1 apply to the proposed project:

The proponent commissioned this EIA and appointed Matrix Consulting Services to undertake the necessary activities to enable an application for an Environmental Clearance with the Environmental Commissioner as prescribed by the Environmental Management Act (No. 7 of 2007) and Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (Government Notice No. 30 of 2012). In line with Regulation 21(2) of the mentioned EIA Regulations, this BID is distributed to potential I&APs as part of the public consultation process for this EIA.

This Environmental Assessment will therefore be undertaken to determine the potential environmental and socio-economic impacts associated with the proposed development activities.

3. DEVELOPMENT DESCRIPTION

3.1 <u>Locality</u>




Figure 1. Project locations

The proposed development (24.67934°S; 16.03861°E) is situated on Farm Shangri-La No.190, in the Gibeon Constituency of the Hardap Region. See Figure 1.

4. ENGINEERING SERVICES

The electricity supply to the development will be sourced from renewable energy. Solar power will provide all of the development's energy requirements. Water supply will be sourced from boreholes on the farm and will be reticulated via pipelines to the functions of the development.

Suitable 3-chamber septic tanks with a greywater system will be installed at the development. The greywater system will divert some wastewater away from the septic tank and use it to irrigate lawns, gardens, and other landscape features at the project site.

5. THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

The development strives to become an eco-tourism attraction, inorder to reduce its environmental footprint and achieve sustainable economic growth and development. This ecoretreat destination aims at striking the perfect balance between providing a good safari experience while treating the environment with respect.

The development is expected to have a significantly low environmental footprint on the natural environment, due to the size and nature of the proposed establishment. The general biophysical conditions of the site are predominantly free of sensitive flora and fauna.

6. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS
