Terms of Reference –
Consultancy to develop Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Material on Gender based Violence (GBV) and Learner Pregnancy (LP)

1. Background
Friedrich Ebert Stiftung (FES) and Regain Trust with funding from the European Union are implementing a project aimed at strengthening National Efforts to prevent, mitigate and address GBV and LP in Namibia by working Nationally and across 3 Regions, namely Khomas, Erongo and Oshana. The overall goal of this project is to establish new, multi-faceted approaches to curb GBV and LP through holistic preventative measures and enhanced protection of survivors. The project seeks to achieve two key specific objectives which are: 1) Strengthen knowledge and capacity of key stakeholders (such as GBV CSOs, Political Decision Makers) to increase the quantity and quality of prevention and protection activities to address GBV and LP and 2) Increase access to quality psychosocial support services for survivors of GBV and LP. The project seeks to work collaboratively with key and existing stakeholders working in areas to address GBV and LP. The project places GBV/LP survivors at the centre of its approaches and attempts to reflect the experiences and lessons learned from survivors. The project envisions that with increased and enhanced prevention and protection services, Namibia can move towards a reduction in the prevalence of GBV and LP.

2. Scope of Work
To achieve its objectives, the project implementers seek the services of a suitably qualified consultant to assist in the development of GBV and LP IEC material for survivors of Gender Based Violence and Learner Pregnancy. The core purpose of the IEC material would be to enhance the awareness and knowledge levels of GBV survivors in order to more effectively navigate GBV and LP services. Additionally, the IEC material should strengthen their knowledge of legal frameworks to ensure that survivors and the general public are fully aware of their rights and procedures to be expected when accessing GBV and LP services. The overall goal of the IEC material should be to strengthen the ability for survivors to demand and advocate for quality GBV and LP services. The material should, in a simplistic and effective manner, illustrate the types of services that survivors and members of the public can expect from GBV and LP service providers as well as outline the various laws and policies that guide such services. The materials should by no means be a duplication of existing materials already developed by other partners.

3. Key Deliverables
The following key activities are envisioned for the consultancy:

- Review key National documents (such as laws & policies) related to GBV & LP
- Summarise National documents into easy to read and comprehend IEC materials
- Translation into 6 indigenous languages (languages most commonly spoken in the Erongo, Oshana and Khomas regions)
- Printing of 3000 copies of the IEC material once approved

- Showcase proof of work experience in the development of IEC materials related to GBV, LP
- Showcase an understanding of Gender, GBV, LP, laws and policies and other issues related to GBV and LP.



High Court Judge Johanna Saltonga

A 37-year-old man convicted in the Outapi Regional Court for defiling a seven-year-old girl had his sentence set aside by the High Court. After the act he allegedly gave the young girl an orange. Titus Hautiku Shanghala managed a partial victory when appeal judge Johanna Saltonga and acting judge Mike Namweya set aside his sentence of 15 years imprisonment. The court however declined to set aside

his conviction on the charge of rape. Without any legal representation, Shanghala filed an appeal against his conviction and sentence, saying he

properly advised Shanghala who opted to represent himself.

"In our view, failure to follow the guidelines including failure to explain the coercive circumstances to an unrepresented accused in a rape case is material misdirection that calls for the appeal court to interfere with a sentence," said Judge Saltonga.

Shanghala's case has been referred back to the regional court for sentencing to start afresh. The High Court further ordered that in sentencing Shanghala, the regional court should consider the time he has already spent in police custody.

Shanghala was convicted on a charge of rape for sexually violating a minor. During the trial the victim testified that Shanghala called her inside his room where he ordered her to undress herself. She did not want to undress herself and tried to run away.

Shanghala followed her, grabbed her and pulled her into his room. While in the room Shanghala undressed her and put her on the bed before undressing himself. She further testified that Shanghala proceeded to violate her.

It was her testimony that after the violation, Shanghala allegedly gave her an orange. The victim was later found in Shanghala's room half-naked on the floor by her mother, while Shanghala lay on the bed.

Shanghala is said to have been employed at the house where the minor stays. - mannkdl@neps.com.na
