



Communication with I&APs, and Means of Consultation Employed

Regulation 21 of the EIA Regulations details the steps to be taken during a public consultation process and these have been used in guiding this process. Communication with I&APs with regards to the proposed development was facilitated through the following means:

- A Background Information Document (BID) containing brief information about the proposed project was compiled and hand delivered to the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) accompanying the ECC application, and uploaded on the MEFT (ECC) Portal for project registration. The BID was also shared with the I&APs who requested for it.
- Project Environmental Assessment notices were published in The Namibia Media Holdings'
 Market Watch newspapers (*Allgemeine Zeitung*, *Die Republikein*, and *Namibian Sun*) dated 30
 March 2023 and 05 April 2023, briefly explaining the activity and its locality, inviting members
 of the public to register as I&APs and submit their comments/concerns. Adverts are attached
 hereto.
- The 8 MCs are located on a private farm. Therefore, there was no consultation meeting held. The only consultation done was with the farm owner who have provided consent for the proposed activities, and the hand written copy of the consent letter from the Daheim (Farm) Owner was submitted to the Proponent to the MME during application for the mining claims.
- Two A3 size information posters were pasted at the frequented places in Karibib Town, i.e.,
 Town Council, Constituency Office notice boards as well as Woermann Brock Supermarket community notice boards in Karibib see photos below.





- Draft Environmental Management Plan (EMP)

Explanation of Mining Claims vs EPLs vs Mining Licenses

I saw that Ms. Foelscher indicated "EPL??" in the letter. For mining claims, one does not start off with an EPL which first require a mineral license holder (EPL holder) to apply for an ECC to first explore and then apply for a Mining License after successful exploration.

For mining claims, it is a different thing because mining claims are self-explanatory (rights to mine and in some cases, depending on a commodity, the mining claim owner needs to explore before starting with mining). Thus, the Ministry of Mines & Energy (MME) would give the mining claim owner/holder the rights to explore and mine soon after without undertaking an EIA Study for mining separately. This is probably because mining claims are usually smaller in size compared to EPLs. It is also important to note that mining claims can only be owned by Namibians, unlike EPLs and mining license that are of extensive magnitude, and thus, mostly owned mainly by foreigners.

EPLs are usually huge areas (to increase the chances of finding something) and EXCLUSIVELY for prospecting/exploration only, therefore one cannot mine on an EPL. This is why EIA studies are usually done first for exploration (on an EPL) and then another EIA study would be done for the Mining License/mining activities.

I hope you find these in order.
