1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

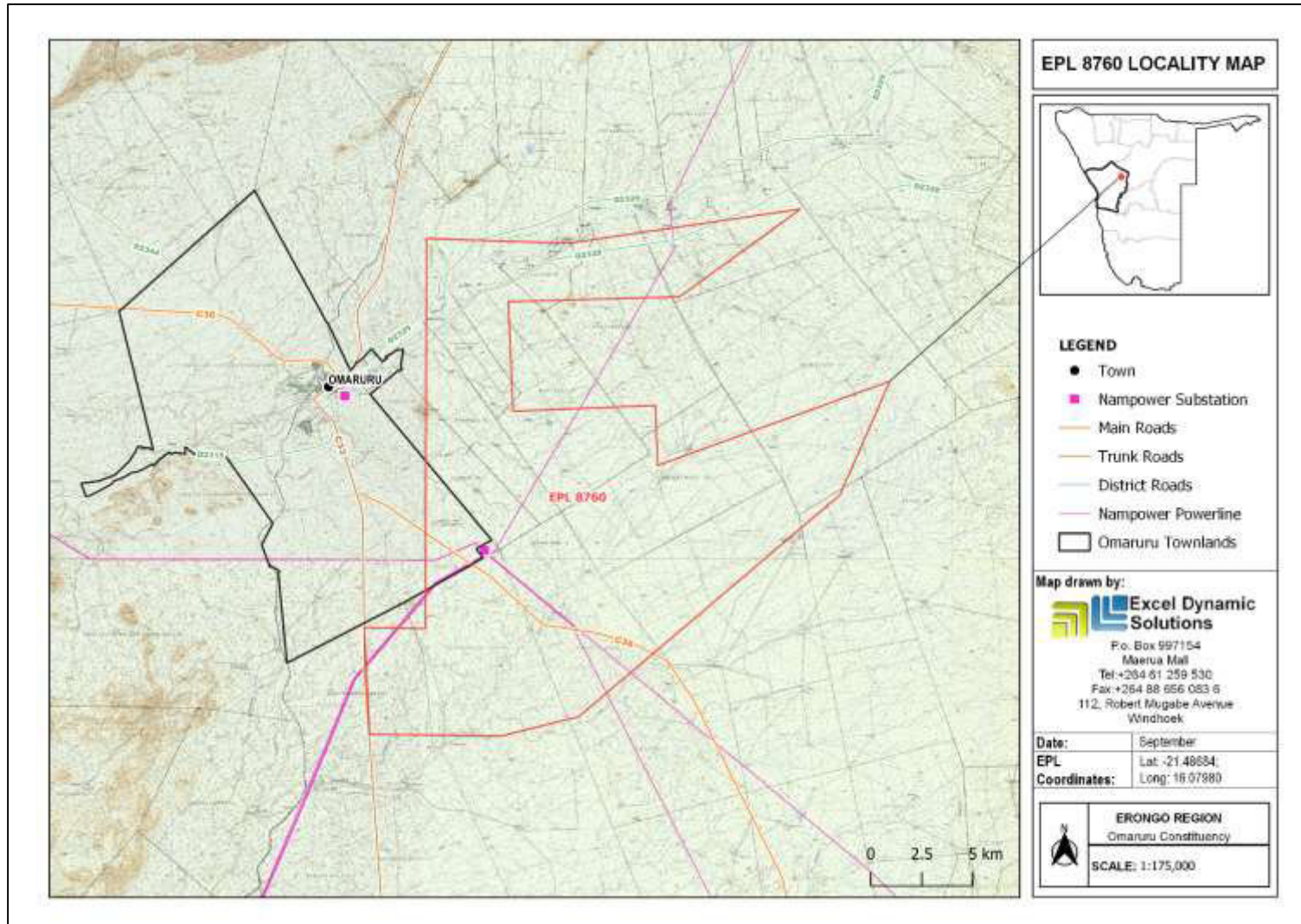


Figure 1: The locality map of EPL 8760 located near Omaruru in the Erongo Region

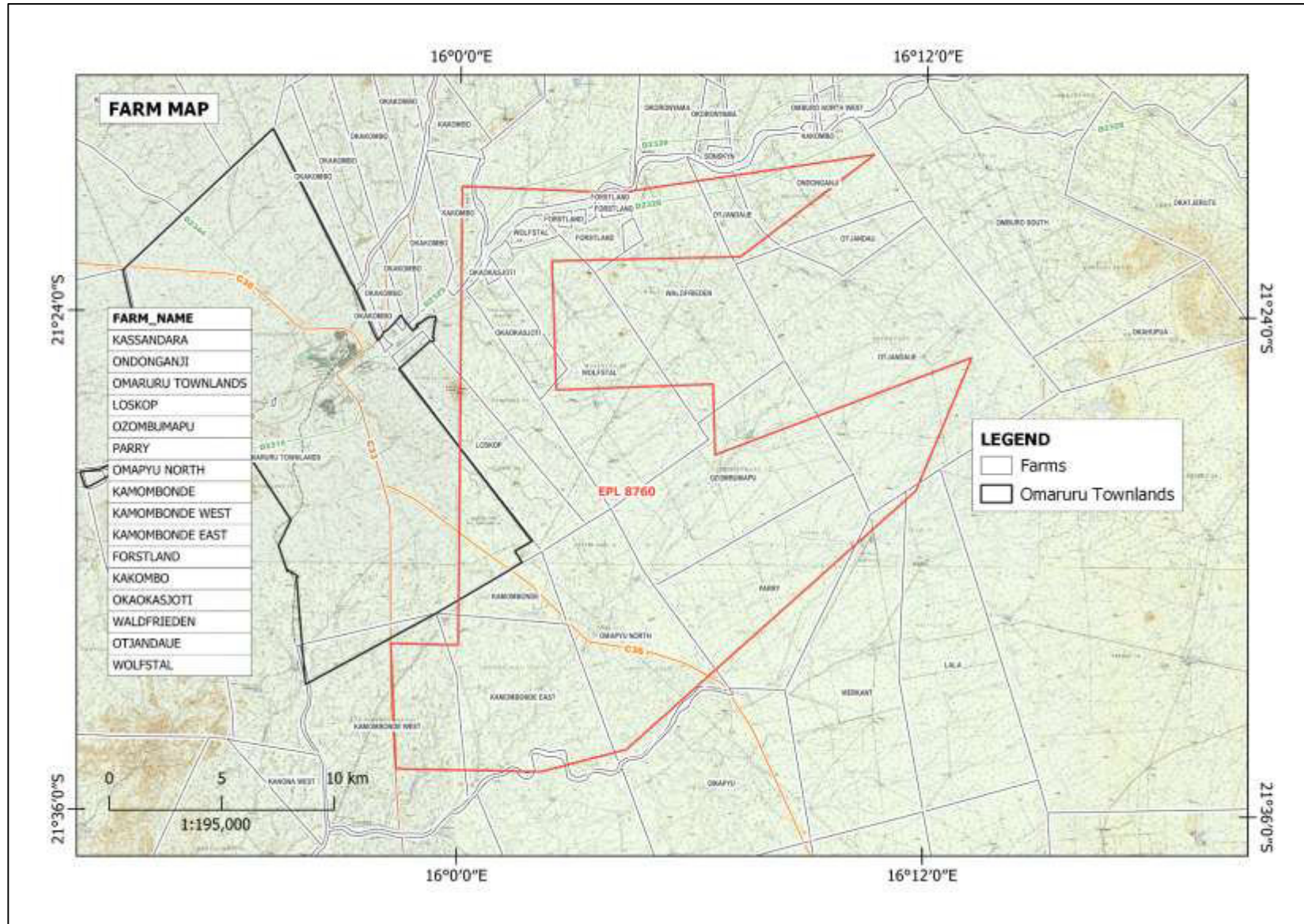


Figure 2: EPL 8760 with affected land use and neighboring farms

Africa Big Lion Mining (Pty) Ltd (hereinafter referred to as The Proponent) has applied to the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) to be granted an Exclusive Prospecting Licence (EPL) No. 8760 on the 07th of February 2022. However, the approval and granting of the EPL is subjected to an Environmental Clearance Certificate, thus the “pending ECC” status on the mining cadaster portal. The 34 213. 3877 hectares (ha) EPL is located about 7.10 km east of Omaruru in the Erongo Region (Figure 1). The EPL covers (overlies) Farm Omupyu Nord 74, Kamombonde Ost 86, Otjandaue 235, Ozombumapu 73, Parry 145, Waldfrieden 72, Kristal 208, Omaruru Town and Townland 85, Forstland 89, Okaokasjoti West 87 and Kakombo 90 (Figure 2). The EPL has potential for commodities such Base & Rare Metals, Dimension Stones, Industrial Minerals, Precious Metals and Semi-Precious Stones.

Exploration and all mining-related activities are among the listed activities that may not be undertaken without an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) under the Environmental Management Act (EMA) (2007) and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The relevant listed activities as per EIA regulations are:

- *3.1 The construction of facilities for any process or activities which requires a license, right of other forms of authorization, and the renewal of a license, right or other form of authorization, in terms of the Minerals (Prospecting and Mining Act, 1992).*
- *3.2 other forms of mining or extraction of any natural resources whether regulated by law or not.*
- *3.3 Resource extraction, manipulation, conservation and related activities.*

The Proponent is, therefore, required to obtain an ECC for the approval of the EPL and before the commencement of works on the EPL. To fulfill the legal requirements, the Proponent has appointed Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd, an independent team of Environmental Consultants, to conduct the required Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) process and submit the ECC application to the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) at the Ministry of Environment, Forestry & Tourism (MEFT).

2 PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

It should be noted that the Background Information Document (BID) is a non-technical document of the ESA (not an ESA Report). The BID is to:

-Briefly introduce the proposed project and related activities to potential interested and affected parties (I&APs) / stakeholders, and provide them an opportunity to raise issues, concerns / submit comments about the proposed project.

Once the Proponent has been issued with the ECC and obtained all required permits such as land use consent, where necessary and is ready to commence the exploration activities, the planned activities will commence.

3 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed activities entail prospecting and detailed exploration activities to delineate the mineral deposits. This is to determine whether the deposit for the targeted commodities is economically feasible (to advance to the resources development and mining phase).

The prospecting and exploration of minerals are the first components of any potential mining project. This is done to acquire the necessary data required for further decision-making and investment options.

Exploration activities are anticipated to last for about three years or sometimes longer (depending on the various factors such as turnaround between exploration data analysis and availability of funds between project phases, etc.).

3.1 Project Activities

The proposed prospecting and exploration activities (methods) are divided into the following categories:

- Phase 1: Non-invasive techniques (prospecting) – mapping / surveys.
- Phase 2: Invasive techniques (detailed exploration) – soil sampling, trenching and exploration drilling.

Once the target areas have been selected and verified under the prospecting phase, detailed exploration works will follow.

3.2 Human Resources, Services, and infrastructure

The following services and infrastructure as provided below will be required for the project activities:

- Human resources and accommodation:** Around 5-10 people will be employed on-site during the exploration phase and will be accommodated in tented camps.
- Water supply:** Around 4,500 liters of water will be required for the activities per month.

-Fuel Supply (machinery and equipment): Diesel will be used for machinery and equipment and fuel generator.

-Accessibility (roads): the EPL is accessible via the C33 from Omaruru which diverge onto C36 that leads to the EPL area.

Waste management:

Sewage: Mobile chemical ablation facilities will be provided on-site.

The wastewater will be transported offsite for treatment at a facility.

Solid waste: Sufficient waste bins (containers) will be made available at exploration sites and campsites for waste storage and later disposal at the nearest approved waste facility.

Hazardous waste: The waste fuel/oils will be carefully stored in a standardized container for disposal at an approved hazardous waste management facility in the nearest Town.

-Health and Safety: Adequate and appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be provided to project personnel. A minimum of two first aid kits will be readily available onsite.

-Potential Accidental Fire Outbreaks: Fire extinguishers will be readily available in vehicles, at the sites and campsite.

-Project Equipment, Material, Machinery, and Vehicles: Two 4X4 vehicles, drilling supporting truck, excavator / front-end loader, dozer, air compressor, drilling fluids stored in manufacturers approved containers, generator for power supply, etc. will be required for the proposed project.

Upon completion of exploration works, the disturbed sites will be rehabilitated as practically possible. This will include backfilling of exploration trenches, boreholes, levelling of stockpiled topsoil and cleaning of site areas.

4 ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

This ESA process is conducted in accordance with the provisions stated in the EMA No 7 of 2007 and its 2012 EIA Regulations. The primary objective of the ESA is to identify potential negative impacts associated with the project and assess them. Practical and effective mitigation measures will be recommended for implementation.

The main objectives of this ESA are to:

- Identify potential impacts associated with the proposed Activity.
- Inform I&APs and relevant authorities about the project and provide them with an opportunity to participate during the ESA process.
- Assess the significance of issues and concerns raised.
- Compile a report addressing all identified issues and potential impacts.
- Compile a Draft Environmental Management Plan (EMP) which includes impacts management and mitigation measures.

4.1 Potential Impacts

The following potential impacts have been identified:

4.1.1 Positive:

- Socio-economic development: employment creation and skills transfer.
- Investment opportunities/infrastructure-related development benefits,
- Produce a trained workforce and small businesses in the area.
- Boosting the local economic and regional economic development.
- Increased support for local businesses through the procurement of locally available goods and services.

4.1.2 Adverse (Negative) Impacts:

- Disturbance of existing communal grazing areas,
- Physical land/soil disturbance and prone to erosion
- Impact on fauna and flora (habitat disturbance and poaching).
- Water resources (over-abstraction of water) and soils pollution.
- Air quality issue owing to dust generation
- Occupational and community health and safety risks/hazards
- Vehicular traffic safety and services infrastructure (local roads).
- Vibrations and noise associated with drilling activities.
- Environmental pollution from poor waste management,

-Archaeological or cultural heritage impact

-Potential social nuisance and land use conflicts.

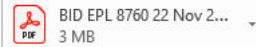

1. My Farm is a hunting farm dealing with international clients from all over the world. You can imagine if I hunt with a client stalking a trophy animal and there's a vehicle driving past me or close to me which jeopardizes my hunt how angry my client will be. The hunting industry is a very difficult industry and finding clients is not easy. All that client has to do is go back and go onto the hunting forums and advise people not to come hunt at Otjandaue due to disturbing mining activities. I did not inherit my farm from family I pay the bank every year installments for my farm. This will have a huge financial impact on me. I sometimes have 4 to 10 people in camp with extra PH's helping me out so we utilize the whole property. They come to hunt and enjoy the freedom of the bushveld and not to be disturbed by vehicles driving to exploration sites. I spent every year \$250 000 just in marketing hunts over seas.
2. We also have a Taxidermy which get supplied with work from my hunting. if I don't hunt there is no work for the taxidermy and everything stands still like in Covid times.
3. The safety issue, we walk and stalk our animals, if somebody gets hit by a stray bullet who will be responsible for this.
4. Vehicles disturbing me when I sit at waterholes with clients, they will chase all the game away if they pass there, again imagine what my clients will say.
5. For miners coming into my property they will have to pass my house as it's on my main road on the farm passing my lodge, this is not good for clients.
6. We're located in the highest poached area in Namibia due to the high amount of game farms around Omaruru, we

I have expensive exotic game on my property like Sable & Nyala antelope that I breed with.

7. Water I most certainly don't have enough water to supply these guys and if they poison my existing wells with their drilling what do I do with my game.
8. We have specially protected game on my property like Damara Dik Dik and Mountain Zebras, with a lot of activity in the area this can possibly cause these animals to move out. You don't get Damara Dik dik everywhere in Namibia they are only in specific areas.
9. Erindi Game Reserve the largest private game reserve in Namibia borders me and the EPL they're applying for runs on my border with them. That area is one of their main areas for game drives, it's called the Vlei where they have Hippo's and so on. Erindi also has both Rhino's, this is a huge security risk for them. They already indicated that they will file petition to this. Imagine being a tourist on a game drive and then experiencing dust and drills not far from where you're at and paying a lot of money to see Africa's big 5. People come to Africa to enjoy nature.

Our hunting season is from the 1st of February to the 30th of November, this exploration can or will have severe affects on my financial position and my business module, it can severely affect my reputation on International level and cost me a lot of business, I simply cannot allow this. I will be the one who has all the risk here.
