

Communication with I&APs, and Means of Consultation Employed

Regulation 21 of the EIA Regulations details the steps to be taken during a public consultation process and these have been used in guiding this process. Communication with I&APs with regards to the proposed development was facilitated through the following means and in this order:

- A Background Information Document (BID) containing brief information about the proposed project was compiled and hand delivered to the MEFT accompanying the ECC application, and uploaded on the ECC Portal for project registration and shared with registered I&APs.
- A Stakeholders' (I&AP) List was developed and updated as new I&APs register for the ESA.
- Project Environmental Assessment notices were published in The Namibia Media Holdings' *Market Watch newspapers (Allgemeine Zeitung, Die Republikein, and Namibian Sun)* dated 27 June 2023 & 03 July 2023, briefly explaining the activity and its locality, inviting members of the public to register as I&APs and submit their comments/concerns. Adverts are attached hereto.
- A consultation meeting was scheduled and held with stakeholders / the I&APs on the 14th of July 2023 at 10h30 (AM) in Warmbad but the meeting commenced only at 13h00 due to other existing community commitments in the Settlement. The consultation meeting was attended by twenty six (26) people, which included two Environmental consultants from Serja Consultants, one representative from Mistletoe Investments, and twenty-three (23) members of the Warmbad Community and farmers (I&APs) – Some photos from the meeting proceedings are shown below. The meeting minutes are attached hereto.

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PPC's loss widens due to volumes squeeze

SA, Zim under pressure

PPC's SA and Botswana cement business, which accounts for more than half of group revenue, also saw volume declines of 5.8%.

South Africa's biggest cement maker PPC said on yesterday its full-year loss widened in its year to end-March, hit by volume declines in its key markets of SA and Zimbabwe. Revenue, excluding dividends, increased 1% to R6.58 billion, with the company reporting a loss of R574 million, from R77 million previously. The company was hit by R195 million in non-cash items, primarily relating to hyperinflationary accounting. Consumer inflation in Zimbabwe trended at triple digits for much of the year and reached 244% in December, according to the World Bank.

PPC's SA and Botswana cement business, which accounts for more than half of group revenue, also saw volume declines of 5.8%, with the company saying volumes in the coastal region was offset by continued weak trading conditions in the inland region.

Markets

The coastal region of SA saw an increase in cement volumes due to increased industrial construction

activity and specific government projects as well as improved retail sales. Cement imports into the Western Cape remained low during the period due to global supply chain constraints and a weaker rand.

There was a decline in demand in the larger inland region in both the retail and the construction segments, with the construction sector being supported to some extent by the building of distribution centres and housing estates.

The company also felt pressure in Zimbabwe, where volumes fell 16%, amid a slower than anticipated recovery after a planned kiln shut-down.

Despite the inflationary pressures, PPC said the Zimbabwean market remained sound, with strong demand from concrete product manufacturers and government-funded infrastructure projects. Government reduced the number of import licences in January 2023, which will support the recovery of PPC's market share, it said.

'Pleased'

PPC CEO Roland van Wijnen said in the results that despite the challenging times, the group was pleased with a reduction in its debt and its strong financial position, which would allow it to "weather the local economic cycle."

"Increased demand through an en-

hanced infrastructure programme and a stronger economic climate is required to enable us to more effectively utilise the capacity available in our primary market."

"We therefore remain hopeful that the South African government will roll out its infrastructure development plans and protect the local

cement market through the introduction of blanket import tariffs."

Figures

PPC said yesterday that gross debt declined almost R400 million to about R1.19 billion, while finance costs fell more than a quarter.

A distribution in the form of a share

repurchase of up to R200 million was approved by the board, PPC said. This is equivalent to about 5% of its current market value.

PPC's shares were up more than 1% in early trade yesterday morning, having risen almost 23% so far this year, but having fallen about 12% in the past twelve months. **- Fin24**

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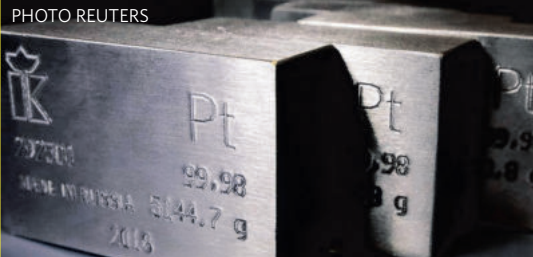

AUDI CEO REPLACED
Volkswagen has replaced the chief executive officer

of its flagging premium brand Audi as Europe's biggest carmaker seeks to keep up in the electric-car race and reverse a sales slide in China.

VW insider Gernot Döllner will take over leadership of the label from Markus Duesmann in September, Audi said. The move comes after Oliver Blume, who's been

leading Europe's biggest carmaker for less than a year, earlier this month singled out Audi as falling short of its potential when he outlined a host of measures to improve performance across the group. Tesla outsold Audi in the first quarter.

Duesmann, 54, has led Audi — VW's cash cow alongside Porsche —

since 2021. During the former BMW executive's tenure, the brand for a time led VW's ill-fated software efforts that have delayed key models, leading to tensions with Porsche over a future joint vehicle platform with Audi.

Blume, who also helms Porsche, late last year axed Audi's prestig-

ious self-driving vehicle because of slow progress. "Audi slipped a bit in terms product promises and product concept compared to Mercedes or BMW," said Philippe Houchois, global auto analyst at Jefferies. "Audi's lineup had aged, and Duesmann was under pressure for some time."

IMPLATS FINALLY GETS TAKEOVER NOD

Impala Platinum has finally been issued a compliance certificate from the Takeover Regulation Panel (TRP), a critical requirement in order for the platinum miner to officially conclude its offer to buy out Royal Bafokeng Platinum's remaining shareholders.

The compliance certificate from the TRP — an entity belonging to the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition — is one of two outstanding conditions that needed to be met before the offer to RBPlats shareholders can be declared unconditional and closed out.

The other, final, condition is the JSE approval for listing the offer consideration shares, which Implats will now re-apply for.

This is not anticipated to be problematic, however, and once the JSE's approval is received, "the offer will become wholly unconditional and Implats will make a further announcement setting out the important dates and times relating to the closing of the

offer", it said. Implats had gained a controlling share of RBPlat in May, after acquiring the Public Investment Corporation's (PIC) 9.26% stake.

REVIX FREEZES QUARTER OF CRYPTO ASSETS

South African crypto investment company Revix says it has had to freeze a quarter of its clients' crypto assets after one of its service providers abruptly halted withdrawals.

Revix, which is backed by JSE-listed investment group Sabvest, said that South Korean company Haru Invest had blocked all crypto withdrawals earlier in the month.

Revix had invested 24% of the crypto assets of clients with Haru.

"Given Haru Invest's unexpected halt on withdrawals, we have no alternative but to render 24% of crypto asset balances held on the Revix platform ... as reserved," Revix said in an update posted to its website.

1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING

The Environmental Assessment Practitioner from Serja Hydrogeo-Environmental Consultants (Mr. S L. Johannes) opened the meeting and thanked the community for attending the meeting, despite the fact that there were other community activities happening the same day with the meeting. He briefly explained the purposes of the meeting in accordance with the Public Consultation's Section 21 to 24 of the 2012 EIA Regulations' National Environmental Management Act No. 7 of 2007.

The copies of the Background Information Document (BID) were circulated for self-reading and following during meeting proceedings. As also part of the EIA Regulations requirements for consultation meetings, the meeting attendees were requested to sign the attendance register as proof of consultation to be appended to the ESA Report. The contact details provided in the register will also be added to the list of interested and affected parties (I&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

The meeting agenda which included the following main points where presented by Mr. Johannes:

2.1 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process and the Public Role in the Process

Mr. Johannes explained what an ESA/EIA is and that the proposed prospecting and exploration works are one of the listed activities that cannot be undertaken without an environmental clearance certificate (ECC) from the Environmental Commissioner. He also explained that the consultation meeting is one of the requirements to the EIA/ESA study process to apply for the ECC, and their (public's) role in the EIA/ESA process.

2.2 Brief Description of the Project

A brief description of the planned project activities was presented as per the provided BID copy. It was also reiterated to note that the proposed activities are not for mining activities but exploration only, because the Proponent cannot mine on an EPL (the EPL is self-explanatory "Exclusively for prospecting"). Mining activities can only be considered and undertaken once prospecting and exploration activities yield positive (economic feasible) results, which would mean that Mistletoe Investment (Proponent) will need to apply for a Mining License (ML) to the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME). The ML will be subject to another separate and detailed EIA Study and apply for an ECC for mining activities. Therefore, this ESA Study focuses on prospecting and exploration phase only.

2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Environmental Assessment Practitioner presented the potential pre-identified potential positive and negative environmental impacts anticipated from the proposed prospecting and exploration activities.

2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

At the end of presenting the BID, the attendees were provided with an opportunity to ask questions and/or raise concerns with regards to the proposed project activities so that these can be incorporated into the ESA Report and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) for consideration and implementation.

The key comments and issues made in the meeting were recorded and noted for consideration and inclusion in the ESA Report and EMP. These issues and comments are presented in **Table 1**.

The results can be made available, especially through the Ministry of Mines and Energy. As local residents and stakeholders, you will also be notified of the progress.</p> <p>Mr. S. Johannes: If the results show that there is potential for mining, the Proponent will notify stakeholders, which includes the MME, and the intention to apply for a mining license. Another EIA will need to be commissioned for mining activities. The communal area has small villages around it with water boreholes provided for them and people depend on livestock and grazing land.</p> <p>We are scared to lose our groundwater resources and grazing land for livestock to the exploration activities.</p>	<p>Mr. S Johannes and addition by Ms. Fredrika Shagama (the Lead Environmental Consultant): When exploration takes place, there are agreements between proponent and land owners. However, given our experience and groundwater potential knowledge of the country, Warmbad is one of the areas with low groundwater potential and we are not expecting the Proponent to be sourcing water for water –consuming activities such as drilling from the local boreholes. For such water demanding activities, the Proponent will need to explore other reliable water supply sources from which project water can be tanked/carted to site to ensure that the project activities do not negatively impact the Warmbad community supplies. Water for drinking may be sourced from the local boreholes, but agreements to supply will be reached between either the private borehole owner and or the Settlement Office Council to supply drinking water for the exploration team during that time.</p> <p>Mr. J. Engelbrecht: Exploration activities are very site specific and will take place at a small-scale level on selected sites within the EPL. The MME usually grant larger areas for EPLs just to increase the chances of explorers to find something. Regardless, the community will be informed in advance where the target sites would be and on what days/weeks what type of activities will be undertaken. These activities include soil and rock sampling, trenching and exploration drilling.</p>

Mr. S Johannes: Exploration usually does not mean relocation or resettlement of people in an area because, one only explore and of course avoid areas such as residence. 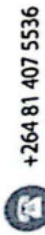

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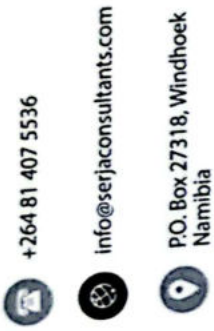
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
