## African tourism preparing for post-coronavirus era

At the start of 2020, Africa's tourism industry was predicted to grow. The United World Tourism Organisation, or UNWTO, estimated a 3 to 5% increase in international arrivals to the continent as a result of demand for air travel and easier visa processes.

As coronavirus hit, airports were shut down, tourists stopped arriving and the industry was forced to pause.

Many countries on the continent also imposed lockdowns, shutting down hotels, tour companies, event centers and public transportation.

The tourism industry -- consisting of entertainment, accommodation, food and beverage and operating tours -- employs more than 1 million people each in Nigeria, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania and South Africa, according to the United Nations.

It also accounts for more than 20% of employment in Seychelles, Cape Verde, Sao Tome, and Principe and Mauritius.

But due to the spread of Covid-19, many of its sectors are cutting jobs and losing revenue.

The UN estimates that the pandemic will cost up to 2 million direct and indirect jobs in tourism on the continent.

Loss of revenue  
In Kenya, some hotels and

guesthouses on the Kenyan coast reported occupancy rates of less than 7% in March, according to local media.

In the same month, Victor Shikata, the general manager at the Flamingo beach hotel, in Mombasa, Kenya's coast, told CNN that the hotel's pool and lounge were empty. And its once sandy beaches have become deserted as a result of the virus.

The hotel also had to deal with massive cancellations of holidays and conference meetings, he added.

Food and beverage services are not left out as business owners say they are forced to lay off staff or cut down on their salaries.

Ada Osakwe, founder of Nuli, a chain of health food restaurants based in Lagos, Nigeria's commercial center told CNN that her business was forced to close

down 9 of its 10 stores following the coronavirus pandemic in April.

"I'm just really with spreadsheets and putting percentages next to everyone's names to see how we are going to pay salaries. After April, I don't know how we are going to survive," she said.

'Absolute chaos'  
Tanya Kotze, founder of Africa Direct, a tour and travel company based in South Africa told CNN that when international flights to the country were canceled in March, her team was thrown into 'absolute chaos.'

International travel has always been a huge factor for tourism and in 2018, it generated \$38 billion for Africa, according to the UNWTO.

Kotze, who has been running Africa Direct for 15 years says her team spent about four weeks

reaching out to clients and rescheduling bookings for 2021 and 2022.

"The first month after international travel stopped, it was absolute chaos of moving bookings of our current clients who would have traveled this year. It was dealing with so many cancellations and activities to prevent our clients from losing their money," she said.

Cancelling and rescheduling trips could potentially translate into a loss of \$30 billion to \$50 billion in revenue for the continent's tourism industry this year, according to the United Nations.

But because of increasing cases of the virus, more than 123 000 on the continent as of May 29, Africa does not have a choice.

Kotze says that one of the ways her company is staying afloat is by leveraging on already existing relationships with her clients who are mostly visitors

from the US and Europe.

"We are fortunate to have repeat clients so we are offering really affordable packages ahead of 2021 and 2022 and encouraging them to book now.

We are so fortunate that many of them are booking. The exchange rate is now favorable for Americans and Britons looking to your Africa so we are trying to make it as attractive as possible," she explained.

Slow travel

It is still unclear when African countries will fully open up their borders to travel and tourism.

While some countries are still operating emergency flights in order to repatriate citizens stuck abroad, and some are still operating cargo flights, for the most part, international air operations remain grounded.

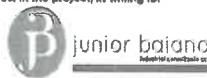
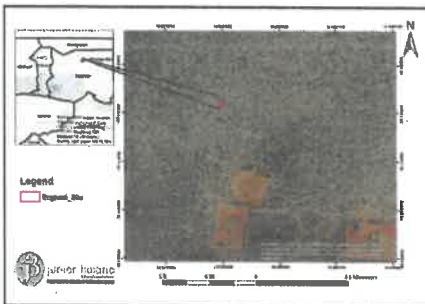

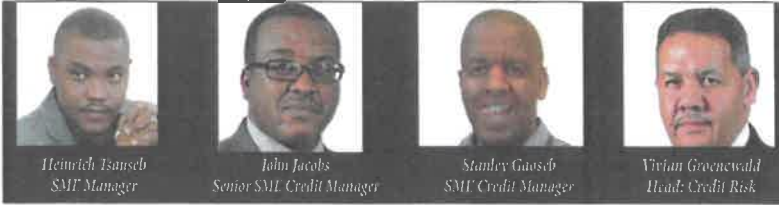

# DBN loan scandal investigation nears completion

**A**n investigation into a loan that rocked the Development Bank of Namibia (DBN) involving at least N\$120 million in which senior officials in the SME credit department allegedly approved tenders to companies fronted by

their proxies, has now progressed to an advanced stage.

The alleged scandal has implicated and led to suspension of Vivian Groenewald, Head: Credit Risk, Stanley Gausob, SME Credit Manager, John Jacobs, Senior SME Credit Manager and Heinrich Tsaudab, SME Manager.

Former DBN employees Arthur Dietrich and Danie Loxton are also alleged to be involved while in the interim, Cindy Raw was recently appointed Acting Head: Credit Risk.

Exclusively speaking to *Confidente* this week, DBN Chief Executive Officer, Martin Inkumbi highlighted that a preliminary report has already been availed to the board of directors.

"The investigation is still ongoing and already there is a report that has been shared with the board. We are progressing and the final report of this investigation should be done before the end of this month,"

Inkumbi said.

*Confidente* reported last month that the loans in questions were approved for 21 SMEs that were subcontracted by Meerkat - a non-exclusive truck sourcing broker for Trade Port Namibia (Pty) Ltd - to supply trucks for the transportation of manganese from Tshipi Mine to the Port of Lüderitz en route to China.

Trade Port Namibia is the transport contractor for Tshipi Mine.

*Confidente* was informed that each of the 21 approved SME loans for this tender was to get a loan of between N\$4-5 million stretching the approval past the N\$100 million mark. Funds have already been disbursed to some of the approved SMEs.

In a memo to employees of the bank last month, Inkumbi noted that his board on April 8 took a decision to suspend, pending investigation, members of the bank's staff due to alleged misconduct levelled against these employees.

Said Inkumbi: "Please, understand that banking is a business of trust. It is imperative that DBN manage its affairs to maximise public confidence at all times. It is against this backdrop that the board has taken this decision. The bank will in due course announce measures to ensure that the suspensions of the above mentioned employees will not affect the bank's ability to

continue operating."

He further cautioned that if employees are requested by the bank to assist in this matter or any other investigation of a breach of ethics, they should give the duly appointed investigator full cooperation.

"Employees are requested to exercise restraint, not to speculate or add to rumours. Employees are also reminded to observe their confidentiality agreements with the bank and should not under any circumstances communicate externally. Reporting on fraud, corruption, nepotism and other breaches of ethics or misuse of the bank's resources should use the confidential external channels which protect whistle-blowers."

An agreement was reached in 2018 between Namport and TradePort Namibia to export manganese ore via the Port of Lüderitz destined for China.

TradePort Namibia intend to export 30 000 tonnes on a monthly basis and gradually ramp this up to 80 000 tonnes monthly.

This project will generate N\$648 million per annum to the economy and there will also be other support industries and services such as stevedoring, cleaning services, security, retail, fuel engineering etc.

Last year, Namport estimated that around 610 employment opportunities will also be created in the initial stage of the manganese project.

## Opposition concerned with price inflation amid Covid-19

**M**EMBERS of opposition parties in parliament have expressed their concern with price inflation during the Covid-19 pandemic asking government to put up measures to ensure that businesses do not hike prices and profit at the expense of the public.

Popular Democratic Movement parliamentarian, Vipaaluje Muburukua and leader of the Landless People Movement Bernadus Swarbooi especially expressed their concern with the procurement of products for government amid suspension of the normal procurement process saying that it leaves room for price inflation and corrupt practices.

Muburukua stated that while other countries have put up measures to prevent inflating of prices and left it to the law to deal with those found in contravention, Namibia still had no

clear measures in place.

"If you go today at the retail shops, prices have gone up to probably something close to 14 percent and this is at the time when people's pockets are affected adversely. We have an emergency of our hand... that goes with the prospect of those who want to benefit from this at the expense of the nation of the nation. I think as a nation we must also holster our approach because, in as much as Namibians are suffering, we also need to ensure that business does not unduly increase the prices for the people," he urged.

The opposition MP also noted that government must pay extra attention to prices inflation when availing money to procure items during the pandemic, especially to the Ministry of Health adding that there was need to ensure that the goods received are price worthy.

"We must endeavour to do everything in our powers to ensure that the procurement process currently being discussed does not remain silent about the inflating of prices in the public procurement"

Muburukua added that it does not make sense to set apart millions, for instance, to build toilets, if at the end they only get products worth half of the money spent.

"I also hope you will do wider consultations on the formula and the measure [to put in place] because government has a tendency to consult the actual players leaving out the affected community members. If your consultations only end with the ministry and the seller then it does not take in consideration the society."

Also speaking on the issue, Swarbooi expressed concern with people involved in corruption under the

disguise of Covid-19, saying with the suspension of the normal procurement process and other usual proceedings, the regulations and measures of Covid-19 are facilitating corruption.

According to him some of the measures put up by government seem to stretch Covid-19 beyond the appropriate and necessary measure.

The LPM leader who is of the view that the lockdown rules are extreme, stated that the measures are not produced on the basis of thorough consultations for the opposition to vouch for the decision taken.

According to him, in absence of consultations, it is hard for the opposition to say whether the decisions taken in light of the pandemic were rational or objective.

In response Justice Minister Yvonne Dausab stated that a discussion on measures to control pricing are still taking place.

"So, on the table at the moment there is directive from the Ministry of Trade and Industrialisation that is intended to deal with price inflation or limiting price exploitation during the pandemic and deal with unfair pricing during the pandemic."

According to Dausab there are challenges when it comes to questions around the constitutional text relating to the role of Namibian Competition Commission in dealing with unfair competition and when it comes to price control.

Dausab further added that there is also a proposed formula on how government will put in measures to test whether or not cost and price that is determined is different from what was prior to Covid-19. That discussion is still taking place.

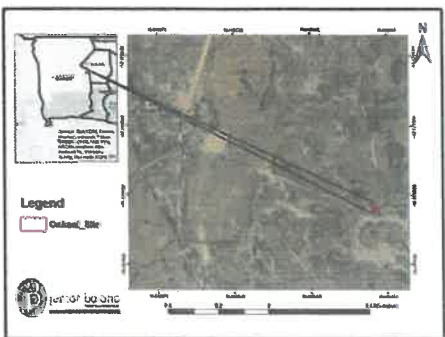

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# Opposition bemoans slow Covid-19 testing process

**P**OPULAR Democratic Movement (PDM) lawmaker Vipuakuje Muharukua has expressed his concern and disappointment with the slow testing of Covid-19 in the country saying due to the slow pace of testing, government would not know the full impact of the

virus. Muharukua made the comment this week in the National Assembly noting that while the country had planned a large-scale testing targeting about 200 000 people, so far only about 5 000 had been tested. This he said is disappointing, especially during a time when more people coming into the country were testing

positive. However, late last month Health minister Kalumbi Shangula announced that they will no longer be testing based on the 200 000-target testing figure. He at the time noted that Namibia will now aim to test less than one percent of the country's population. According to Shangula, the 200 000 figure was based on the projected testing capacity of the Namibia Institute of Pathology (NIP) but the country needs to test fewer people to achieve an objective, which is to assess the degree of community transmissions.

Muharukua is however of the opinion that recent events of people sneaking out of quarantine facilities

or abandoning tracks into the communities were signs that there could be possible transmissions and that government needs to fast-track the testing process. "We know, based on the chronology of events, that there are people who came in the country before these strict requirements who were told to self-quarantine at home... they did not do it. These people went into the community, so we do not know the full impact of the virus and how the import is in terms of the virus," the opposition MP stated.

He added that, "A lot of people quarantined are increasingly coming out positive. Some of these people went into the community. So, we implore

that government speeds up testing because at the moment it is slow and with it being slow, we don't know how fast the infection rate is out there."

As of Monday morning Namibia had 31 confirmed cases of Covid-19 of which 15 are active cases while 16 have recovered from the virus. The country has zero Covid-19 related deaths. Update by officials at the Ministry of Health also showed that a total number of 4 974 people were tested and 737 were being kept in quarantine facilities countrywide.

Also speaking in the National Assembly this week, Deputy Prime Minister Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah, blamed the slow process

of testing to a shortage of supplies for Covid-19 testing materials worldwide.

According to her, testing materials are in high demand worldwide and as a result, they are not readily available for purchase.

"The problem at hand is that the materials are not readily available. It is not that we do not want to test but it's the material that is not there. We want to test one third of the population but there is a world demand for testing material.

"So we are aware that we have no arrested the situation and that is why we have put measures in place... that is why we put Walvis Bay on a lockdown because we want to protect our people," Nandi-Ndaitwah defended.

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# Dundee collaborates with Grootfontein municipality

DUNDEE Precious Metals Tsumeb has collaborated with Grootfontein municipality in the fight against Covid-19 donating Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) valued at N\$30 500.

A statement by the company this week outlined that the donation was successfully handed over to the Grootfontein municipality.

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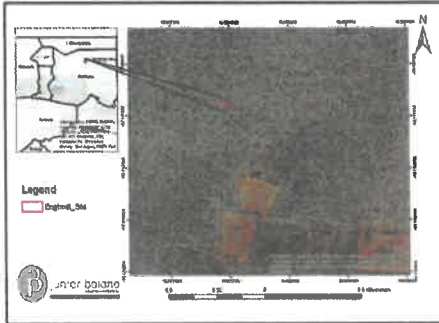

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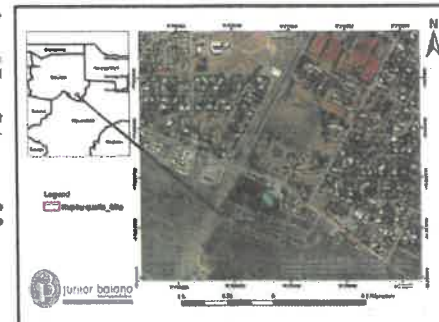

The England captain has used the suspension of the Premier League season to recover from surgery and is now available to face United on Friday.

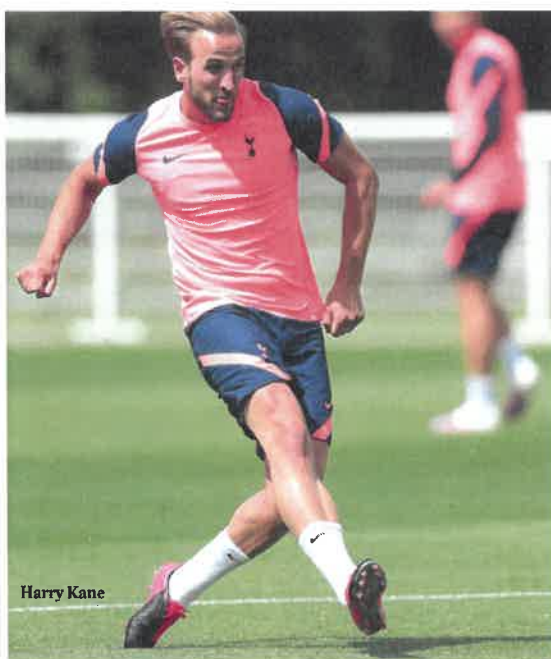
"He is working extremely well, I can tell you no problem he is going to start the game," Mourinho said.

"Is he in his top form? We don't know. It is not a little training session. He's had around six months without playing a football match.

"But he has worked extremely well, he is an amazing professional and is going to start tomorrow."

Mourinho also confirmed Moussa Sissoko and Heung-Min Son will return to the starting line-up against his former club after recovering from their respective knee and arm

Tottenham are currently eighth in the Premier League, four points behind United in fifth place, which is set to be a Champions League slot if Manchester City's appeal against their European ban is unsuccessful.

"It is a strange battle to fight but at the same time it is a great challenge and a great motivation," he said.

"I will try not to look at that points difference. That is why I cannot tell you exactly the difference in points we have to our opponents.

"We have to look to this incredible challenge in the way that every game we will try to win.

The English Premier League team had already agreed to a deal in principle with Werner after meeting his release clause of around \$68 million.

"He will link up with his new teammates in July, subject to passing a medical examination," Chelsea said.

Despite not having Werner when the suspended Champions League resumes in August, Leipzig wished him well, saying "we have grown up together."

Werner was with Leipzig when it made its top-flight debut in 2016, and he matched the club scoring record of 93 on Wednesday against Fortuna Dusseldorf.

"We've achieved a lot together and as a young player I was able to continue my development in a perfect way and become a national team player," Werner said.

"For me, it was clear that my next step would take me abroad, and that was always my dream.

"It's not a decision against RB Leipzig but for my dream, to play one day in the Premier League, the

# What are the cost implications of withdrawing an offer to purchase and who is responsible?

**P**roperty 24 reader Michelle Barnard is buying her first house but says she is having second thoughts, due to the “delay of being able to take occupation of her new home”.

“From the beginning I made it clear to my agent that I need to occupy as soon as possible as I have to move where I’m currently renting. The agent told me that they would talk to the sellers and it should not be a problem,” says Barnard.

However, Barnard says she did not receive a copy of the contract after it was signed, with no clear communication about being able to take occupation from 1 July, as requested.

Covid-19 Lockdown has caused a number of issues for the industry that was put on hold for two months, further compounded by the deeds office being closed and many people now at risk of losing their jobs or being in financial distress as a result.

Barnard says after her home loan was approved she contacted the agent to inquire about the occupation, as she was still not clear on the matter. “The agent sent me a voice note stating that it is fine and she is 100% sure that the contract states that we can move on the 1st of July. I sent a confirmation message wherein I told her I am giving notice then.

However, 3 days later she received feedback from her “transferring Attorneys that says we can only occupy 1 August”.

Barnard now wants to know if she can withdraw her purchase, as the registration is not done – based on the “lack of communication and facts she says were withheld from her?”

**“And if I do what will the cost implications be due to this?”**

An offer to purchase, commonly referred to as the “OTP” is an important document which should not be entered into lightly without due regard to its contents. Once signed by both parties, it is a legal contract binding both seller and purchaser to fulfil their respective duties.

It is more often than not that the OTP would be subject to the relevant suspensive conditions.

Subject to suspensive conditions of bond approval

For clarities sake, a suspensive condition suspends the obligations flowing from a contract until the occurrence of an uncertain future event. As an example, the obligations flowing from an OTP could be subject to the



purchaser obtaining bond approval. Once the purchaser obtains the approval, the contract comes into operation and would be binding on the parties. Importantly, the agent would also have earned their right to commission which would become due on date of transfer.

In light of the above, it is of the utmost importance for the purchaser to familiarise himself/herself with the terms and conditions of the OTP. Due consideration must be given to aspects such as date of occupation, occupational rent, improvements made and general conditions of sale. Once signed and provided the suspensive condition(s) are fulfilled, the purchaser is bound to that agreement.

**‘In breach, without any underlying legal cause’**

Should any party fail to adhere to the terms of the OTP without an underlying legal cause, that party will stand in breach of the contract. The other party would thus be entitled to cancellation, to claim damages or to claim for specific performance. Additionally, the party who stands in breach could also be held liable for the agent’s commission where the relevant suspensive conditions have been fulfilled.

In this instance it seems that the agreement was subject to bond approval which was subsequently obtained. The purchaser would thus stand in breach should he/she cancel the agreement unless he/she has an underlying legal

cause. Which brings us to the relevant discussion below.

Within our law of contract a party who signs a document containing contractual terms is generally bound by his/her signature whether he/she read the

document or not.

**‘Grounds of misrepresentation’**

However, this rule is not absolute. The law also recognises that it would be unconscionable for a person to enforce the terms of a document where he/she misled the signatory, whether intentionally or not.

Furthermore, in terms industry specific regulations, an estate agent should not wilfully or negligently make any false statements or misrepresentations or willingly mislead and influence a prospective purchaser. With that being said, in this scenario the agent made false statements to the purchaser regarding the date of occupation and thus made a misrepresentation which had the purchaser being aware of, would not have entered into the contract.

The purchaser would have a legal ground to cancel making the agreement voidable at the purchaser’s election. If the purchaser cancels the agreement, he/she should be placed in the same position as prior to the conclusion of the offer to purchase.

Even though the misrepresentation was made by the estate agent it was done within the scope of his/her mandate authorised by the seller. The seller therefore in return would have a claim against the estate agent for any damages suffered as a result of the cancellation of the agreement.

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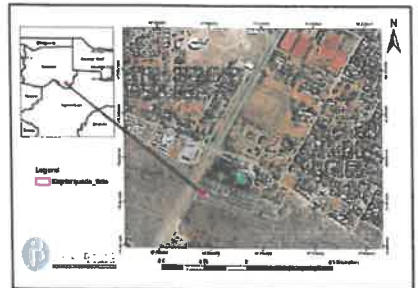

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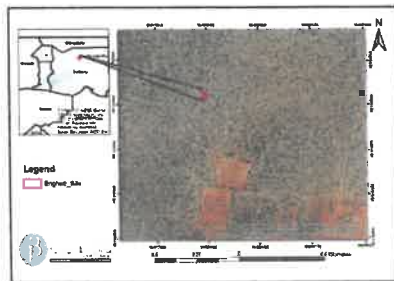

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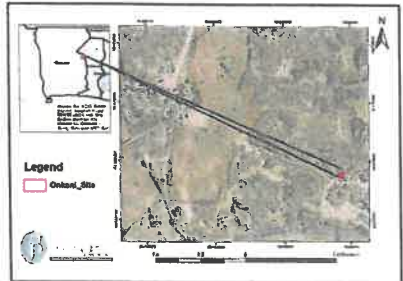
