

Unam lab licensed to test Covid-19 samples

In the wake of increasing transmission of Covid-19 across Namibia, diamond mining giant Debmair Namibia and the University of Namibia (Unam) have teamed up and established a laboratory that is licensed to conduct Covid-19 tests as from 3 August 2020.

The Unam molecular diagnostic laboratory is a licensed medical laboratory in terms of Section 31 of the Hospitals and Health Facilities Act 36 of 1991.

The opening of the Covid-19 testing laboratory at the Faculty of Health Sciences at Hage Geingob Campus was launched on Tuesday.

Unam vice-chancellor Kenneth Matenge said the university now boasts two PCR machines with 10

highly trained staff members, seven from Unam and three from the health ministry.

"We are able to clear 140 tests per day. We commit to use them to run tests, but also mine the data we collect to conduct research and make a scientific contribution to the body of knowledge that deals with fighting disease outbreaks. This is in line with our new vision of being a sustainable international hub of excellence in higher education, training, and innovation by 2030," Matenge noted.

Debmair Namibia acquired a Covid-19 PCR testing machine and signed a memorandum of agreement with Unam School of Medicine to conduct tests.

The sponsorship will support government efforts in the national fight against the Covid-19 pandemic.

Additionally, this sponsorship supports the company's internal focus on protecting and testing its employees as well.

Unam's profile of science and medicine experts will run the facility for around one year, after which the ownership of the equipment will be ceded to the university.

The PCR machine along with 10 000 testing kits is valued at more than N\$3.6 million and will play a vital role in the turnaround time for results as it is expected to analyse about 250 samples per day.

Unam spokesperson John Haufiku said the establishment of the testing laboratory at Unam's Hage Geingob campus will increase the diagnostic and prognostic testing process of Covid-19 and complement efforts by the Namibia Institute of Pathology (NIP) and

accelerate the country's testing capacity.

NIP helped Unam acquire the licence by guiding them through the strict licensing process.

Debmair Namibia CFO Otto Shikongo committed the company to do everything it can to protect its employees and the surrounding communities. "We value the health and safety of our people above all else and are equally committed to delivering support to our country throughout this difficult period. We aim to keep our operations running safely, and to proactively support and supplement efforts of the government," remarked Shikongo.

"This great contribution by Debmair Namibia will offer Unam medical students real-time clinical opportunities that will benefit the country's only

locally trained medical doctors phenomenally," remarked Matenge.

The PCR machines came with fully equipped laboratory equipment such as fridges, freeze samples, cabinets with ultra-violet to prep the specimens and centrifuge machines, and so forth.

For the past two weeks, the new PCR machines underwent stringent government and World Health Organisation validation processes. "The Unam laboratory team responsible for operating the testing machine have been trained by experts to increase local capacity," remarked Debmair Namibia's Strategic Project Portfolio Manager, Danie van Arwegen. He added that the company tried its level best to make sure that the laboratory is fully equipped and ready.

Japan's donation helps to alleviate hunger, create jobs

MADJWA - Japan's Ambassador to Namibia Hideaki Harada visited the Karango East region on Tuesday to witness his country's contribution to Namibia's drought response plan in aiding the country.

During the visit, the World Food Programme's (WFP) Country Director for Namibia, Itamankoy Sankoh thanked the government of Japan for contributing N\$11.2 million earlier this year, which was used to purchase over 974 metric tonnes of food to help alleviate hunger and food insecurity.

"This financial contribution from the government of Japan will

provide more than just food to affected persons. It has contributed to improving capacities in those engaged at the core of the day-to-day implementation of this intervention," Sankoh said.

The contribution has also created temporary jobs for Namibian youth.

The WFP country director said it is estimated that over 150 volunteers are engaged in the food distribution programme in the Karango East and West regions. The programme has also created employment which will in turn boost the local economy.

"Jobs have been created throughout the supply chain such as suppliers,

warehouses and transportation. For instance, a local company supplies all the maize meal and another all the salt, hence contributing to the growth of local industries," he stated.

Sankoh said Japan is a long-time valued partner and friend of WFP worldwide and continues to contribute significantly to humanitarian support in the southern Africa region.

He added that WFP will continue to engage the Japanese Embassy in Namibia on the subject of food and nutrition assistance with a view toward addressing emerging challenges, but also to contribute towards addressing the root causes of food and nutrition

insecurity. On his part, Harada said he was happy to witness the distribution of food and nutrition assistance from the government of Japan through WFP.

"I believe that the food assistance has come at the right time during these challenging times as the situation has been compounded by the Covid-19 pandemic where many families lost their livelihoods," the ambassador said. - Namru

Keetmans police station temporarily closed

KEETMANSHOOP - The Keetmanshoop police station in town has been temporarily closed for 48 hours since Tuesday afternoon following the visit of a positive tested Covid-19 public member at the facility.

According to the //Karas regional commander, Commissioner David Indongo, the person has

been admitted at the Keetmanshoop hospital after presenting symptoms of the coronavirus. "He was tested for Covid-19 and later released when he visited the police station to certify copies," the regional police head explained. He went on that, whilst at the station, officials from the ministry of health's surveillance team in Keetmanshoop contacted the person to trace his whereabouts. "It was when he informed the team that he is at the police station that they came there, informed him that his results came out positive and placed him under mandatory isolation," said Indongo.

The commissioner further explained that his office, as a means

of minimising direct contact between customers and officers erected plastic shields at the service counters in the facility to separate persons. "The officers that assisted the positive tested member of the public are in self isolation at the moment and the police station has been furthermore closed for a period of 48 hours for purposes of fumigating the premises," he said.

Indongo also said officers have been redeployed to the police stations in town from where policing operations will continue for the time being. "The general public can visit our temporary office when in need of policing services."

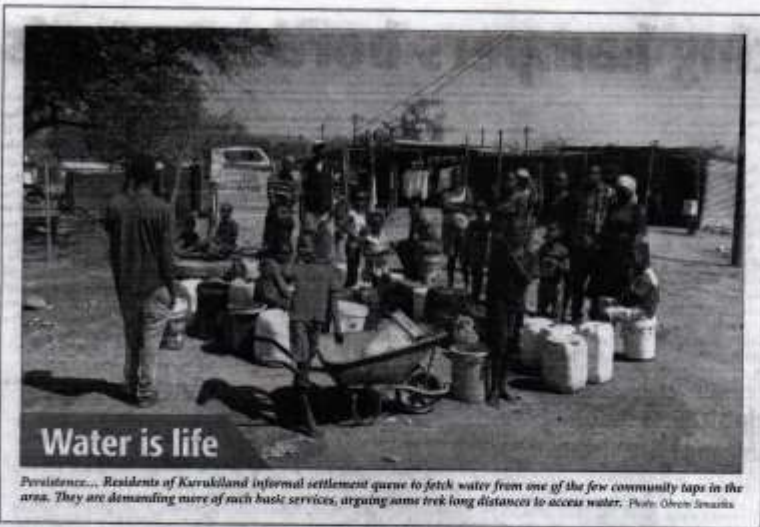

Father of murdered son upset over N\$700 bail

THE father of the late Hango Ekono Shipepe is not happy with the decision by the Okavango Magistrate's Court to grant bail to the murderer accused of his 19-year-old son.

Shipepe was murdered on 30 November last year at Ondonga in Ukuvalandhi, Omusati region.

The suspect, Igandjeni Shikwena, was granted bail of N\$700 in May this year when he appeared in the Okavango Magistrate's Court.

"We have lost a brave young man - a hero that no one can replace. We, the family, are very dismayed by the bail amount granted to Shikwena and would like to know why the bail was granted by the magistrate who was in charge that day," the fuming father Andreas Shipepe said.

"We are all aware that the accused is

innocent until proven guilty but we still feel that his bail amount should have been equivalent to the crime committed."

The father added they simply want justice to prevail. "Nothing will ever bring back our dearly-departed son; however,

it will only give us comfort when justice prevails," he told *New Era*.

The family claimed Shipepe was shot dead after trying to intervene in a fight allegedly involving Shikwena and his girlfriend.

According to the father, his son was murdered in cold blood. "It is so painful and unacceptable that our child's life has been taken away at such a young age and what makes it worse is that the suspect used a semi-licensed gun and it is not on his name," the father added.

"The fact that Shikwena did not hesitate to kill our child in cold blood makes one wonder whether the intervention could not have possibly prevented another woman from joining the statistics of GBV victims. Instead, of Shikwena accepting that his actions were wrong, he turned against our child and killed him on the spot."

Teenager arrested for allegedly raping three minors

The police at Omuthiya arrested a 17-year-old boy on Friday for allegedly repeatedly raping three minor girls between May and August this year.

The victims are aged three, seven and nine years old. Chief Inspector Elifas Kwinda of the Namibian Police during the weekly crime briefing here on Sunday said the suspect was being accommodated by the family of the victims after he was kicked out of a neighbouring house when the rapes allegedly occurred. It is alleged the suspect would enter the room where the seven and nine-year-old girls slept at night and have sexual intercourse with them. The three-year-old girl shared a room with her parents and he would allegedly rape her when she would go into the living room, where he slept, in the morning.

In a similar incident, a 42-year-old man allegedly raped a nine-year-old girl in Mondesa at Swakopmund on Friday. The suspect, who is reportedly married to the girl's aunt, has been arrested.

The police also reported the alleged rape of a 25-year-old woman by a 46-year-old man at Duineveld in the Herero region on Friday.

The victim was reportedly overpowered by the man at her house. The suspect has been arrested.

Meanwhile at Oodangwa, a 22-year-old man allegedly raped a 26-year-old woman on Friday. The woman went to the house of the suspect to get English notes when he allegedly attacked her.

The suspect fled and had not yet been arrested by Sunday. It was also reported that a seven-month-old foetus was found by four minor children playing in an abandoned home at Karasburg on Friday. The children informed adults at nearby houses and they called the police.

No suspect has been arrested yet. Police investigations in all matters continue.

Kandjoze: Say no to shoddy work

Sewerage, water supply, hostel block renovation and extensions are some areas being prioritised and receiving urgent attention from the Covid-19 budget allocated to the Omaheke region.

This was announced during a recent visit by the director general of National Planning Commission Obeth Kandjoze to some of the benefitting schools in the Otjomire constituency.

Expressing satisfaction at the progress, Kandjoze commended schools for liaising with maintenance divisions at preliminary stages to diminish the government's high level of investment in the education sector.

He further urged schools to ensure contractors deliver quality work to the value of the money spent.

Regional director of education Pecka Semba says the annual budget allocated to the regions is but a drop in the ocean, as it is too minimal to patch up and also cater for capital projects.

Semba also pleaded with the relevant authorities to reconsider the criteria for budget allocations.

"Some regions such as Omaheke are too vast and communities are more dependent on boarding schools; therefore, that should be a motivating factor to allocate more funds for hostel construction and renovations," said Semba.

Kandjoze further advised for a rebalancing of the needs with what is currently available.

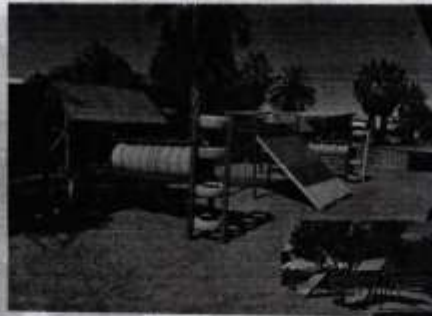
