Communication with I&APs, and Means of Consultation Employed

Regulation 21 of the EIA Regulations details the steps to be taken during a public consultation process and these have been used in guiding this process. Communication with I&APs with regards to the proposed development was facilitated through the following means and in this order:

- A Background Information Document (BID) containing brief information about the proposed project was compiled and hand delivered to the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT) accompanying the ECC application, and uploaded on the MEFT (ECC) Portal for project registration and shared with registered Interested and Affected parties (I&APs).
- A Stakeholders' (I&AP) List was developed and updated as new I&APs register for the ESA. The BID shared with the pre-identified key stakeholders such as the Kunene regional Council (Head Office as well as Sesfontein Constituency and Settlement Office), Nami Daman Traditional Authority and the Omatendeka Conservancy Management).
- Project Environmental Assessment notices were published in the New Era and Windhoek Observer newspapers on the 05th and 12th of September 2023 (attached hereto). The consultation period ran from the 05th of September 2023 to the 06th of October 2023, and extended to 09 October 2023.
- A3 size posters were pasted at the Kunene Regional Council' Sesfontein Settlement Office (in Sesfontein), Warmquelle Settlement (at a local market near the turn off to Okavare) and Okavare Village at the local small market (cuca shop). The photos of the site where posters were pasted are shown below.

 A consultation meeting was scheduled and held with the community and local stakeholders (in Okavare Village, inside the EPL) on the 05th of October 2023 as shown below. The meeting was attended by eighteen (18) people as per the attendance register. The consultation meeting minutes were taken and are attached hereto.

 Another consultation meeting was held between the Proponent representatives, Environmental Assessment Practitioner, and Chairperson of the Omatendeka Conservancy in Windhoek on the 10th of October 2023. The meeting supposed to take place in Omatendeka area on the 05th of October 2023, but due to the unavailability of the Chairperson and Conservancy Management in the area on that day, it was not possible. Therefore, a briefing consultation meeting was instead held with the Chairperson as he was in Windhoek attending to other Conservancy related workshop in Windhoek at the time (see photos below). A second meeting in the Omatendeka will be held with the Conservancy Management later in 2024.

Shaningwa shoots down Swapo extraordinary congress calls

EETMANSHOOP–Swaposecretary general Sophia Shaningwa says there will be no extraordinary congress, confirmingthatpartyvicepresidentNetumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah is their sole and authentic presidential candidate for the 2024 election. Nandi-Ndaitwah secured her position during the seventh congress held in November last year.

Namibians are set to return to the polls next year for the Presidential and National Assembly (NA) elections. Speaking at a Swapo rally in Keetmanshoop over the weekend, Shaningwa urged party members to mobilise and prepare for the 2024 presidential and NA elections, emphasising that Nandi-Ndaitwah is the sole Swapo party presidential candidate. "Let us go out and vote for Namibia's first female president.

We have a responsibility to ensure that she receives our support. I will not hesitate to endorse her as the candidate for the Swapo party, and there will be no alternative candidate and no extraordinary-congress," Shaningwa said.

Shaningwa noted Nandi-Ndaitwah's qualifications in both domestic and international matters, while also showering her with praises, describing her as a compassionate leader who listens not only with her ears, but with her heart as well.

She urged party members to rally behind Nandi-Ndaitwah as they had done for the first, second, and third presidents of the party and the country. Matheus Mumbala, Swapo's regional coordinator for the //Kharas region, echoed the sentiment of party unity and support for

Nandi-Ndaitwah as the 2024 presidential candidate.

"We are hearing people talking about extra-ordinary congress. That will not happen. It happened once in 2004 but it will not repeat itself, our rules and procedures are clear. We will have an electoral college to elect candidates for members of parliament but as far as presidential candidate goes, congress has pronounced itself, even if you were in support [of Nandi-Ndaitwah] or not," the outspoken Mumbala said. On her part Nandi-Ndaitwah, or NNN as she is known in the Swapo circles, said the party's aim should be to reclaim its glory day.

The most powerful political weapon available to reclaim the lost ground is uniting the masses towards a shared socio-economic prosperity. "I urge you to work harder to ensure that come 2024, Swapo party and its presidential candidate are given unreserved support in order to ensure a landslide victory," she said. -Nampa

Ohangwena bemoans police exclusion

ONGWEDIVA - Ohangwena regional council chairperson Erickson Ndawanifa has expressed disappointment in the safety ministry's purported lack of consultation with the regional leadership.

Ndawanifa is also the councillor for Omulonga constituency.

In an exclusive interview with New Era last week, Ndawanifa complained about the absence of police stations at Omulonga and Oshikunde constituencies.

Ndawanifa said this year alone, two police stations were constructed in the Ohangwena region, at Epembe and Omundaungilo constituencies, without the regional leadership being consulted.

"I just heard that two police he said. The lack of police is aware of the unavailability of stations have already been stations, he hastened to say, police stations in the Omulonga completed. They did

completed. They did not consult my office to discuss the challenges of the police stations. I am not happy with how they handled things," Ndawanifa lamented.

He said it is unfair for police stations to be constructed in constituencies that already have police stations.

"How can you build two police stations in those constituencies while there are constituencies without any single police station? They made their decision without engaging the regional chairperson," he said. What is worse, he said, Omulonga is one of the biggest and densely populated constituencies in the region.

"People travel long distances seeking police services. People pay transport fare to reach the police station. Every time, people are crying in my constituency," said the politician.

Ndawanifa said since 2015, he has been writing letters to the relevant authorities requesting for the construction of a police station in his constituency but to no avail.

"Now people in my constituency are planning to go on a peaceful demonstration against lack of police stations," he said. The lack of police stations, he hastened to say, contributes to high crime rate and also delays the reporting of criminal activities. A resident of Omulonga constituency who spoke to this publication blamed government for not coming to their rescue.

"We have been voting for the same government but it failed to provide police services in our constituency. Our Prime Minister [Saara Kuugongelwa-Amadhila] should hear our cry and act," said David Shaanika.

For Selma Hangula from Oshatotwa village, the lack of police stations is contributing to high gender-based violence as they are far from the police where they can report incidences of crime.

Approached for comment, police inspector general (IG) Joseph Shikongo said his office is aware of the unavailability of police stations in the Omulonga constituency.

"We are busy planning to build more police stations in the Ohangwena region and the two Kavango regions, " he said.

Meanwhile, deputy safety minister Daniel Kashikola said it was not a must for each constituency to have a police station. He said the new police station was built in the Omundaungilo constituency in order to improve the living conditions of the police officers who used to sleep in a tent at the borders.

"Police at the borders are suffering. Therefore, it is necessary that we first improve theirlivingconditions,"headded. Kashikola also emphasised that the other police station was built in the Epembe constituency because the first police station was old and small.

Daughter attacks mother with machete

ONGWEDIVA - A 28-year-old Namibian female was arrested last Friday after allegedly attacking her biological mother with a panga, a weekend crime report shows.

The suspect is from Ongudi village in Omungwelume.

It is alleged that at around 14h00, the suspect attacked the 63-year-old victim with a machete, leaving her with open cut wounds to the lips, chest and hands.

She is being treated at Oshakati State hospital, and police investigations continue.

In another unrelated incident, on Friday at around 20h00 on the B1 road between Oshivelo and Omuthiya, near Omutsegonime village, an unlicensed driver of a Toyota Corolla lost control and bumped into an oncoming truck.

The vehicle, which was travelling from Ondangwa with three occupants, was avoiding some cattle, which were on the road.

Two male passengers died, while one is receiving treatment at Onandjokwe hospital.

Meanwhile, at Uupopo location in Ondangwa, at around 11h00, it is alleged that abody of a 25-year-old Angolan male was found hanging from the roof of his sleeping room.

No suicide note was left behind and no foul play is suspected. Police investigations continue. On Saturday, at around 03h40 at Omusaati

Gwopoosa in Omaalala area, a 33-year-old man was bumped by a vehicle and died instantly in what is suspected to be an attempted hitand-run.

According to Oshana police spokesperson Thomas Aiyambo, the driver fled the scene.

"After investigations, we found the vehicle [Polo] parked in the garage of a house in Ohakweenynga village. We arrested the 18-year-old and he had no driver's licence," said Aiyambo.

On Sunday at around 04h40 at Club Ace in Ongwediva, a 27-year-old who was allegedly causing havoc was shot in the stomach and knee by a security guard. He later died at the Oshakati State hospital.

"It is alleged the deceased was disturbing customers and tried to steal items from them in the club. The deceased was taken out of the club by the employees and security guard," said Aiyambo.

It is alleged while outside, the deceased allegedly attacked the security guard with an Okapi knife. Retaliating, the security guard fired a warning shot on the ground, while the deceased proceeded to walk towards the guard with his knife.

"The security guard shot him in the stomach and knee. The guard went to hand himself over to the Ongwediva police station," said Aiyambo.

Donatus: Urban starvation a reality

SWAKOPMUND - Urban families are increasingly finding themselves between rocks and hard places, grappling with a dire shortage of food supplies.

This situation has been exacerbated by the soaring unemployment levels and the aftermath of the Covid-19 pandemic.

This dire picture was painted by Walvis Bay rural constituency councillor Florian Donatus.

So bad are things that Donatus' office deals daily with desperate and vulnerable families in dire need of food.

Donatus said this during a consultation with Prime Minister Saara Kuugongelwa-Amadhila and the regional political leadership in Swakopmund.

It was Donatus' clarion call to the Premier that to combat urban starvation, drought relief should be extended to those residing in informal settlements within urban areas as well.

"Our office is frequented by people who are very hungry to the extent that we are giving up our own salaries to these people to feed them. The situation is sometimes so severe that one doesn't even want to go to the office, as we do not want to disappoint our people. However, the reality is that if we don't give them at least a bag of maize, they won't have anything to eat," Donatus said

Urban hunger, he said, was exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic, as many residents found themselves destitute after losing their jobs and businesses.

He implored the Prime Minister to reevaluate the situation and seek comprehensive solutions to support vulnerable urban populations.

"Please re-evaluate the situation on how we are going to accommodate those vulnerable people. Rural areas are sorted, and I am happy that they are catered for, but the real concern now is those struggling in the urban setup," the energetic politician said.

Responding, Kuugongelwa-Amadhila said Cabinet has already resolved to assist those in urban areas through various programmes, apart from drought relief.

"The drought relief gets a budget that only covers a period between two harvests, after which we get a budget only if the harvest was poor. We also look at other types of interventions for towns such as Swakopmund and Walvis Bay, which also face food shortages," Kuugongelwa-Amadhila said.

She further emphasised the necessity for additional interventions like backyard gardening to alleviate food shortages in urban areas, along with the need for local authorities and regional councils to drive local economic growth and job creation.

"Our strategies must also be homegrown, spearheaded by our people because that is the only way we are going to ensure that growth translates into improved welfare conditions. Besides that, if we cannot promote the development of local entrepreneurs; if we cannot promote job creation, and if we cannot ensure that there is a living wage, then it means you have to resort to donations for basic shelter and job creation. It is not only important that they earn their own income; it is also important for their dignity," the former finance minister said.

Kuugongelwa-Amadhila added the food bank programme can be used to provide a short-term solution, but food security can also be promoted by creating backyard gardens in urban areas.

Break the silence, seek help - Shangula

EALTH minister Dr Kalumbi Shangula has pleaded with Namibians to break the culture of silence and seek help, as suicide is a major public health problem, with farreaching social, emotional and economic consequences.

Programme data from August 2022 to June 2023 indicate that Namibia lost 623 lives to suicide, of which 511 are males and 92 are females.

"Most worrying is the fact that among this number, 20 or 3.2% are from the youth demographic. This illustrates that the death rate by suicide is 21 per 100 000 population, with the highest incidence being experienced in Omusati, Oshikoto and Hardap regions," said Shangula during the commemoration of World Suicide Day yesterday.

He stated that these numbers confirm that suicide is a major public health concern in Namibia and must serve as a call to action to prevent further incidences of suicide.

He said: "Some mental health conditions are associated with an increased risk of suicide. Persons with depression, bipolar disorder and schizophrenia especially have a high propensity to suicide. Apart from mental health conditions, contributing factors to suicide include substance abuse, chronic health issues, persistent pain or physical disability, feelings of isolation or helplessness and negative life events".

Shangula highlighted that although suicides are preventable, efforts require coordination and collaboration among multiple sectors of society, including the health sector and other sectors, such as education, labour, agriculture, business, justice, law, defence, politics and the media.

Hesaidtheeffortsmustbecomprehensive and integrated, as no single approach alone can make an impact on an issue as complex as suicide.

"A crucial part of suicide prevention is addressing the stigma associated with mental disorders that in turn trigger suicide. Any person with suicide ideations, any

person thinking of or talking about taking his or her own life or any person who has attempted suicide deserve to get the help they need," said Shangula.

The World Health Organisation acting country representative Dr Mary Bruntao said, globally, an estimated 703 000 people die by suicide each year, among which 77% of the deaths occur in low-middle-income countries.

'These global suicide rates are a serious public health concern. Every life lost to suicide creates a devastating impact on families, communities and nations. Namibia's suicide rate for the past three years is estimated between 19-21 per 100 00 population.

The majority are male, and the method mostly used was by hanging," explained the medical doctor.

Bruntao stated that preventing suicide requires collective action from all of us if we are to achieve the sustainable development goal target of reducing global suicide mortality by one-third by 2030.

1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING

Ms. Fredrika Shagama (Environmental Assessment Practitioner / Consultant) from Serja HGE Consultants opened the meeting, thanked the meeting attendees for making time for the meeting, she then introduced herself, and the Gemco Investments' representatives. She further presented the meeting agenda, which is based on the requirements of the 2012 EIA Regulations: Environmental Management Act No. 7 of 2007 on Public Consultation's Section 21 to 24.

Copies of the Background Information Document (BID) were distributed among the attendees for self-reading and follow throughout the meeting proceedings. She circulated the attendance register for the attendees to sign the meeting attendance as proof of consultation to be appended to the ESA Report. Since some elders could not write or read, they requested one of the community youth to write down their names (and contact details, if available).

To ensure that the meeting contents are understood by the community elders who do not speak not understand English, the translations from English to Otjiherero, and vice versa was done by Mr. Mutenga Japuhua from the community.

2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

Ms. Shagama presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

2.1 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process and the Public Role in the Process

Ms. Shagama explained that the ESA process is done in compliance with the EMA, as the proposed prospecting and exploration works are one of the listed activities that cannot be undertaken without applying and obtaining an environmental clearance certificate (ECC) from the Environmental Commissioner, which is subject to an ESA process and ESA Report as well as an Environmental Management Plan (EMP). The ESA process requires that the consultation meeting is held with the affected and or interested community members where the project activities would be undertaken.

Furthermore, the EPL is in an application stage with the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) and before the rights or the certificate of the EPL can be issued to Gemco Investments, the ECC needs to be obtained first and submitted to the Mining Commissioner to consider the EPL application.
