## **DEFINITIONS OF CRUCIAL TERMS**

### **HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD**

**The head of the household is the person so regarded by the rest of the household.**

You must interview the head of each household. A good way of identifying that person is by asking the inhabitants to indicate the person in charge.

### **HOUSEHOLD**

**All people who prepare food and eat together excluding those who have to pay for their meals.**

Such people will be regarded as lodgers and be seen as a separate household.

### **HOME LANGUAGE**

**The language each person usually speak at home.**

In some cases you may for example find that the mother and the children speaks a language different from the father. You must then for each person record the language that he or she usually speaks.

### **HABITABLE ROOMS**

**All rooms in the house excluding kitchens, bathrooms, toilets and corridors.**

Rooms rented out to another household or single person (who is regarded as a household on his /her own) should not be included in the main household's information. This rooms will be included in the information for the second household.

### **MONTHLY HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE**

**The total amount of money the household spends each month on all the various things.**

Once the total monthly household expenditure has been obtained the enumerator must request the head of the household to break down this expenditure into the various categories as specified in the survey schedule.

This may sometimes be difficult but it is important data. Use your persuasion skills to impress the importance of the data on the respondent. Allow him/ her sufficient time to think about the breakdown of expenditure.

## HOUSEHOLD INCOME

**Household income is the total annual expendable income earned by all members of the household together. This include "take home pay" of every member together with housing allowances received if applicable.**

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You may often find that people find it difficult to calculate annual income and you should help them with such calculations if they will allow you to do so. Remember that this is always a sensitive question and use the code card as directed in order to distance yourself from the response.
