We do not have a strategic plan as of yet but we are using social media to spread the message to the right audience. And us hosting lots of tournaments would slowly increase interest and attract people to our events."

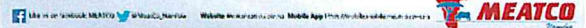

#### CLARITY ON TRACTOR OPERATORS/DRIVERS ADVERT FOR OMUSATI REGION

On the 01 July 2020, a notice/advert of vacancies of Tractor Operators/Drivers from the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform (MAWLR) Omusati Regional Office was circulated on social media. The notice/advert implied that only applicants from Omusati Region would be considered for employment. MAWLR hereby wishes to apologize to the Namibian public and correct the misleading content in the above-mentioned advert.

The Namibia Agricultural Mechanisation and Seed System Improvement Project (NAMSIP) is a new project of the Government of the Republic of Namibia co-funded by the African Development Bank (AfDB) and executed by MAWLR. Under this Project, Three Hundred and Fifty tractors (350) will be procured of which Two Hundred and Fifty (250) will be procured during the 2020/2021 Financial Year.

These tractors will be used to provide subsidised agricultural services such as ripping, ploughing, disc harrowing, planting, fertilizer application, mechanical weeding, pesticide application, harvesting, threshing and baling of grass including mowing/cutting and hay raking. NAMSIP will be complementary to the Dry Crop Production Programme (DCPP), which is an on-going agronomic initiative implemented in the ten (10) crop growing regions.

In this regard, the Ministry is required to recruit two hundred and fifty (250) seasonal/contractual tractor operators/drivers to operate the tractors and provide the above mentioned services to both rain fed and irrigation crop/fodder producers during the cultivation period and/or when need arises.

The tractor operators/drivers need to be recruited in advance to facilitate the procurement of protective gears that cannot be done without knowing the particulars of the drivers in terms of height, sizes, etc. This will also give MAWLR ample time to conduct training for the tractor operators/drivers before their deployment to regions.

It is against this background that the regional staff members were requested to facilitate the recruitment of 250 seasonal contractual tractor operators/drivers in their respective regions in line with government casual/seasonal labourers recruitment criteria. The contractual tractor operators/drivers will be recruited in accordance with the number of tractors allocated per region. The number of tractors per regions are allocated based on the type of agricultural activities, and total number of households involved in crop production in each region.

MAWLR will advertise (in print media and at MAWLR regional offices) all vacancies in this regard before the end of July 2020.

Her office wants water to be available at the settlement daily and in sufficient quantities considering the increasing number of Covid-19 cases.

Governor of Khomas region, Laura McLeod-Katjira assured the councillor that the City of Windhoek needs to respond promptly to the water plea.

Musee Kazapua, the councillor of the City of Windhoek who stood in for the mayor promised the City will prioritise the provision of water to the settlement.

# Constituency office empowers the jobless

**K**OËS - It is imperative for government to assist citizens so that they become self-sustainable, considering these

challenging times of coronavirus, said Keetmanshoop rural constituency councillor Elias Kharugab.

He made these remarks while undertaking follow up visits at

ongoing community projects initiated through his office.

Vytyle Hanse, one of the beneficiaries who received 10 goats last year, despite the devastating drought, has through perseverance and acquired farming skills increased her small livestock total to close to 50 goats. "Through the grace of God, I have never given up hope and what you see here today is the result of hard work and sacrifices," she explained to *New Era*.

She said in addition, she also sold some of her livestock at local auctions as a means of generating income for her family's needs. The communal farmer said they received a piece of land from Koës village council for which they pay a minimal monthly rent. "It is my intention to plant fruit and vegetable on unutilised portion of land," narrated Hanse.

Another beneficiary, Niklaas Kooper received a cement mixer, 200 bags of

cement and other necessary equipment at the beginning of this year to start a brick-making project.

"I only received land from the Koës

village council to start my project last month and it is my intention to start producing building bricks once the country moves to the next stage of the prevailing state of emergency," he explained. Kooper said as a means to empower unemployed youth, his project will employ six women and six men.

"It is my sincere wish that bricks produced from the project will be used by government to build houses for poor community members, giving them a sense of ownership as I will sell many of the bricks to council in order to generate income for us members running the project," he concluded.

Another beneficiary, Stefanus van der Byl got a portion of fertile land for purposes of crop production

from the Koës council. "I started with the project three weeks ago and have so far produced watermelons, I will further plant pumpkins, cabbages and beetroot," he said.

Van der Byl intends to employ unemployed community members on a casual basis.

"I entered into an agreement with the village council that we will share the proceeds coming from the project on a 50/50 basis and I intend to consume my share and also sell some of the harvested produce," enthused Van der Byl.

Kharugab during his visits said he will through stakeholder engagement and public funding continue to empower people who are willing to upgrade their living standards.

He hopes his initiative would assist government to eradicate poverty and empower the needy.

## Habitat committee unhappy with Oshana water project report

**OSHA KATI** - The National Council Parliamentary Standing Committee on Habitat is dismayed by the way drought mitigation funds were utilised in the construction of the Ombonde-Omapale water supply pipeline project.

The project, which is aimed at improving water supply to what is known as the Ombuga grazing area in the Oshana region's Uuvudhiya constituency, received a grant of N\$23 million from the Office of Prime Minister in the 2019/20 budget.

Besides purchasing of materials for the pipeline rehabilitation, the money is also earmarked for the ongoing construction of a booster pump station on the same pipeline at the constituency's Ombonde centre. Chief Regional Officer in Oshana Martin Elago told the committee on Monday that the project is 98% complete and over N\$20 million has already been utilised.

The committee members, chaired by Swapo politician in the National Council from the Zambezi region, Cletius Sipapela, however expressed dissatisfaction with Elago's explanation.

They argued that the infrastructure provided was not worth N\$20 million and a better presentation about how the money was utilised


is outstanding.

"I have no other option but to bring in our public accounts committee which deals with public money," Sipapela said while declining to accept the project presentation.

Sipapela said contractors have a tendency of overpricing when it is a government project, which is not the case for privately-owned tenders. A member of the committee and Kunene councillor for Opuwo Urban, Welch Mupya asked how N\$183 000 was spent on building the pump station caretaker's house which he said is "tiny and not suitable for a human being."

Oshana Regional Council members such as its chairperson, Gerson Kapenda and Andreas Utoni, also expressed disappointment with how the project was implemented. The construction of the Ombonde-Omapale project commenced in January this year and is expected to be completed in September, after it was extended from its initial three-month completion period.

## Deadly Ground, Reeziana up in arms over contract

**A**WARD-winning female rapper Reeziana Naris has accused the founder of Deadly Ground music project Fidel Nambundunga of drawing up a contract which is 'deceiving, and controlling'.

According to Reeziana, she was chosen by the public to be part of the Deadly Ground project but was later handed over a contract which she describes as 'a pawn used to produce more money', and changed her mind. Deadly Ground is a project aimed at resuscitating the local hip hop industry through putting old school rappers on one beat to which the artists then lend their vocals through each one freestyling. There is a track for female rappers and another for the males.

After going through the contract, Reeziana took to social media and wrote, "I apologise to all my fans who were looking forward to me being on the Deadly Ground female albums;

I was contacted but I refuse to sign a contract that gives other people so much power over my art".

She went on to label the contract as crippling while urging upcoming

musicians to avoid accepting just any deal.

"I will continue to do what I do and grow in this industry without all their artists' crippling contracts ...

don't take just anything because you have nothing, find a job and invest in your dream," she added.

In an interview with *Confidente* following her social media posts, Reeziana said, being part of the all-female project was a good initiative but she did not agree with the paragraph in the contract stating that, "The company shall be the sole and exclusive owner of copyrights in the masters and all other materials recorded here-under embodying the recordings."

"I only have a problem with someone having rights to my hard work nothing else. Maybe other people got a different contract and I went on Facebook because I owe an explanation to my fans," she said.

Responding to the allegations, Nambundunga said all female rappers selected to work on the project received the same contract but no one complained except Reeziana.

"I don't know if there was a misunderstanding. This is not a record label, it is a project or a movement

that we are trying to protect. The artists are basically getting 70 percent from all sales, performances and merchandises and then we take the 30 percent. It is not a management deal. If she had queries she could have asked instead of going on social media" he said.

So far, Nambundunga has managed to get almost 20 male rappers on one track already and divided them in two groups he split as 'Volume one and Volume two', and the two songs are already available on local download platforms.

According to Nambundunga, the male version songs are making waves while promising to release the female version in the next few months once all the artists have put their vocals on the melody he provided.

"It wasn't a forced thing, we have artists like Zanele who are excited to be in studio. Everything is paid for, the beat and the recording sessions, all they need to do is just put their lyrics on," he added.

## Disco releases Mistake

Speaking to *Confidente*, Disco said he decided to release his single to build up hype before dropping his long anticipated album titled 'The Judas'.

With Covid-19 keeping all creatives on their toes, Disco said he has used the time to work on his album while sharing inspiring messages through his music.

He said 'Mistake' is inspired by men or bad partners in general who constantly abuse their significant others.

"This song is all about a man who keeps disappointing his woman through infidelity but she keeps forgiving him and eventually he wakes up one day changed into a better man for his wife, regretting all the tears he caused her."

Although the song is inspired by real life events happening around him, he said, Nasty C's song 'SMA' also played a major role in the scripting of the lyrics.

Disco said, "I actually listened

to his song and I just thought I could do something related to relationships, misunderstandings and so on but it's not a copy of his song, his concept inspired me."

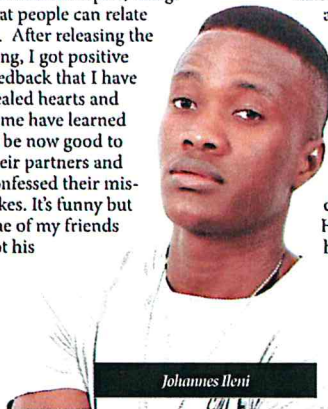
ex-girlfriend back after sending her the song," he added.
