1 INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING

Hon J Van Neel of the Gibeon constituency office welcomed Ms Uulenga to Gibeon and thanked everyone for attending.

A prayer was offered by one of the community members in attendance before the public meeting commenced

Ms Uulenga then explained the purpose of the meeting and presented an overview of the Environmental Assessment (EA) process. She described the three main phases of the EA process: obtaining information, report writing and finally submission of report to the Department of Environmental Affairs as part of an application for an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC).

2 OVERVIEW OF PROPOSED PROJECT

Ms Uulenga then provided a brief overview of the proposed activity on behalf of Ms Olivia Platt. The main aspects of the activity were outlined as follows:

- **Project Description:**
 - Small-scale quarrying processing of mudstone/shale/sandstone rocks on:
 - Mining Claims (MCs 72110 and 72111) on communal land FMR/00076 near Gibeon Townlands.
- **Mining Claim activity process:**
 - Extraction
 - Drilling of holes perpendicular to slab of slate
 - Small amount of black powder and igniters added to the hole
 - Black powder is ignited and detonated
 - Slabs removed using an excavator
 - Slab Cutting
 - Slabs are cut into more easily managed pieces using diamond tipped blades
 - Splitting
 - Slabs are split down to specific thickness by hand. This process may require trained specialists to avoid damage to tile hence resulting to it being unusable

- Trimming

- Cutting of tile into exact lengths ideal for installation using a machine
 - o Grading
 - Slabs are divided into different categories based on color, surface, roughness/ smoothness and thickness
- **Vehicles, Equipment and Infrastructure:**
 - o Vehicles
 - 2 Excavators
 - 2 Trucks
 - o Equipment
 - 1 Front-loader
 - o Services Infrastructure
 - Water for domestic use will be from a low yield borehole (to be drilled, if none available)
 - Water tank to be used for domestic water harvesting and storage
 - Power will be sourced by means of a generator (Diesel Genset), with possibility of solar plant at a later stage.
 - Shade facility will be built near the working spot
 - Small mobile container to be set up for office use
 - Temporary ablution facilities with septic tank to be set up at site
 - No accommodation on site

3 ISSUES IDENTIFIED

Ms Uulenga then described some of the potential impacts associated with the proposed activity to the audience. The following potential impacts were listed:

Positive

- Operating levies payable to local authority
- Employment creation for 8-13 people
- Skills transfer
- Potential for equity

Negative

- Potential soil disturbance
- Visual and Air quality disturbance
- Impact on local biodiversity (fauna and flora)
- Noise pollution
- Impact on service infrastructure such as local roads
- Damage to archaeological or cultural heritage
- Water resource pollution
- Health and safety impacts of the employees
- Impact of poor communication
- General social nuisance to community members

These impacts, as well as any new impacts identified will be assessed in more detail in the scoping assessment report, which will be availed for review to the community through the office of the traditional authority and the constituency.

4 QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS REGARDING THE PROPOSED PROJECT

Opportunity was then given for those present at the meeting to ask questions or make comments with respect to the proposed activity. These are presented in the table below:

The area was identified and pegged in September 2020 based on a high-level geological assessment, undertaken by the proponent: Olivia Platt The potential partner to Ms. Olivia Platt is the JTD Mining Group. Details of the partnership arrangement will be presented to the Witbooi Traditional Authority and Gibeon Constituency during the surface lease negotiation stage in quarter 1 of 2021.

//Khuxa-!Nab river next to site give a huge inflow into the Fish River, what will this company do to prevent/ protect the river from pollution.

Firstly, it is vital to note that the bulk of the proposed quarrying and semi-processing activities to be undertaken on site is largely dry (i.e. requires little to usage of water). For this reason, very little to no effluent will be produced from the proposed activities.

Secondly, selective quarrying will be implemented whereby only certain areas of the mining claim blocks will be quarried as shown in Figure 2 of the scoping report. Supplementary to selective quarrying, which is primarily aimed at preventing disturbance to channels feeding the //Khuxa-!Nab river, a series of water cut-off or diversion trenches will be excavated and installed around quarries to either divert surface run-off from quarry workings or to cut-off and contain polluted water from the quarry workings (refer to Figure 2 for the proposed layout plans). Additional measures that will be put in place to limit pollution of runoff and any water in the //Khuxa-!Nab river shall include:

- Utilizing existing roads/ tracks to limit opening up new areas for new roads which could increase

sediment erosion into the //Khuxa-!Nab river

- A small (yet sizeable, i.e. enough to contain expected storm influx) pollution control dam should be excavated and constructed proximal to each operational quarry at any given time, and should have a simple silt trap to settle any sediments before releasing such water into the //Khuxa-!Nab river or any tributary.
- Maintain a buffer distance of 150 – 200m for any quarry from the //Khuxa-!Nab river or any sizeable tributary to prevent influx of eroded sediments into the rivers and ensure that areas proximal to the rivers remain vegetated and covered with naturally compact soils that will limit influx of sediments during periods of significant runoff
- If any blasting is to be done (e.g. in zones of hard or difficult excavation) a chemical water quality monitoring program must be implemented upstream and downstream of the blast site to ensure that nitrate concentrations contained in water released into rivers is of acceptable quality (i.e. the water quality must meet those specified under Section 21 of

the Water Act of the Republic of Namibia).

- Any groundwater intercepted at any of the proposed quarries should be diverted or pumped into nearby tributaries to minimize contact with potential pollutants (e.g. explosives, loose sediments, etc)
- Worked out quarries will be lined, fenced off and temporarily used as water storage reservoirs, thus minimizing run off from potentially polluting areas

Niklaas Dawson	Bird life in the tributary river, proper research is needed on the impacts from this project.	OGGC	Noted. The impacts on bird life in tributaries from the proposed activity is low because as shown in Figure 2 the tributaries will not be touched in terms of vegetation clearing and subsequent quarrying.

			<p>Additionally, bird life is typically adversely impacted when high-standing or tall structures such as towers, powerlines, tall buildings are erected on a site. However as outlined under the project description section (chapter 2) no high structures will be constructed on site.</p> <p>To ensure that bird life is not being impacted adversely, the monitoring plan shall enforce recording of all bird fatalities arising from collisions, potential poisoning through consumption of nitrate-rich water, etc.</p>

In addition to employment benefits and potential livelihood improvement for the 10 – 15 people to be employed, additional specific benefits to the affected will be realized through the surface land lease which will be entitled to the traditional authority and potentially other social corporate responsibilities which will be discussed and agreed between the proponent and the community during the negotiation phase (which is the next phase after the environmental impact assessment phase).</p> <p>Local authorities are encouraged to prepare and propose reasonable possible arrangements in this regard (e.g. propose monthly or annual levies, etc.).</p> <p>Furthermore, Since the area will be mined in phases, the entire area will not be cleared at once, thus ensuring availability of grazing pasture as quarrying occurs. Additionally, progressive reclamation of mined out areas by back filling with natural topsoil during mining will ensure recovery of the natural environment to a certain extent, which include the</p>

Niklaas Dawson	Is the mine an open pit and what is its depth?	OGGC	<p>It is important to note the distinction between a quarry and a mine, particularly in terms of scale and footprint area. Mining generally involves large-scale operations extending deep beneath ground surface and over a large footprint. Conversely, quarrying refers to smaller scale operations extending to depths not exceeding 10m.</p> <p>From a geological point of view, the depth can only be established once the thickness of the targeted host rock is determined from drilling. Typically, quarries do not exceed the depth of 10 – 20 m.</p>

	How did she choose this specific location? Who did she come with to show her the rock types?		She does not necessary have to physically go to site to identify potential rocks. A combination of geological knowledge, geological desktop study and Geo-Information Systems (GIS) allows identification of certain rock types such as slate by qualified geologists. This is the approach that was taken by the project proponent and is a permissible approach as per the Minerals Prospecting and Mining Act of 1992 of the Republic of Namibia.

This will also depend on the market demand of the product; if demand for slate stone declines drastically then operations may have to cease until the market has recovered.
	How will fencing off work? Will they fence off the whole area?	OG GC	Not the whole area, only active areas will be fenced off at any given point in time for safety and security reasons.
	Can she provide reference/ information/ history on previous areas she mined in?		Yes, this can be requested during the upcoming negotiation phase.




