

## Summary of Consultation Activities Undertaken for EPL-8967

To ensure that I&APs were timeously and openly notified of the planned project activities, the following tasks were undertaken by OMAVI:

- A list of pre-identified stakeholders was compiled. These formed part of the first email communication sent out soon after the first newspaper adverts for the ESIA Study.
- Formal public notices announcing the commencement of the Environmental Assessment process and extending a formal invitation to the general public to register as I&AP as well as to attend the public consultation meeting were published in *New Era* and *Windhoek Observer* newspapers (dated 29 August and 05 September 2023) as attached hereto.
- A notification email (with Background Information Document (BID)) was circulated to all identified and registered I&APs on 05 September 2023 announcing the commencement of the EIA process and an invitation to register as I&APs – attached hereto. The email also provided information on the community consultation meeting (an invitation) which was scheduled for 11h00 on 24<sup>th</sup> of September 2023. The BID contained a high-level and preliminary description of the planned scope of activities for the proposed mineral prospecting project.
- Printed formal written site notices were placed at various publicly accessible locations in the Region as outlined below (as per some photos below):

  - Ongango Village mini convenience shop & Bar, and

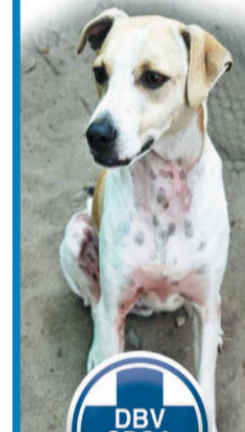
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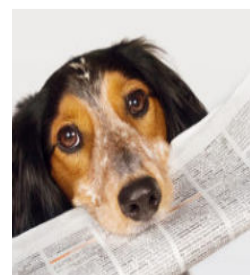

The Meeting was attended by sixteen (16) community members and two Environmental Consultants (Environmental Assessment Practitioner) from OMAVI Geotechnical & Environmental Services - Please refer to the attached attendance register (for the elders who had chosen to have their names registered).

## **1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING**

Ms. Fredrika Shagama (Environmental Assessment Practitioner / Consultant from OMAVI Geotechnical & Geo-Environmental Consultants cc) opened the meeting by introducing her team, welcomed, and thanked everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting. She briefly explained to the attendees the purpose of the meeting with reference to the Environmental Management Act No. 7 of 2007's 2012 EIA Regulations on Public Consultation).

Ms. Shagama presented the meeting agenda. Since some of the meeting attendees were local elders who only spoke Otjherero and Otjizemba languages, to ensure transparency and effective communication in the meeting, Mr. Jahuna Virere translated for the elders (from English to Otjherero and vice versa) throughout the meeting. This was also done to ensure that all comments and other inputs presented in both English and the local language were recorded in the minutes for consideration in the ESSA Report. Since some elders are not able to write, they requested Mr. Virere assisted to write the willing elders' names in the attendance register on their behalf.

The copy of the background information document (BID) was distributed to the attendees and attendance register was circulated for the attendees to write down their names, contact details to receive further information on the ESA process.

## 2. MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

Ms. Shagama presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

### 2.1 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process and the Public Role in the Process

Ms. Shagama explained what an ESA is and why it is required for the proposed exploration activities (she explained that exploration works are one of the listed activities that cannot be undertaken without an environmental clearance certificate (ECC) from the Environmental Commissioner). She further explained that the EPL is solely for prospecting and exploration and not mining as this is always the case in these types of meetings whereby communities do not understand the difference between EPLs and mining licenses or at what stage does mining comes into play.

### 2.2 Project Desirability and Brief Description of the Project

The project desirability was explained to the meeting attendees and how the proposed activities would be undertaken (brief project description).

### 2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

Ms. Shagama also presented the potential impacts that are associated with the proposed project activities, based on experience and pre-identified potential positive and negative environmental and social impacts associated with exploration activities on EPLs.

### 2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

After presenting the proposed project activities and EIA process as well as the associated potential impacts, the meeting attendees were given an opportunity to ask questions and/or raise their concerns with regards to the proposed exploration activities.

These comments and issues/concerns raised were noted down to be included in the ESSA Report and Environmental Management Plan (EMP), and presented in Table 1 below.
