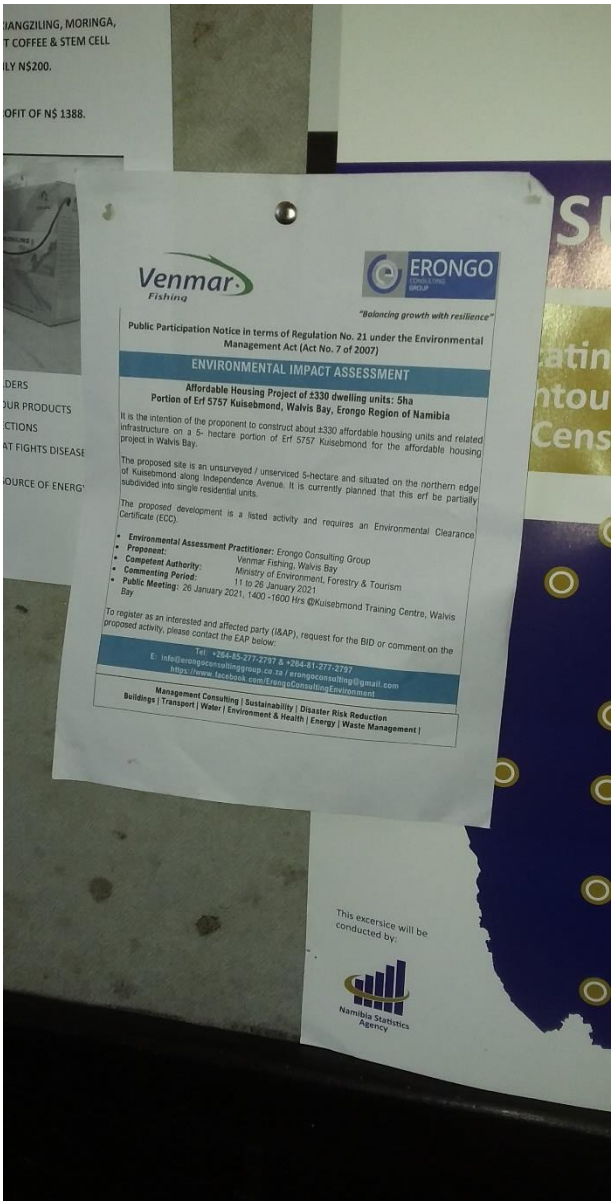

The United States has extended its funding of the contracts of Covid-19 data analysts and public health specialists as the number of Covid-19 cases continue to increase.

US extends funding for virus analysts, health specialists

The extension of the support to the ministry of health, done through the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, means the 11 data clerks and four public health specialists will continue to serve for an additional month.

The original contracts for the positions were for three months. The data clerks have helped process the results of over 215 000 tests performed to date in Namibia.

The personnel were hired through local human resources agency Potentia Namibia Recruitment, the statement reads. "As Namibia starts 2021, we must maintain our understanding of how Covid-19 is affecting the country.

This makes it easier for Namibia to take necessary actions," US ambassador Lisa Johnson was quoted as saying in the statement. The funding for the extension of the contracts forms part of the United States of America's \$100 million donation to fight Covid-19 as announced by the US Embassy in April 2020.

Covid vaccine: Shangula dismisses viral audio clip

Health minister Dr Kalumbi Shangula has warned the recent audio recordings alleging that the ministry is secretly administering

the Covid-19 vaccine to patients in Katutura state hospital are false and irresponsible. The recordings alleged that Covid-19 vaccines have already arrived at the Katutura hospital and patients injected with these shots were dying.

Shangula yesterday strongly warned the audio recordings do not only undermine the ongoing efforts of the healthcare workers to combat the spread of Covid-19 and provide care to those who are ill

but could also lead to unnecessary loss of life as it seeks to dissuade citizens from seeking healthcare when they fall ill.

Shangula announced on Wednesday that the first batch of the Covid-19 vaccine is only expected to arrive in Namibia either by the end of January or sometime in February 2021.

To date, he said, Namibia has not received a single ampule of the Covid-19 vaccine. "It is a criminal offence for one to engage in such

activities. The authors are being identified and the law will take its course. It is incomprehensible that individuals can make themselves guilty of such activities without any obvious benefit to themselves except to bring upon themselves misery," Shangula reacted.

He urged the public to continue to have faith in the government that has consistently worked in the interest of all Namibians.

Shangula during a Covid-19 update yesterday said, one

overzealous individual jumped on the bandwagon and exhorted the public not to agree to be injected. "This false information has been widely circulated on WhatsApp, Facebook and other social media platforms. It is unfortunate that despite repeated words of caution and education campaigns regarding the dissemination of false information on Covid-19, there are still some people who are spreading such fabrications," Shangula stated.

Plight of sex workers highlighted

... commentators warn against 'politicising' issue

Sex workers are vulnerable to human rights abuses and politicising their plight may not achieve the desired outcome, a local commentator has said. University of Namibia (Unam) religious and moral lecturer Basilius Kaserer was reacting to an announcement by rights activist Nicodemus 'Mama Africa' Aoxamub that a political party for sex workers and LGBTIQ communities in the country was on the cards.

Aoxamub, who is the executive director of the sex workers' organisation Rights Not Rescue Trust (RNRT), encouraged those who feel their rights are being violated to join the party when it is eventually launched.

Calls to decriminalise sex work in Namibia have in the past been met with mixed reactions. Kaserer opined that the politicisation of liberal sexual ethics is an overreach. The underlying social imaginary of the church is committed to an ethical code that promotes specific standards," he said.

While the church does not deny the humanity of sex workers or that they deserve to be treated with dignity, Kaserer feels that legalising sex work is in contrast with the canons of the Christian faith. "As the church, we firmly hold that no person should be discriminated against for employment, medical care, and all other life-enhancing goods," he said.

However, he reasoned, the legalisation of sex work only promotes the narrative of dehumanisation. "This is time to think of how we can pull our resources together to create sustainable structures that will provide skills to our citizens.

'Political integration'

Kaserer added part of society believes the public display of this belief of dignity needs to be embodied through the creation of legal and commercial structures of sex work. According to him, years of failed attendance to this request have now led to the current dialogue of soliciting political power that will represent the agenda of sex workers.

"This prompts questions of political integration and inclusion, which cannot be avoided within a secular democracy. Unfortunately, the quest to ask the church to politicise the sexual revolution or the politicisation of liberal sexual ethics is an overreach. The underlying social imaginary of the church is committed to an ethical code that promotes specific standards," he said.

While the church does not deny the humanity of sex workers or that they deserve to be treated with dignity, Kaserer feels that legalising sex work is in contrast with the canons of the Christian faith. "As the church, we firmly hold that no person should be discriminated against for employment, medical care, and all other life-enhancing goods," he said.

However, he reasoned, the legalisation of sex work only promotes the narrative of dehumanisation. "This is time to think of how we can pull our resources together to create sustainable structures that will provide skills to our citizens.

Taking the route of sex work as employment is a lazy narrative that does not concern itself with the meaning of dignity

for the human person. We are also aware that our views should not be made the law but as a majority group in this country, we need to air our concerns regarding the changing social norms.

Kaserer said that the church will continue to help the needy in ways that churches can help but also call upon lawmakers to think humane in the law-making process. He maintained that poor policies and programmes can give birth to numerous social ills that compromise human dignity. Adding they also become loopholes for opportunistic individuals to prey on vulnerable persons.

'Welfare issue'

Retired clergyman Ngeno Nakamhela said mainline churches he is familiar with have a diaconal department dealing with welfare issues. He explained the welfare department deals with services to assist the needy and vulnerable who seek aid from the churches. They help not only the sick but those who find themselves in a situation they didn't want to be in.

You may be a sex worker who had no choice, but others chose to do it for an income. This is not a situation where you find them in need. They do not want a handout," Nakamhela noted. According to him, if churches do not regard sex workers as qualified for the welfare services, that could be a moral judgmental attitude.

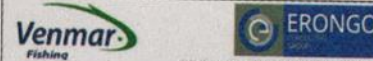

1. OPENING AND WELCOMING REMARKS

Ms. Paulina N. Nyalota (Erongo Consulting Group) opened the meeting with a prayer and welcomed and thanked everyone present, informed the public, the main agenda of the gathering.

Mr. Emmanuel M. Hamadziripi (also Erongo Consulting Group), was tasked to lead the Stakeholders with a Prayer and Minute Taking.

Ms. Paulina N. Nyalota took the participants through the proposed site with the guidance of the Layout Plans and Locality Maps.

2. Presentation On Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Process For the Proposed Development - Fisherman's Village: Affordable Housing Project Of ±660 Dwelling Units: 5ha Portion Of Erf 5757 Kuisebmond, Walvis Bay,

Ms. Nyalota (Chair) explained in detail why it was necessary to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment on for the proposed development. It was emphasized that the proposed development cannot take without the approval of the Environmental Commissioner as enshrined in the Environmental Management Act of 2007.

Question/comment	Answer given
Participant: What is the importance of the EIA process considering the area is quite barren and there is no vegetation?	<p>As per the Environmental Management Act (7 of 2007), the development cannot take place without Environmental Impact Assessment having been completed and Environmental Clearance Certificate issued from the Directorate of Environmental Affairs (MET).</p> <p>The common practice interpretation of the Environmental Management Act is that the development may not be undertaken without an Environmental Clearance Certificate (ECC) in terms of the Environmental Management Act (Act 7 of 2007) and its Regulations.</p> <p>The proposed development and its related infrastructure will likely trigger some negative impacts on the surrounding or immediate environment; therefore, an EIA has to be carried out. It was also a requirement of the Walvis Bay Municipality Council's conditions of sale for an EIA and ECC.</p>

<p>Participant: What is the project all about? Is it a Walvis Bay Municipality initiative or Government project?</p>	<p>This is private project a high-density residential development and is called “Fisherman’s Village” on a 5 ha portion of Erf 5757 Kuisebmond. The total size of Erf 5757 Kuisebmond is about 15 ha, so “Fisherman’s Village” will effectively cover about a third of the area. (Locality Map and Layout Plans were distributed)</p> <p>As a social responsibility to ensure the provision of reliable and affordable housing, Venmar Fishing (Pty) Ltd, a local company, intends to partially develop Erf 5757 for affordable housing.</p> <p>The Walvis Bay Council approved to sell a 5-hectare portion of Erf 5757 Kuisebmond for the affordable housing project in Kuisebmond. The plan is to establish 330 units on 2.5 ha portion as the first phase.
