


Two of the suspects were arrested in connection with elephant poaching and/or trafficking cases.

During operations, police also seized one firearm and four rounds of ammunition.

### Elephant tusks, porcupine skins

At Rundu, two Angolan nationals were arrested on 7 May for being in possession of six elephant tusks, a kudu skin and 112 porcupine skins. Daniel and Jobe Kambinda were charged with contravening the Controlled Wildlife Products and Trade Act.

In a separate incident at Menias, Brian Mangimba was arrested on 8 May for contravening the Arms and Ammunition Act. He was allegedly found in possession of a shotgun and ammunition.

His nationality has not been confirmed.

### **Poaching gang**

Meanwhile, four suspects believed to be part of a rhino poaching gang were granted N\$5 000 bail each on 6 May.

The case dates back to 2018.

Aldrian Masule Musisanyani, Mishake Lemmy Muhinda, Liebelo Eric Manja and Dominic Mitanimiyi Shando appeared in the Outjo Magistrate's Court.

The matter was postponed for further investigation to 19 August. In September 2018, Manja and Musisanyani were arrested at a roadblock at Divundu after they were allegedly found in possession of three pieces of rhino horn taken from a freshly killed animal, as well as an illegal firearm. Muhinda was also implicated in the matter. The rhino horn pieces were taken from the same animal.

## Motorists defy passenger restrictions

While the two Kavango regions have enforced limitations regarding the number of passengers in vehicles, motorists in some parts of Oshana and Oshikoto are defying the state of emergency restrictions and continue to load the maximum number of passengers in their vehicles.

This is attributed to the absence of checkpoints between some towns and villages.

Another contributing factor is said to be the loss of income taxi drivers are suffering due to transporting fewer passengers per trip. Government this week approved a temporary 15% bus and taxi fare hike to counter this loss. For a single journey in a taxi, this translates to an increase from N\$12 to N\$13.80. Long-distance prices

### **Overloading**

The overloading of passengers has mostly been observed on the B1 road between Ondangwa and Omuthiya, where seven-seater vehicles and taxis are packed to

capacity. Under the current regulations, a five-seater sedan is only allowed to carry three passengers, while a seven-seater is limited to carrying four passengers.

Bakkies travelling inland are also regularly spotted with more than the allowed number of passengers onboard. When contacted for comment, police inspector-general Sebastian Ndeitunga said he has not received any reports of drivers defying passenger restrictions, but added he will contact regional commanders in this regard. "I have to check with regional com-

manders and instruct them to see to it that the regulations are enforced, to ensure there is no chance of spreading the coronavirus," he

### Football matches taking place

Namibian Sun also learnt that football activities are taking place in communities, despite the ban on public gatherings.

Football matches took place at Oshinyadhila in Ongwediva and at Omuntele in the Oshikoto Region. Ndeitunga expressed his disappointment. The police chief said people should not expect the police to force them comply with the state of emergency regulations, as it is every citizen's responsibility to assist in the fight against the virus. "People should respect the regulations and implement the preventative measures. People should not wait for the police to push them around," Ndeitunga added.

IKE many other tourism establishments, resorts in the Etosha National Park have recorded a significant loss in revenue due to the Covid-19 outbreak. "If you look at the figures of both April 2019 and April 2020, last year, we recorded revenue of N\$2.6 million. But this year, we only received N\$26 000. For now, we are merely surviving from the previous financial year, but this loss in revenue will affect the next financial year and we are worried about how little we may receive from the central government," said Evaristo Nghilai, who is the control chief warden of the Etosha National Park. Nghilai said that the park's operations are heavily reliant on a sufficient budget and lack thereof could have detrimental effects, not only on the conservation of wildlife but also on tourism. Staff working in the part are also responsible for mitigating human-

wildlife conflict, provision of water for wildlife and combating poaching. "The workers need to be paid camping allowance and overtime as well as fuel for the cars. With a limited budget, we may not properly patrol the 800km of the fence. Patrolling is important to tackle poaching," Nghilai said. "If we are forced to ground our activities due to a limited budget, animals will leave the park and destroy crops in the villages."

Without adequate water supply, Nghilai is concerned that some of the animals may die as the park is responsible for pumping water for the animals at the various boreholes. The park is also responsible for the coordination of five concessions in five different regions, namely the King Nehale Conservancy (Oshikoto), Iipumbu Ya Shilongo Conservancy (Oshana), Sheya Uushona Conservancy (Omusati), Ehirovipuka Conservancy (Kunene) and Gobaub Conservancy (Kunene). Due to the pandemic, these community conservancies have been badly affected and this could risk conservation of wildlife that roam around the locality.

"Community conservation will be affected. There are game guards who are employed by the community to look after wildlife like springboks, ostriches and wildebeest and without an income from tourists, they will not operate," said Nghilai. Two of the conservancies had planned to open the operations of their newly built lodges, but because of the pandemic, these plans were halted resulting in significant loss of income for the communities.

As for tourism, Nghilai foresees a bleak future due to the pandemic because the park attracts mainly tourists from Germany, Italy and America, which are among the countries with high Covid-19 cases and deaths. "Conservation is supposed to support itself but with no money coming in from tourism, we may not recover for a very long time," he said.

# Hardap tailors get masks lifeline

Tentailors from the Hardap region received textile materials from the Ministry of Industrialisation and Trade (MIT) to sew masks for sale to the community. The material, which was handed over to the recipients by the regional governor, Salomon April, on Friday, is sponsored by Ramatex. The tailors are expected to sew 1 500 masks to be sold at a price ranging between N\$15 and N\$25. The governor encouraged the tailors to produce decent and quality masks in line with the specifications of the Namibia Standards Institution (NSI). He added that many people in the region do not have masks even though they are required to during stage two state of emergency Covid-19 regulations.

You are helping the poor to help themselves, regard yourself as the fortunate few," said the governor. On behalf of the beneficiaries, Elizabeth Shaanika thanked the ministry for sponsoring them with textiles. "We are obliged of your support in these tough times. With this donation, we don't only uplift our business and take care of our families but we also keep our community from the virus that has hit us from all the world," she said. The textiles will be distributed to SMEs throughout all 14 regions.

# Ohangwena police unearth suspected liquor syndicate

ONHUNO - The Namibian Police in the Ohangwena region on Tuesday unearthed large liquor consignments believed to be a syndicate of supply and sales of alcohol in violation of the state of emergency restrictions.

The state of emergency, declared in the country in March this year due to the coronavirus outbreak, includes a temporary ban on the selling and buying of alcohol.

Warrant Officer Kaume Iitumba of Ohangwena told Nampa four suspects have been apprehended at Helao Nafidi, where the police discovered large volumes of liquor valued at about N\$130 000 on Tuesday.

The consignment was found stored in a garage at a private house at the town's Onhuno suburb, where suspected customers were also allegedly

apprehended whilst buying stock for further distribution elsewhere. Police seized the liquor.

A smaller liquor consignment was at the same time found in a similar fashion at a second private house in the immediate vicinity of the first one and has also been seized.

According to Iitumba, the police also apprehended the driver of a vehicle found packed with cases of beer and confiscated it at Ondobe village, situated some 10 kilometres from Onhuno on the way to Eenhana.

Speaking to Nampa at the scene, one of the suspects denied selling or supplying liquor contrary to the state of emergency restrictions.

"This is my business stock from a depot at Eenhana and I collected it this morning (Tuesday) after receiving a call from them yesterday that I should take it for more space to be created for their new stock," explained the suspect.

Iitumba said the four suspects were fined N\$2 000 each, because the regulation requires such a fine or that they are taken to court to be prosecuted if they fail to pay.

Meanwhile, a woman was arrested yesterday at Ekolola village outside Eenhana after she was found in possession of whiskey sachets and cigarettes, which were reportedly smuggled from Angola into the country. Deputy Commissioner Zacharia Amakali warned the public to refrain from selling prohibited goods during the Covid-19 state of emergency period.

# Fired writer's case reaches labour court

Former Namibia Press Agency (Nampa) freelance writer and columnist Vitalio Angula's dismissal case is due to be heard in the labour court next month.

He will make his appearance on 17 June at the Office of the Labour Commissioner.

Angula saw his contract being terminated last year when he appeared on *One Africa* Television to air his views on the Fishrot scandal during that channel's *It's A Wrap* programme.

On the show, hosted by Erica Gebhardt, Angula said he had a problem with an Icelandic fishing company executive saying Africans were corruptible. He further accused Spanish fishing companies of illegally fishing in African waters, particularly those of Western Sahara.

### Fishrot scandal

Icelandic fishing company Samherji stands accused of paying bribes in exchange for lucrative fishing rights.

The scandal has led to the high-profile resignations of former fisheries minister Bernhardt Esau, former justice minister Sakeus Shanghala CEO James Hatuikulipi. Angula maintains he did not require any consent to air his views and that his contract lawfully.

"I am a freelance iournalist. What is stopping me? I was never introduced as a Nampa employee, but as an independent an-

alyst," Angula said in a recent sit-down with Namibian Sun.

### Risked agency's reputation

In a letter to Angula last November, Nampa's head of editorial services Jata Kazondu wrote that the agency's editorial policy stance had been compromised by his appearance on the broadcast. "You have risked the agency's reputation by taking part in a highly controversial nationally discussed show," the letter read. Angula had been informed that no requests to participate in public debates would be entertained, it stated.

"Your participation in the show was without the prerequisite permission from the news editor or myself. which was a matter that was discussed extensively with you at the coming into force of your stringer con-

"I have previously warned you several times not to take part in such or similar discussions because of your attachment to the agency," Kazondu

# Competition commission uncovers price fixing

Businesses have gone overboard in pricing items desperately needed to keep the coronavirus at bay.

The Namibia Competition Commission says it has received complaints of massive increases on an array of products.

The prices of rice, ginger, oranges, naartjies, hand sanitisers and face masks have report-

The commission conducted an analysis of price exploitation, with prices increasing from 14% to over 1 000% during April and

Forty percent of complaints related to increases on food and consumer items, while 13% related to health and hygiene products,

### Massive increases

A 143% price increase was noted for 1kg of

rice, 267% for oranges and 263% for ginger, while an increase of 52% for 5kg of sugar, 39% for one litre of full cream milk, 27% for 10kg of sugar and 47% for Oshikandela

Even bigger price increases were noted regarding health and hygiene products, with the price for a box of face masks increasing 1 342%, while the price of single face masks increased by 567%. "It can be observed that the price of face

masks, hand sanitisers and immune-boosting products such as oranges, naartjies and raw ginger all saw huge price increases.

"Some of these products are unaffected by supply chain challenges and are therefore not subject to supply shortages," the commission said.

### **Retailers to blame**

Big retailers are accused of having adjusted the prices of their products, according to the

These include big names like Spar, Pick n Pay, Woermann Brock and Shoprite-Checkers, it noted.

Thirty-six percent of the complaints it received were against Spar supermarkets, 21% against OK Foods Stores and 15% against pharmacies including Dischem, while 13% of the complaints were against Pick n Pay.

Clicks, Shoprite-Checkers and Woermann Brock accounted for 5% of the com-

### **Potential investigation**

The commission said it would assess the allegations, but cautioned that complaints received did not imply that the retailers were guilty of price fixing.
"The commission will in due time make

a decision to proceed with formal investigations against those implicated with due regard to the procedures set out in the Competition Act and the envisaged price direc-

Complaints regarding essential products will be afforded priority, it added.


