The Environmental Management Plan submitted is sufficient as it made provisions of the environmental management concerning the project's activities. From this perspective regular environmental monitoring and evaluations on environmental performance should be conducted. This Ministry reserves the right to attach further legislative and regulatory conditions during the operational phase of the project. From this perspective, I issue the clearance with the following conditions; (a) Hazardous and medical wastes should not be disposed at this site, (b) Wastes dumped along the access road to the site be removed and disposed within the fenced area, (c) Proper access road should be in place to allow easy access to the site by waste management operators.

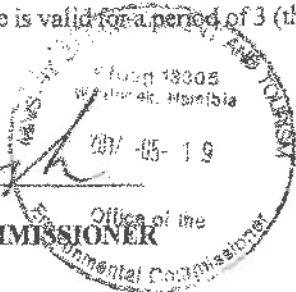
