

Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhar's government has approved the creation of a company to fast-track development of critical infrastructure, with around US\$2.6 billion in initial financing.

The company, Infra-Co, will be one of the top infrastructure finance entities in Africa and will be wholly dedicated to Nigeria's infrastructure development, the statement said.


