**The following conditions apply to this Consent:**

- a. Once significant findings of minerals are found, a full field survey is recommended, before actual mining can start, due to other rock art sites associated with the area.
- b. that the activity authorized by the consent be supervised by a person with appropriate professional qualifications or experience in the identification and conservation of heritage resources.
- c. Continuous Community Consultation and further research is recommended since the exploration area is known for rock art sites.
- d. The National Heritage Council should assess the proposed development, on proponents' costs and once annually, and submit a comprehensive report.
- e. that Namibian citizens, especially members of the local community in and around the project area, be engaged in the activity authorized by the consent for the purpose of identification of heritage resources in the project area as well as of receiving professional training.
- f. The proponent to provide report back to after National Heritage Council every 12 months on compliance with the conditions that will be set out in the consent.
- g. This consent does not exempt the holder from any conditions that may be imposed by owners, hosts or any other relevant authorities in consultation with NHC who have a stake in the project area.
- h. NHC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities related to this consent.
- i. This consent is subject to the provisions of the National Heritage Act (Act 27 of 2004). Should any of the conditions contained herein conflict with the Act; the provisions of the Act as per section 55 (10) shall prevail.
- j. This consent is renewable, upon submission of an application at least two months before the current consent lapses.
- k. A desktop research may be sufficient for EPLs, however NHC reserve the right to request for detailed Scoping including field survey should need arise that areas are to be sampled as well as for all mining claims.
