

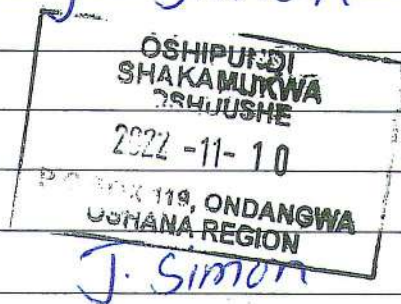

1.1 The player was made by: Mm Ndinelaio Haininga

Welcoming Remark was done by Hon. Gerson Hannu Kapenda the Chairperson of the committee.

1.2 The introduction of participants was done by all.

1.3 Structure and functions of the CDC body by: Mr. Jatileni Fillemon

CDC stands for Constituency Development Committees, for the effective coordination of the planning and development of the region at the constituency level, there shall be established a CDC in every constituency. It shall comprise of not less than seven (7) and not more than (17) members

1.3.1 A Constituency Development Committees shall consist of-

- a) The Chairperson who is also the Constituency Councilor for the area
- b) Two members of the recognized traditional authorities (headmen) in the area
- c) One representative of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in the area
- d) One representative of Community Based Organizations (CBOs) in the Area
- e) A representative of government services providers in the area in respect of each sector.
- f) Three persons with disabilities representing persons with disabilities in the constituency.
- g) Two youth members representing the youth in the constituency, one of whom shall be a female.
- h) At least 1/3 of the members of the constituency Development Committee shall be women and men
- i) The members of the CDC shall elect from amongst themselves secretary who shall be responsible for recording the proceedings of the committee.

1.3 .2Functions of the Constituency Development Committee

The Constituency Development Committee (CDC) shall be responsible for the effective coordination of the planning and development of the region at the constituency level and shall-

- a) Facilitate the establishment of a community-based management information system in the area.
- b) Identify and assess community needs/ problems to be considered for both constituency development proposals/ plans and capital projects
- c) Prepare and evaluate development proposals/ plans for the constituency for submission to the regional council.
- d) Initiate, encourage, support and participate in communities self-help projects and mobilize people, material, financial and technical assistance in relation thereto:
- e) Monitor and evaluate the implementation of the development plans as approved by the regional council and write reports
- f) Assist in the maintenance of law, order and security
- g) Be responsible for monitoring day to day emergency occurrences including natural (e.g. drought) and manmade (e.g. wild fire) disasters and take account of the number of people that would be affected by such emergence occurrences.
- h) Serve as the communication channel between the regional council and people in the constituency.

He mentioned that the Act 05 November 2015 states that a CDC body shall meet (4) time a year. And unemployed members should be awarded N\$ 100.00 for transport allowance as per meeting they will attend.

6. Poverty Eradication committee

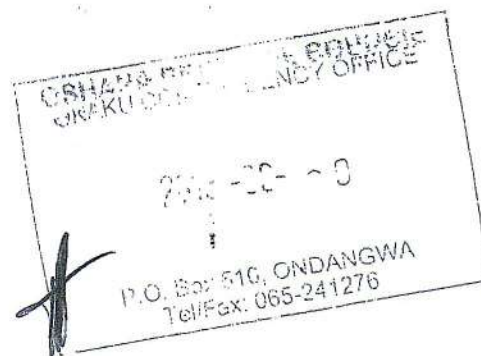

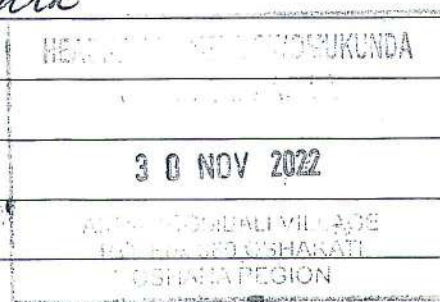

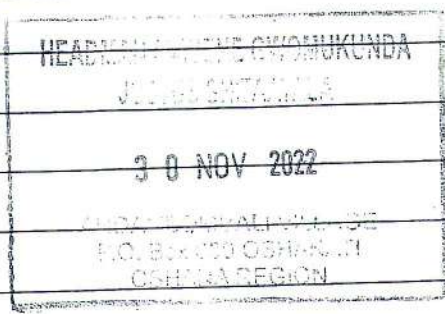

2. Welcoming Remarks

Hon. Edmund Iishuwa, the Regional Councilor made the opening remarks and thanked all the CDC members for taking their time to attend the third CDC meeting. He also requested them to give their views and inputs in short in order to finish on time.

4. Adoption of agenda

The Chairperson took the participants through the meeting's agenda. Ms. Hilma Aukongo moved for the adoption of agenda and seconded by Mr. Jason Shikongo.

5. Announcements

5.1 Proclaimed Roads in Okatana Constituency

- The house was informed that there are four proclaimed roads in the Constituency namely, DR 4103 from Okatana Circle via Amutanga - Onanime, DR 4104 from DR 3609 Oshakati – Omungwelume road - Iiviyongo Combined School, DR 4106 from MR 92 Oshakati – Oshikuku road via Emono Combined School, via Iiviyongo Combined School – Okamwandi, and DR 4107 from DR 3671 Okatana – Onamutayi road via Omusheshe Combined School, Oupumako Combined School to MR 120 Okatana – Endola road. These roads are proclaimed and need to be graveled when funds made available in the near future.
- The road which is supposed to be from Okatana Circle – Amutanga need to be re-aligned to go through Epyenene - Amutanga because it will be very costly to fill up the pond which is from the circle through the pond.
- DR 4103 access road from MR 120 Okatana – Endola road to Okakwiyu Kindergarten needs to be extended up to Amutanga Combined School.
- There is also a road which passes through Okatana Constituency namely DR 3643 Onamutuku – Onkani road, this road is one of the prioritized roads in Oshana Region that need to be re-graveled, but due to financial constrains it remains one of the roads that need to be considered.

5.2 Okatana Constituency Maps

The CDC members were provided with the Constituency Maps in order to know the boundaries between Okatana Constituency and other Constituencies, also to know the villages in the Constituency in terms of services delivery and development.

6. Review and certification of the previous Minutes of the Ordinary Constituency Development Committee Meeting (30th August 2022)

Minutes of the previous meeting were confirmed as a true reflection of what was discussed at that meeting. Mr. Jason Shikongo moved and Mr. Menas Engelbert seconded.

7. Presentations

7.1 Report on Projects 2022/2023 implementation

Minor Capital Project – the house was informed that the money allocated to this project has been used to pay for the electricity for Oshinitolipo Locality at Onanime Growth Centre for the amount of N\$ 225, 783.08 which could not be fully paid from the previous financial year 2021/2022. NORED payment is now fully paid and only waiting for NORED to go and electrify the locality.

The remaining funds for Minor Capital Project (N\$ 80,151.92) was meant to construct the access bridge between Amutanga and Ikelo. Inspection was done but it was realized that the area is too long and deep, the remaining funds cannot cater to construct the bridge, unless it can be funded into two financial years for it to be completed.

It was also stated that it was agreed from the previous meeting for the remaining funds from the Minor Capital Projects to be used to procure water pipes for Chief Amweelo water pipeline in Ondjodjo and Haimbondi Amukoto, but due to insufficient funds this could not be done.

Food Cash for Work Project – The house was informed that the allocated funds of N\$ 38,461.53 was used to provide potable water to Okatana Locality residents whereby food items for the amount of N\$ 21, 238.72 were procured while the water pipes were provided by the Division of Oshana Rural Water Supply. Some money was used to procure water pipes for the amount of N\$ 5,622.75 and the remaining amount is N\$ 11,600.06

Resolution No. 01-CDC-03/11/2022

The house resolved that the remaining funds from the Food Cash for Work Programme to be used to procure water pipes for the residents of Ondjodjo to rehabilitate their water pipeline.

7.2 Presentation by Oshana Directorate of Education

- The house was informed that Oshakati Circuit is divided into two Constituencies, Okatana and Oshakati West. It was stated that their mandate is to train and educate for the national development. Their services foster the effective implementation of the Namibian constitution – Article 20, Vision 20230, National Development Plan (NDP5), education Act, Sector policies, formal education Circulars and directives.
- Oshakati Circuit consists of thirty three (33) schools in total, whereby twelve (12) of them are Primary Schools, fifteen (15) Combined Schools, and six (6) Secondary Schools. Among those schools two are private, namely Cabatana Private School and Oshakati Private School.
- Oshakati Circuit has also achieved to establish two new schools, Oshana School of computing and Oshakati Private School and was awarded as the best Circuit on NSSCAS and grade 11 results.
- The house was also informed that the Circuit has received donations from various good Samaritans such as, the establishment of Oshana School of computing by RANI Trading,

the School bus for Emono Combined School by Debmarine, Teaching / learning stationeries to Emono Combined School from Mr. Mondestus Namupolo.

- It was also stated that Okaku KaNangula residents has been granted a portion of land by Uukwambi Traditional Authority for establishing a new public school. The Circuit has met with the community to inform them and give them all the information regarding the rules, regulations and factors involved and need to be followed when establishing a new school.
- It was also stated that the circuit is facing challenges such as uneconomical schools, high enrolment in some schools due to learners leaving rural schools with few leaners, limited resources, some parents are not really involving themselves in supporting their children. There is also a challenge of students involving in drugs and alcohol abuse and drop outs to mostly teenage pregnancies. Late admission applications is also giving challenges to the Circuit.
- It was emphasized that education is a shared responsibility between the Government and all stakeholders, therefore we cannot leave it in the hands of the Government alone. The Circuit is therefore appealing to all stakeholders who are willing to help with any kind of assistance to make contact with the Office.
- Information was also shared on how the abandoned school buildings can be used such as Police sub-stations and Health outreach points, because there are already resources available like electricity, water and toilets facilities.

7.3 Presentation by Oshana Division of Lands

The house was provided with the following information from the Division of Lands

- Inequality of access to and ownership of land in Namibia is widely regarded as having contribute to widespread poverty in the country.
- Inherently the country has two land regimes namely, the commercial and communal land sectors.
- At Independence in 1990, Namibia inherited a skewed land distribution pattern as a result of the past colonial policies.
- Out of the 69.6 million hectares available for agricultural purposes, 36.2 million hectares were deemed freehold land referred to as commercial land and was occupied by 4200 farming households
- Whilst, some 33.4 million hectares were deemed communal or rather non-freehold land which provides for the livelihood of some 70% of the Namibia population.
- Then, the Ministry of Land Reform was established and mandated with the responsibility to develop policies and administer legislation on land reform,
- The Government convened the National Conference on Land Reform and the Land question on 24 June – 01 July 1991 known as “The Land Conference of July 1991”

- The first National Land Conference agreed on 24 consensual Resolutions and on a burning issue discussed was the ancestral rights question or access to ancestral land, however due to its complexity, the conference reached a general consensus that ancestral land claims would not be allowed in Namibia.
- The mandate of the Ministry is to administer and ensure equitable access to Namibia's land resource as derived from the following documents in the Namibian Constitution, Article 95.
- National Land policy of 1998
- National Resettlement Policy of 2001
- Commercial Land Reform Act, 1995 (Act No. 6 of 1995)
- Communal Land Reform Act, 2002 (Act No. 5 of 2002)

The house was also given information on the Resettlement Process as follows:

- It is conducted in conjunction with Ministry of Justice to scrutinize and Gazetting of the advertisement notice.
- Regional Council Offices assist the Ministry in distributing the application forms and refer completed forms to the Ministry for processing.
- The advert is placed in local print media particularly New Era and Namibian Sun newspapers, and runs for 30 calendar days.
- Applicants are then invited to apply for a farming unit in his/her area of preference and submit duly completed application form in any of the 14 Regions.
- Completed application forms are submitted at the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform country-wide for processing.
- The application should be signed before the commissioner of Oath

The house was also informed about the qualifying Criteria for Resettlement

- Ability to farm and have agricultural background
- Prepare to hold land under leasehold and relinquish Agricultural land rights elsewhere
- Able to support cost recovery
- Able to utilize land productively
- Adhere to the conditions stipulated in the leasehold agreement

Applicants must be:

- A Namibia citizens
- At least 18 years of age
- Have not more than 150 LSU or 800 SSU
- Must not own land elsewhere, other than for residential purposes or customary land rights

7.4 Presentation by Directorate of Agriculture Production, Extension and Engineering Services

a) **Dry Land Crop Production Programme (DCPP)** - The house was informed that the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform is implementing rain fed agronomic subsidy programmes such as the Dry Land Crop Production Programme (DCPP). The Government provide ploughing services to the target group through Government owned tractors and use of private tractors as follows:

- Ploughing by GRN tractor - N\$ 250.00 per hectare
- Ploughing by private tractor - N\$ 350.00 per hectare
- Ploughing by Draught Animal - N\$ 250.00 per hectare

The Government also provide improved seeds to farmers at a subsidized rates as follows:

- Mahangu 2kg - N\$ 10.30 (Maximum 5 Sackets per household)
- Maize 10 kg - N\$ 250.00 (Maximum 50kg per household)
- Beans 2kg - N\$ 12.00 (Maximum 5 Sackets per household)

In order to improve soil fertility and productivity of the land, Government use to provide fertilizer to farmers at a subsidized rates as follows:

- NPK – N\$ 210.75
- MAP – N\$ 232.40
- LAN – N\$ 137.35
- Urea – N\$ 151.18
- AS – N\$ 117.67

b) **National Horticulture Support and Poultry** – Information was shared with the house on the purpose of the project which is to ensure sustainable access, availability, use of essential farm inputs and capacity building of the small-scale horticulture producers. The project targets to benefit small-scale horticulture producers through subsidy and technical services targeting communal and urban areas horticulture producers.

- Government will provide 50% subsidy on horticulture seeds, and 50% will from the beneficiary.
- Government will provide 60% subsidy on fertilizer, beneficiary is 40%
- Government will provide 50% subsidy on pesticides and herbicides
- Provision of subsidy on irrigation materials, shade nets and packaging materials will also be provided, whereby the Government will subsidize producers at 65%, while the beneficiary will contribute with 35%.
- Provision of subsidy on production stock, equipment and input for the poultry producers is also available whereby they can be provided with chicks, hens, cocks and housing materials.

c) **N-SHEP Project** – The house was informed about the N-SHEP organization from Japan which is collaborating with the Ministry of Agriculture Production, Extension and Engineering Services in Poultry Farming. In Oshana Region they have trained Poultry Farmers in Uuvudhiya, Okaku, Uukwiyuushona and Okatana Constituencies.

- In Okatana Constituency this organization has offered training to four beneficiaries by giving them information, empower them with knowledge and skills regarding poultry farming. This organization is not providing any material but their aim is just to strengthen and upgrade the poultry farmers in order to get income and fight against poverty.

The beneficiaries from Okatana Constituency are as follows:

1. Antonia Selestinus - Otuwala Village
2. Tilanus Shilumbu - Iiwiyongo Village
3. Hileni Amagola - Onampinda Village
4. Emiliana Nakalondo - Emono Village

8. Reports by Hon. Councillor

8.1 Construction of Earth Dams and Traditional Wells

Earth Dams – The house was informed that the two earth dams agreed and submitted to be constructed in the Constituency are located at Oupumako and Andambombali villages. The Headman and Headwoman of the villages where the earth dams will be constructed have submitted their authorization letters at the Constituency Office.

Traditional Wells – It was stated in the meeting that the Constituency Office was requested to submit a list of traditional wells to be improved by installing hand or solar power-water pump. Those wells must be agreed to become a public property. The wells submitted are located at the following villages:

1. Emono Village
2. Amutanga Village
3. Omusheshe Village
4. Onampolo Village

8.2 Scaling up Food Production /Food Security

It was stated in the meeting that Oshana Regional Council have signed a memorandum of understanding with the World Food Programme Organization for each Constituency to provide a portion of land for a size of 1 hectare and above for food production/food security purposes. The Constituency office has submitted six portion of lands to be used for food Production in the Constituency and they are as follows:

It was realized that the submitted lands are too small and each Constituency is only expected to identify one portion of land for a size of one hectare and above, therefore the only land which can be used is **Iipopo yAangolo Forestry Project land** because it is big enough.

8.3 Community Led Total Sanitation (CLTS)

The house was informed that the implementation of rural sanitation will now focus on mobilizing communities to eliminate open defecation in selected villages. The rural toilets will still be provided to the senior citizens, people living with disability and vulnerable residents.

These rural toilets will be constructed with the collaboration with Ongwediva Rural Development Centre whereby they will provide all the materials needed for the construction of the toilets. The contractors will be from the respective villages and the bricks will be procured from local bricks makers from the identified villages.

During 2022/2023 financial year the Constituency Office is allocated with **16 toilets** and will be provided to the following beneficiaries from the three villages: **Andambombali, Onampolo and Ombuga yAmunyoko.**

8.4 Malaria Control Programme in the Constituency

The house was informed that the annual spraying activity for Malaria Control Programme has been completed in the Constituency. The activity use to take place in the villages where cases of malaria were detected by the Ministry of Health and Social Service in Oshana Region. 8.5 Electrification of Oshinitolipo Locality - Onanime Growth Centre

The house was informed that the payment for the Electricity for Oshinitolipo Locality at Onanime village has been fully paid. This is the project which was funded during the last financial year 2021/2022 through the Minor Capital Project. The payment of N\$ 225, 783.08 was paid to NORED and community will only be waiting for their locality to be electrified.

8.6 Construction of Water pipeline at Okatana Growth Centre

The house was informed that the residents of Okatana Locality have been provided with potable water through Food Cash for Work Programme 2022/2023 financial year. The community now access to potable water.

8.7 Update on Registration of Stateless and Undocumented Persons

The house was informed that the Constituency Office has received an update letter from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security through the Office of the Governor of Oshana Region with the aim of updating the Region on the list of Stateless and undocumented persons that was received by their Ministry.

It was stated that the activity to regularize the status of Stateless and undocumented person has six steps:

- Step 1: Registration of stateless and undocumented person in the Region (complete)
- Step 2: Development and testing of functional register on National Population Registration System (ongoing)
- Step 3: Validating all information received (ongoing – current step)
- Step 4: Application for citizenship and birth registration process
- Step 5: Enrollment of validated individuals in the functional register
- Step 6: Regularization in accordance with the new legislation of stateless and undocumented persons respectively.

Currently the Ministry is at step 3, whereby they are busy confirming all the information they have received. Update on the matter will be provided through the office of the Governor.

9. Matters for Discussion

9.1 Crossing Points: between Amutanga – Iikelo, Onamula – Onepungu, Emono - Iiwiyongo, Onanime – Onangodhi and Epanya – Iikelo.

The house was informed that the above crossing points were requested by the community from the mentioned villages during the public meetings which were conducted by Hon. Councilor. The access bridge between Amutanga – Iikelo was supposed to be funded during 2022/2023 financial year but due to the fact that the distance is too long, the amount allocated for the Programme is not sufficient and this project could not be implemented.

The Constituency need to put in place ideas on how all this crossing points can be constructed in the near future as these are people who use to suffer during the rainy season, they are in need of this crossing point for their villages to be linked together order to be access to all services like education, pension and church services.

Resolution No. 01-CDC-03/11/2022

The house resolved that the affected villages to be provided with crossing points in the near future when funds made available.

9.2 Short distance Access Road: Omusheshe – Oupumako

Information was given to the house that there is an access road from Omusheshe – Oupumako which need to be graveled. This road need to be constructed to serve the community at the affected villages for the residents to be able to move freely from one village to another.



The house resolved that the access road Omusheshe - Oupumako to be considered in the near future when funds becomes available.



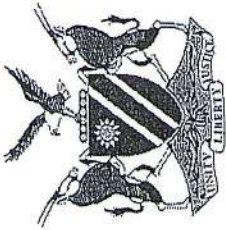



The following projects have been visited by the members indicated above on said date.

1. Om laike Pig Farming Project

Findings: It situated in Ompundja village and pigpen located outside of the house, where we found 17 pigs and one (1) piglet. The Project Chairperson indicated that he used to sell pork and live pigs to the local market. And due to high demand from the community he want to expand the pigpen.

2. Onawa poultry farming Project-

Findings: It situated at Oshipumbu-Shomugongo.The chicken Coop is located outside house and very small. We found 87 chickens, 80 chicks and more than 50 doves. There are also 80 layers kept inside in the room in the house. The chairperson indicated that they have local markets where they sell their eggs, meat and live chickens.

Therefore **Om laike Pig Project** and **Onawa Poultry Farming Project** found viable and they should be supported for this 2022/2023 Financial year.

WAY FORWARD



The opening prayer was done by Tk Julius Namutenya.

2. WELCOMING REMARKS

Honorable Councillor thanked members for leaving their daily responsibilities to come and attend the meeting. He further called the meeting to order.

3. FINALIZATION OF AGENDA

The agenda was adopted by Mr Hubertus Uusiku seconded by Mr Esko Haikuti with no additional items.

4. FINALISATION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES AND MATTERS ARISING

Previous minutes were rectified and certified as a true reflection of what was discussed in the previous meeting.

5. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES OF THE 4TH NOVEMBER 2021

5.1 Minor Capital Project (Electricity at Ombili location)

Ombili location electricity transformer has been installed and waiting for connection.

5.2 Rural development project (FCFW at Akunihole Center)

The shade has been constructed and awaiting community to construct the foundation.

5.3 Rural Sanitation

All eight (8) toilets constructed and handed over to owners.

6. NEW MATTERS

6.1 MINOR CAPITAL PROJECT FOR 2022/2023FY

Honourable Councillor informed the meeting that the budget for 2022/2023FY is not yet out and requested the house to give its proposal on the projects to be done once the budget is available.

- Firstly, once the budget is received, the money borrowed from Ompundja Constituency amounting to N\$20 000 should be paid back with the interest of 15% as a token of appreciation.
- Secondly, the house proposed the upgrading of soccer and netball fields in the Constituency to be the first priority in 2022/2023FY budget.
- Thirdly, Katito location electricity project to be the second priority if the budget permit.

6.2 Developmental proposals for 2023/2024 FY

The house recommends the unsuccessful developmental projects submitted in 2021/2022FY to be resubmitted for consideration in 2023/2024 FY.

The project includes:

- Construction of Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare Office
- Construction of Ministry of Agriculture and Land Reform Office.
- Construction of Gravel Road from Eheke through Olulongo to the main road – B1
- Upgrading of The System – Eheke gravel road to a bitumen standard
- Excavating of Earth dams –(Amusa village, Omagongati Village, Okathitu village and Ashaaga Village)

6.3 Identification of seven beneficiaries of Mahangu storage facilities

Honourable Councillor informed members that the Office has received a request from Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform to select seven beneficiaries through CDC to benefit from subsidized grain storage facilities. The government will pay 65% while the beneficiaries are expected to pay 35% of the total cost of the grain storage.

6.4 Briefing from the Ministry of Gender Official

Mr Haikuti from the Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare made the following announcement:

- The application forms for income generating projects will be ready by Friday of 1st April 2022 and each Constituency will get 10 forms
- Applications will be open to all interested projects owners and does not have age limit

Mr Haikuti further informed members that the Ministry of Gender and Child Welfare has been requested to build a Community Development Centre in the Constituency and requested the house to assist in identifying the place where such kindergarten will be built.

The kindergarten will consist of three classes, One class for 4-5 years' children, Second class for children from 2-3 years and last one for children from 0-1 years.

Criteria for identifying best possible area for the kindergarten are as follow:

- The number of children in that particular area
- The kindergarten should have land ownership letter from headman

The house nominated three (3) committee members to do the feasibility study at the following centers Amunganda, Olulongo, Elago, Ehangano and Oikango to determine the suitable area to construct the mentioned kindergarten.

The committee includes **Honourable Councillor, Mr Haikuti and Mr Shimpanda**

6.5 Briefing on Settlement Development

Mrs Ndove the Control Administrative Officer at Eheke Settlement informed the house that the Road Administration fund allocates fund of **N\$1 038 673.45** to Regional Councils for rehabilitating roads in Settlement areas. Each Regional Council split the fund among the settlement within their region. Oshana Regional Council have received the fund, and Eheke Settlement have informed the Head of Engineering / technical services division to do an analysis of infrastructure that needs to be rehabilitated and to determine the cost as well.

- For the mean time Eheke Settlement has identified the bridge between the cemetery and Eheke parish for rehabilitation.

- A certain businessman would like to construct a filling station in the Settlement area. The plan has been approved and the outstanding environmental impact assessment and evaluation was scheduled to be conducted before Easter holiday.
- The Settlement has 113 plots, among these plots some were allocated and taken back due to non-payment or plots are either situated at water stand still areas while some are in the process to be allocated.
- Settlement Office submitted a motion to the Council seeking for permission to have an informal settlement area. The aim is to utilize an area that is surveyed and plots are demarcated and it will also be serviced.

6.6 Constituency and Settlement Committes meetings schedule

Ms Nashongo shared the meetings schedule and informed members that the schedule will be shared and invitations will still be send out to members.

- 5. FOOD FOR WORK** - Omagongati Community Shade

2. OPENING AND WELCOME REMARKS

Mr. Toivo Iyambo, the acting chairperson thanks the participants for avail time to attend meeting and the same time welcomed all the members present. He continuing by introducing the newly appointment member Mr. Jonas Ambunda, the traditional authority representative who replaced late Johannes Hailonga.

3. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Mr. Nangombe moved to adopt the agenda seconded by Mr. Erastus Shilongo.

4. CORRECTION OF THE PREVIOUS MINUTES

The minutes were corrected with few changes.

5. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING

5.1 Namibia Statistic Agency

The house wanted to know more clarity on the matter of Namibia Statistic Agency, therefore the acting chairperson briefed them on the matter that it is very important to know the population of the constituency for development purpose, therefore, he further pointed out that during the traditional and Centre leaders meeting held a week ago in essence leaders were advised to update their statistic as from time to time.

5.2 Minor Capital

The Chairperson updated the Committee members that the Constituency has received an amount of 270300.00 earmarked for community projects. However, the fund for this financial year is planned to complete the crossing point at Okau - kamasheshe. Mr. Nakale suggested that there is a need for the Constituency Development Committee members to visit all projects funded by the Regional Council.

5.3 MTEF

The house informed that the three projects have been submitted for further consideration namely; gravel road from Uukwangula via Constituency office to Uukwiyyongwe Combined School, Omega – Oshihenge gravel road and Negumbo earth dam.

5.4 Youth Garden

Mr. Iyambo wanted to know how far with the proposal of the youth garden, Ms. Immanuel one of the youth representative replied that the Youth forum committee members is planned to convene a meeting in order to discuss the matter.

6. NEW MATTERS

6.1 Rural Sanitation

Mr. Iyambo informed the house that the Constituency will receive 8 toilets as per the population of the people residing in the rural areas, the beneficiaries of the toilets are from the following villages; Okau – kamasheshe, Oshitowa and Oshikolongondjo respectively. The officials from the Regional council, Rural water Supply, Sanitation & Coordination and Ministry of Health are in the above villages to sensitize information regarding the important of homestead owning the toilet. Mr. Nakale wanted to know if the people living with disability are also taken care during the program. Mr. Iyambo reacted that they are also part of the program, unless there is none in the above villages.

6.2 FOOD/CASH FOR WORK

The Acting chairperson update the committee that the budget for Food/Cash for work was supposed to be utilized on the construction of the crossing point at Uuthilindindi but in the process we found that the N\$ 32 000.00 is too little to cater the construction of crossing point, therefore the proposal has made for the money to be utilized on procured of water pipeline in order to replace the water pipeline at Okau-kamasheshe, and the process has already kick off.

6.3 Harvesting of water

The Committee discuss the need of earth dam, after a long deliberation, the following earth dams have been identified.

1. Uusilo earth dam in Uuthilindindi
2. Negumbo earth dam between Okau and Oshuulo
3. Oshana sha Pembe in Okamule

Recommendation: The Committee recommended the following earth dam to be constructed and rehabilitation.

1. Negumbo earth dam
2. Oshana sha Pembe

7. ANY OTHER MATTER

7.1 Requesting community project


Mr. Nakale felt that there is a need for the constituency to procure Marula juice machine earmarked people living with disability in order to generate income. Mr. Iyambo informed the house that anyone interesting for a certain project should apply so that the application will be discussed at this platform for consideration.

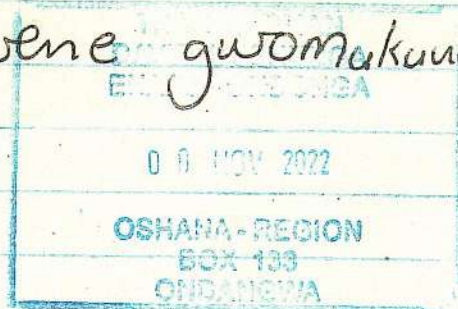

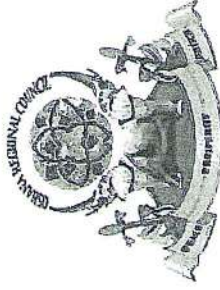
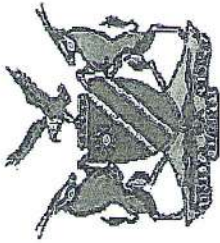
Farmer wish the government to provide big pipelines and reservoirs between western areas of Okuma and Okadhiya-kambeke River where there is better grazing but no water available.

The lowest percentage in all constituencies of Oshana Region. I therefore hereby would like your good office to commit budget for the below mentioned earth dam as we are reaching very close to the current end of financial year.

1. *Dam between Yinakulu yomadhiya and Okuma with highest carrying capacity of more than 15 000 cubic of water.*
2. *Dam between Okasheshete and Omapale with carrying capacity of about 15 000 cubic of water*
3. *Dam at Southern East of Oshitunhu with carrying capacity of about 12 000 cubic of water*
4. *Dam at North of Oshikushiithilonde with carrying capacity of about 12 000 cubic of water*
5. *Dam at South of Ekulolyananzi with with capacity of more tha 15 000 cubic of water*
6. *Dam at lipinge Itamalo with carrying capacity of more than 15 000 cubic of water*

The chairperson welcomed all members and appreciated their presence.

5. Approval of the Agenda

The agenda was approved with no additional items. It was then moved by Jona Itengula seconded by Mr Japhet Ananias.

6. Certification of minutes of previous meeting

The minutes were certified and few corrections were made for true reflection of the discussions. It was then moved by Aili Namulo seconded by Mr Amakutsi

7. Matter arising from previous minutes

7.1 Olupale Lodge

The leaseholder is yet to be issued to the Investor and the Land board needs to measure the 100 hectare of land which was approved.

Consultations were made for Namwater to map out the water pipeline from Omapale pipeline to Olupale before the rainy season.

7.2 Sanitation

Uuvudiya constituency have got 8 toilets to be constructed in the identified Villages (Uuvudhiya village and Omusati gwaNiita Village) whereby 4 toilets will be constructed in each village. After the meetings done by Rural service which is the custodian of Rural sanitation projects it was said that the Contractors and brick suppliers should be from the two identified villages preferably. In addition to that contractors who are willing to apply and meet the minimum requirements should fill in the applications forms at the constituency office not later than 18 November 2022.

7.3. Oponona Consulting Room

Mr. Jona Itengula informed the members that the Oponona consulting room which is under Iipumbu yaShilongo Conservancy is done and it now to be handed over to the MOHSS and he was seeking for the right channel. It was then resolved that the conservancy should write a letter to the Hon. Councillor and the councillor with his recommendations forward the letter to the MOHSS Head of outreach programs in Oshana Region.

8. New Matters

8.1 Crossing Point

The chairperson informed the members that the Christoph crossing point which was being underway is currently on stopped. The contractor will be paid according to the percentages of workdone. Any funds left next step will be taken in order to finish the work or otherwise the constituency will ask the Regional Council to source some funds to finish off the work.

It is at the unfortunate time where the rain is about to come and the members are afraid as this will affect the community, therefore the members request for this process to be done as soon as possible in order to ressure the community during rainy water and flood.

8.2 Project 2022/23

Food for Cash Food Work

The procurement of materials of the extension of Lilunga yAmutenya pipeline extension is said to be done , the office is only waiting for the materials to be collected from the supplier.

Electricification of Oponona nearby location

The chairperson said that different quotations received were not clear and the house needed clarity on the measurement and the amount of money at each point.

The members requested the chairperson to inform NORED to come redo the measurements accompanied by an official from the office.

8.3 Agricultural Project

The chairperson informed the house that the Regional Council in collaboration with UNAM Ogongo and Ministry of Agriculture, requested constituencies to identify private or public land which can be turned into seasonal planting in order to improve food security in the Region.

Uuvudhiya identified to projects, one in Engombe and the other one in Omapopo village. With this initiative 50 % of the produce will go to Region and 50 % to the community.

The house only encourage the community to work hard and requested for the community to be given basic training and funds for them to be able to run the projects well.

After a few delibration the members welcomed the RC intitative and requested them to atleast come up with the way of harvesting water so that in future these project will run on the yearly basis

8.4 Report by CDC members on Investment Opportunities Identification and Statistics.

Mr Itengula gave a report as to what was the main focus of the conference and taken the members through on what the business ideas they were putting in place which may attracts investor to invest in the region , such as greenscheme projects, Rice projects, tourist attractions and Earthdams etc.

The way forward way then given to regional council to put all ideas together and come up with the proposals. The next conference will be held in 2023 in order to give more ideas on the proposals and input.

The chairperson then inform the members that when the said proposal is done the community consultation should be done especially when it comes to the heritage places.

Mr Itengula emphasized on how the community hampers the development in the constituency and encouraged the CDC members especially the elected committee responsible with business proposals to put more effort on project proposals in order to get fundings from the investors.

On statistics, the feedback was given by Ms. Melania Shilongo who attended the meeting whereby she informed the member that , statistic is said to be done after 10 years and the next statistic will be done in 2023.

She then informed the members according to the report given in the meeting Oshana Region was classified that It has the lowest food supply.

8.5 Human Wildlife conflicts and Wildlife crime projects

Mr Itengula he said this projects are focusing on how to mitigate the conflict between Human and Wildlife animals and how to prevent illegal hunting.

Whereby he informed the members that there is an allocation of USD 6.5 millions for those projects and it is running for 6 years on a quarterly basis.

He then said , the conservency gave a proposal with some different ideas e.g Patrol, earthdams and salty water purification or disselination during rainy season.

After few deliberation on proposal writing to the investor regarding the development of the constituency the house agreed that the committee in place should put more effort on finishing the proposals which will include anything that will benefit the community especially on agriculture and horticulture.

Mr. Amakutsi should be added in the committee responsible with writing the proposal because it was realised that the Farmers were not represented.

Mr.Jona Itengula and Ms. Martha Kahala were selected as the focal people to write the proposal. the meeting on the **16 January 2023** in order to give feedbacks and input from other CDC members

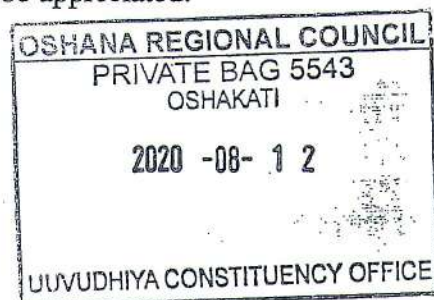
