Their last World Cup appearance came at Mexico 1986, where they finished bottom of their group without scoring.

Cyle Larin and Tajon Buchanan put Canada 2-0 up at half-time before Junior Hoilett and an Adrian Mariappa own goal sealed the victory.

It led to joyous celebrations from the sell-out crowd at BMO Field as Canada clinched World Cup qualification for only the second time.

"We just qualified for the World Cup, this is a legit football country," said Herdman, who last worked in England as an academy coach at Sunderland more than 20

"When I first took over and I said, 'We're going to qualify for the World Cup', I don't think they believed us. I'm happy for them because all of these fans have waited and waited, and hung in with us - and we're going.

"I think this country never believed in us because we've given them nothing to believe in. They believe now.

"This is the time for everyone who led the Canadian women's to get behind football and unite because we can be a powerhouse."

The United States, Mexico, Costa Rica and Panama are all in contention for the final two automatic Concacaf qualification spots for the 2022 World Cup, which starts on 21 November.

Mexico and the US, who face El Salvador and Costa Rica respectively on Wednesday, need only a draw from their final qualification game to book their spots in Qatar.





s people journey through life, it is common for them to reflect on past decisions and actions, often leading to feelings of regret.

This phenomenon has intrigued researchers and psychologists for decades, and there is a growing understanding of the science behind why people experience regret as they grow older.

Regret can be defined as a negative emotion associated with a person's belief that they could have achieved a better outcome if they had chosen differently in the past.

It often arises from unmet expectations, perceived mistakes, or the feeling of wasted opportunities.

Anyone may experience regret about various facets of their lives, including relationships, career choices, educational pursuits, and personal achievements.

One of the key components of regret is memory, particularly the phenomenon of selective recall.

This selective recall can magnify the significance of missed opportunities or poor decisions, intensifying the emotional impact of regret.

According to Ben Meyers and Fabrizio Villatoro, researchers at LongeviQuest, an organisation that verifies the ages of supercentenarians (people who live to 110 or older) worldwide, the oldest individuals have shared their most common regrets.

Meyers, CEO of LongeviQuest, and Villatoro, Latin America research president, have had the opportunity to speak with these remarkable individuals, gathering insights on longevity and the things they wish they had done differently. Meyers noted that many of the centenarians they spoke to had endured incredibly challenging lives, having lived through significant events such as war, the Great Depression, and decolonisation.

Despite this, he pointed out that their regrets were relatable and "pretty human", much like those of the general population.

Working too hard

One common regret expressed by centenarians was not spending enough time with family. Meyers described this as a "typical" regret among the supercentenarians they encountered.

Villatoro added that some regretted life's hardships and world events that disrupted their stability and prevented them from having more children.

Another regret that emerged was working too hard. Villatoro shared the story of Juan Vicente Pérez Mora from Venezuela, the oldest validated person ever at the age of 114

Quality time with loved ones

Mora had wished he had worked less, as he had dedicated his life to hard physical labour on his family's farm.

Villatoro explained that Mora's family had spoken about his regrets of not exploring different career paths, which would have allowed him to spend more time with his loved ones.

This sentiment resonates with findings from previous studies, which indicated that many individuals in hospice and palliative care also regretted prioritising work over family time.

Not travelling more

Not travelling more was another common regret expressed by centenarians. For instance, Evangelista Luisa López, who grew up in Santa Fe province, Argentina, and later moved to Mar del Plata, wished she had travelled more throughout her life.

This sentiment aligns with the findings of Karl Pillemer, a professor of gerontology in medicine at Weill Cornell Medicine. In his book "30 Lessons for Loving: Advice from the Wisest Americans on Love, Relationships, and Marriage", Pillemer highlighted that older Americans also regretted not having travelled more, particularly during their younger years.

Despite the intrinsic challenges associated with regret, ageing also offers the potential for wisdom and self-reflection.

Coping with regret can be a challenging and emotionally taxing experience. However, there are several effective coping mechanisms that individuals can employ to navigate and manage feelings of regret.

Coping strategies

Understanding and implementing these coping strategies can help individuals cultivate resilience, promote self-growth, and ultimately move forward in a constructive and empowered manner.

Reflecting on experiences

Thinking about past experiences can help you see regret as a way to learn and grow, rather than just something negative.

Being kind to yourself

Treating yourself with kindness and understanding, especially when facing challenges or regret, can help you acknowledge mistakes without being too hard on yourself. This can build resilience and improve how you see yourself.

Embracing mindfulness and acceptance

Practising mindfulness, like meditation and deep breathing, can help you stay present and be aware of your thoughts and emotions without being judgmental.

Set realistic expectations

Recognising and managing your expectations is important when dealing with regret. Having realistic expectations and letting go of perfectionism can ease the weight of regret and strengthen your self-acceptance and emotional strength.

Steenkamp outlined the ministry's efforts, including the allocation of principal and head of department positions based on regional needs.

She explained that 723 teachers were allocated across 14 regions, and additional positions would be considered based on future needs.

Responding to the protesters' demands, Steenkamp detailed the allocation of various positions, including administration officers, matrons, and cleaners.

"There was a request for 69 administration officers and all 69 have been appointed. Three libraries were requested and we have allocated the libraries and administration's offices already to the regions," she said.

She emphasised the significant financial commitment, revealing that the ministry would spend N\$295 million in 2024 alone on the employment of educators, covering salaries, bonuses, social security, GIPF contributions, and housing.

Looking ahead, Steenkamp mentioned the creation of new vacancies, with an expenditure of N\$73.9 million in the first three months of the year.

The ministry had faced criticism for allocating 80.3% of its N\$20.3 billion 2023/2024 budget to salaries.

The protests, staged by hundreds of unemployed graduate teachers, called for mass recruitment of teachers nationwide and the full implementation of the teacher-learner ratio policy.

The group expressed frustration over the lack of teaching opportunities in government schools and criticised the Ministry of Basic Education for what they perceived as poor planning.



Louw emphasised the critical role water plays in communities globally, asserting that its scarcity poses a risk to economic, social, and environmental well-being.

He underscored the challenges faced by Namibia, ranking as one of the world's 30 driest countries, with water scarcity being a significant concern.

Particularly in areas like Five Rand and Vergenoeg in Okahandja, water sources are scarce, impacting underprivileged communities.

In October, reports surfaced that residents of Okahandja's informal settlements such as Five Rand had been utilising wastewater from the NamWater industrial pipeline, which flows into the riverbed adjacent to the settlement.

This water was untreated according to NamWater's Chief Strategic Officer Kadiva Hamutumwa.

Hamutumwa emphasised the need for residents to refrain from using this water for anything other than gardening purposes, underscoring its lack of suitability for domestic consumption.

These reports were some of the factors that prompted ABI to invest in the municipality's Water Stewardship initiative, according to the company's plant manager, Choolwe Mudenda

Strategically utilising identified boreholes owned by the Municipality and a nearby water storage facility, this project aims to integrate these resources into the reticulation system.

"These boreholes, in conjunction with an existing reservoir, will be integrated into the reticulation system." ABI Namibia and the Okahandja Municipality formalised their collaboration through signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)," Mudenda said.

She also explained the details of the agreement between ABI and the municipality.

According to her, the comprehensive approach involves water extraction, treatment, and storage, addressing the unique challenges faced by Okahandja.

"This document outlines the terms of the working relationship, the project's objectives, and the respective obligations of both parties in achieving these goals," she said.

Otjozondjupa regional governor, James Uerikua, commended AB InBev's significant investment in Okahandja, aligning with the government's push for Public-Private Partnerships to address national issues.

Uerikua emphasised the potential positive impact of the project on reducing water costs and ensuring water availability for low-income communities, further noting the brewery's contribution to job creation and economic development in the town.


