1. Opening and Welcoming

The meeting was blessed by a community elder before official opening and welcoming by the Headman.

Hon. Damian Maghambayi from Mukwe Constituency opened meeting and welcomed everyone. He thanked everyone for coming and wished for a successful meeting aimed at addressing the poor road network experienced by the community. Thereafter, Hon D. Maghambayi introduced the consulting team members and explained the purpose of the meeting. Hon. Damian Maghambayi also gave a short background of the meeting explaining that previous consultation meetings at regional level started many years back, and that this proposed development has been advocated and requested by the Regional Council.

2. Overview of the Meeting

Mr. Don Muroa from Trinity Environmental Solutions (TES) explained that the meeting was going to discuss and address the proposed construction to gravel standard the current earth track already proclaimed as DR3417 from Andara to Shamaturu Clinic, via Mangamba Village.

D. Muroa emphasised the need for a proactive participation during the meeting, as it was the right platform to ask questions, give suggestions, provide information and recommendation, and to receive feedback from the Proponent and project consultants.

3. Project background and description, overview of Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) process and its role

The consulting team gave presentations on the projects background, the EIA processes and its role. Their presentation highlighted the following:

- Background of the project
- Project Rationale and need for the development
- EIA process and compliance with national laws, guidelines and policies
- Proposed project description and possible impacts
- Project technical details

Mr. M. Muhenje (MMCE - Project Engineer) further informed the meeting participants that road construction comes in different stages; from planning, public meetings, designs, looking for materials, construction, etc. It was also emphasized that the existing

road alignment will be kept as much as possible. Also, that it was unlikely that people will be required to move. It was also noted that compensation sometimes takes long and that all efforts will be made for an efficient compensation process. MMCE also informed the meeting that they will start with surveying work to record all structures and infrastructure and to identify who needs compensation. Emphases were made on issues related to compensations and borrow pits, that in communal area, compensation is only for loss of property and not for materials mined.

Mr. M. Muhenje also requested for support and cooperation when community members are interacting with the surveyor teams who is or will be soon in the area for marking of the road's route, sitting of borrow pits and recording various infrastructure such as crop fields, camps, homesteads, houses, buildings, roads, electric power lines, water pipelines, water pans, etc. He urged the community not to remove the marking pegs.

Mr. C. Maketo (Roads Authority - Control Engineer) introduced himself and explained his role as RA's Control Engineer and also explained MMCE's role and also the Contractor's. He informed the meeting that the construction of the labour-based road will take at least 12 months, and that this road is already proclaimed. He further informed the meeting that, should everything go according to plan, the Contractor will be appointed by mid next year. He also informed the meeting that the funding for this road construction is co-financed by the Government of the Republic of Namibia.

Don Muroua also explained that employment will be done at once and not in phases. He also explained that, when the contractor is appointed hopefully by mid next year, they will then approach the Hon Councilor and the Traditional Authority for list of names for people to be considered for employment.

Mr. M. Muhenje further explained that the appointment of SME's as sub-contractors, that it will be done at the same time as the appointment of the main Contractor. Hence SME's are expected to team-up/joint-venture with main Contractors so that they submit their offers with the main Contractor.

After long and detailed presentations, an opportunity was given for comments, recommendations, suggestions and clarification questions. Comments, questions and responses are presented in the table below.

		He also clarified that, when the Contractor is appointed, it is expected that the Contractor should approach the Hon Councilor and the Traditional Authority for list of names for people to be considered for employment, especially for labour and unskilled jobs positions.

F. Hayingura (#7)	Raised a concern that, based on previous experience, list of names doesn't guarantee local employment.	C. Maketo reiterated that the RA has clear rules on this and that the Contractor will be regularly assessed by RA and MMCE to monitor if they fulfil the requirements for local employment. M. 5. Meeting Closure

Headman Mr. Kapinga Andrias, thanked the GRN and the Councilors for this planned development. He reminded that the TA was involved in the discussions about the construction of this road many years ago. He also noted that the road is important because it links his community to various services. Headman Kapinga reiterated that, what they needed is good quality roads. He advised that borrow pits be rehabilitated properly and recommended that good quality road materials be used, even if such materials needed to be hauled from other areas. He concluded by asking his community to work together and for the benefit of the community.

Mr. Don Murooua from Trinity Environmental Solutions (TES) explained that the meeting was going to discuss and address the proposed construction to gravel standard the current earth track already proclaimed as DR3417 from Andara to Shamaturu Clinic, via Mangamba Village.

Don Murooua emphasised the need for a proactive participation during the meeting as it was the right platform to ask questions, give suggestions, provide information and recommendation, and to receive feedback from the Proponent and project consultants.

He also informed the meeting that the funding for this road construction is co-financed by the Government of the Republic of Namibia.

Don Muroua also explained that employment will be done at once and not in phases. He also explained that, when the contractor is appointed hopefully by mid next year, they will then approach the Hon Councilor and the Traditional Authority for list of names for people to be considered for employment.

Mr. M. Muhenje further explained that the appointment of SME's as sub-contractors will be done at the same time as the appointment of the main Contractor. Hence SME's are expected to team-up/joint-venture with main Contractors so that they submit their offers with the main Contractor.
