### NAMSIP IMPLEMENTATION MODALITIES FOR AGRICULTURAL MECHANIZATION

#### Introduction

The Namibia Agricultural Mechanization and Seed Improvement Project (NAMSIP) is a project implemented by the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform (MAWLR). One of the key sub components for this Project is Agricultural Mechanization. This public notice focuses on Agricultural mechanization which deals with the provision of agricultural services through readily accessible (available and affordable) farm machinery and equipment to enable farmers to complete farming operations in a timely manner.

#### Target beneficiaries

The Project will benefit Communal Farmers, Resettled and Emerging Farmers who obtained land through the Resettlement Programme or Affirmative Action Loan Scheme; and communal farmers in title deed areas who are involved in livestock and crop (cereal, horticulture & fodder) production. These farmers can benefit as Individual farmers, Farmers' Co-operatives, Farmers' Associations as well as Organized Groups of Women & Youth.

#### Contributions by beneficiaries

All Beneficiaries are expected to contribute to this project through their participation in agricultural activities (time and labour); and also through payment toward subsidized agricultural services which will be provided based on the Dry Land or Rain fed Crop Production Program (DCPP) principle. These services include ploughing, ripping, planting and fertilizer application, weeding, spraying of pests, harvesting, threshing services; as well as grass harvesting i.e. mowing, raking, and baling services. Farmers will also contribute through payment of a minimal loaning fee toward the crop, fodder and animal health equipment.

#### Implementation modalities

These implementation modalities were approved by the Cabinet on 15 October 2020 through a Cabinet Decision No: 15th /06.10.20/004.

#### 1. Provision of subsidized agricultural services and inputs to crop and fodder producers under rain fed and irrigation production systems

- ✓ Government will procure and own all tractors and matching implements based on regional needs;
- ✓ The machineries & equipment will be distributed to the ADCs in all regions based on regional needs;
- ✓ The Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform (MAWLR) will render:
  - o Subsidized ploughing, ripping, planting, fertilizer application, weeding, spraying of pests, harvesting and threshing services;
  - o Subsidize grass harvesting i.e. mowing, raking, and baling services;
- ✓ The Ministry will provide subsidized inputs (seed and fertilizer) to grain and fodder producing farmers based on the existing Dry Land Crop Production Program (DCPP);
- ✓ The services will be provided up to a maximum of ten (10) ha per farmer. Farmers with fields below one (1) ha will be assisted using hand operated tractors;
- ✓ Consideration could be given to assist those requiring the same services over and above the 10ha threshold once all the registered farmers have been serviced;
- ✓ The Ministry will also provide subsidized ploughing and planting services to small scale communal and resettled horticultural farmers up to a maximum of 3 ha throughout the year based on demand.

#### 2. Loaning of machinery and equipment for crop, fodder and animal health

- ✓ The Ministry through Agricultural Development Centres (ADCs) will loan machineries and equipment for crop, fodder and animal health to individual farmers, cooperatives and associations in all regions at a minimal fee;
  - o This is with a view to mechanize agriculture while ensuring private sector participation in economic activities and improving the agriculture sector's contribution to the country's GDP.
- ✓ The Ministry will also loan, machinery and equipment for the provision of agricultural services to groups of women and youth in the 10 crop growing regions at a fee;
  - o The fees for the provision of these services (ploughing, planting, weeding and threshing) will be determined by the Ministry in consultation with Treasury;
  - o This is with a view to create employment and enable these groups to generate income.
- ✓ Prior to loaning, all beneficiaries will be trained on the operation and maintenance of the machinery and equipment that will be loaned out; and
- ✓ The Ministry will procure metal trunks that will be distributed to ADCs and Veterinary Rural Extension centers (VRECs) to store animal health equipment; and
- ✓ Cooler boxes that will be distributed to Veterinary Rural Extension Centres (VRECs) for use by Animal Health Technicians to keep vaccines and other veterinary medicines during farm operations.

#### 3. Installation of equipment for crop, fodder and livestock production

- ✓ The Ministry will supply and install small scale irrigation systems, green houses and shade nets including water tanks at a fee for identified progressive co-operatives and associations involved in horticultural production in all 14 regions. Cooperatives and Associations shall be required to provide proof of joint ownership of the land where the infrastructure will be installed.
- Beneficiaries will be expected to maintain and take care of these structures at their own cost.
- ✓ The Ministry will supply and install water infrastructure (water troughs and water tanks) at community water points in all 14 regions based on need.

#### 4. Identification of progressive individual farmers, co-operatives and associations involved in horticultural production for the installation of small-scale irrigation systems, green houses and shade nets including water tanks for the

The Ministry will

- ✓ Call for expression of interest by horticultural producers (Individuals, associations/groups and co-operatives) in all 14 regions;
- ✓ Collaborate with Regional Councils to create awareness;
- ✓ Require all interested horticultural producers to complete an application form at the MAWLR Regional offices/ADCs;
- ✓ Screen the application forms and shortlist potential beneficiaries based on set criteria and carry out field verifications where necessary.
- ✓ Loan out equipment at a minimal fee for horticultural production (hand operated: walking tractors, vegetable seed drillers, vegetable seedling trans planters and weeding cultivators); and
- ✓ Provide selected horticultural producers with subsidized mechanized agricultural services and horticultural inputs up to a maximum of three (3) ha.

#### 5. Equipment livestock production/marketing

- ✓ The Ministry will procure forty-two (42) animal weighing scales that will be stationed at identified Government Auction Kraals for use by farmers in all regions.

### NAMSIP IMPLEMENTATION MODALITIES FOR CERTIFIED SEED SYSTEMS IMPROVEMENT

#### Introduction

The Namibia Agriculture Mechanization and Seed Improvement Project (NAMSIP) is a project implemented by the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform (MAWLR). One of the key sub components for this Project is certified seed system improvement. This public notice focuses on Certified Seed System which aims at ensuring timely availability and accessibility of quality certified, early maturing, high yielding and drought tolerant seed to farmers

The Certified Seed System Improvement sub component will be implemented in the ten (10) crop growing Regions namely: Zambezi, Kunene (Northern Part), Omaheke, Otjozondjupa, Kavango East, Kavango West, Oshana, Oshana and Omusati Regions. These Regions were selected for seed multiplication based on good rainfall patterns and favourable climatic conditions for seed multiplication

#### Target Beneficiaries

The beneficiaries under this sub component are Individual Farmers; Cooperatives; Farmers' Associations; Private entities; and Seed Processors.

#### Contributions by beneficiaries

Beneficiaries are expected to contribute to this Project through participating in seed multiplication activities and buying of foundation seed and subsidized certified seed. Foundation seed will be available to registered seed growers while certified seed will be available to farmers in the crop growing regions based on the DCPP Principle. Farmers in non-crop growing regions will also be considered.

#### Implementation Modalities for Seed Multiplication

These implementation modalities were approved by the Cabinet on 15 October 2020 through a Cabinet Decision No: 15th /06.10.20/004.

The Ministry will:

- i. Call for Expression of Interest (IoE) by individual farmers, co-operatives and other entities in the ten (10) crop growing regions to register as potential seed growers for mahangu, maize, sorghum and cowpeas;
- ii. Select farmers as seed growers based on set criteria for seed multiplication;
- iii. Provide foundation seed of major staple crops (mahangu, maize, sorghum and cowpea) at a cost to selected seed growers for up to a maximum of 30 ha;
- iv. All selected seed growers shall undergo a mandatory training on seed multiplication and seed selection;
- v. Selected seed growers will be provided with subsidized ploughing, planting and weeding services based on the existing Dry Land Crop Production Program (DCPP) for up to a maximum of 30 ha; and
- vi. Provide technical back stopping (inspection, seed pre-cleaning and transporting of unprocessed certified seed from farmer's fields to the seed processing plants) during seed multiplication.

#### Implementation Modalities for managing and operating seed processing plants

The Ministry will:

- i. Construct five (5) seed processing plants at Omahene (Omusati Region), Okashana (Oshikoto Region), Katwitwi (Kavango West Region), Mashare (Kavango East Region) and Katima Mulilo (Zambezi Region)
- ii. Recruit registered seed processors, be it an individual or seed co-operative to operate and manage the seed processing plants;
- iii. Enter into contractual agreements with successful operators;
- iv. Buy certified seed from contracted seed growers at a price to be agreed between the Ministry and the Seed growers;
- v. Transport unprocessed certified seed produced at government institutions to the seed processing plants for processing; and
- vi. Avail certified seed to farmers' at a subsidized price i.e. 50% of the normal price in all regions.

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# Emerge highlights pandemic-induced business opportunities

# NWR loses N\$174 million as Covid-19 destroys tourism

The decimation of the regional and international tourism industry by lockdowns and travel restrictions was the main reason Namibia Wildlife Resorts suffered a massive loss of about N\$174 million during the 2019/20 financial year.

In presenting its results to government as its sole shareholder, NWR chairperson Leonard Lipumbu said, "During the financial year 2019/20, we faced our greatest challenges as an organisation. The significant milestone of our first-ever profit of N\$22 million since the establishment of the organisation and other financial gains made in 2018/2019 were wiped out due to Covid-19. However, to sustain its operations, which resulted in it not retrenching or reducing its employees' salaries, except for its board's allowances and senior management salaries, NWR needed to be innovative to survive."

"Therefore, we were the first organisation to offer our establishments to the government

as isolation facilities. We must say this was an arrangement few tourism companies were looking at during that period," said Lipumbu.

"Additionally, we paid special attention to our domestic market, which resulted in us offering a discounted rate of N\$600 per room from May up until September 2020. That was a significant discount on

our normal rack rates. Through this effort, we were able to keep the business going and provide a much-needed service to the nation. We also launched a new tour package that we envision will be one of the cornerstones of our future," Lipumbu added.

From a cost-cutting perspective, NWR signed a Memorandum of

Understanding with the Namibia Public Workers Union (NAPWU). The MOU resolved, amongst others, to suspend salary increments for the financial period 2019/20, suspend normal overtime, Sunday and public holiday payments, and other allowances and benefits with effect from 27 March 2020.

Additionally, it also resolved to

place a moratorium on external recruitments to ensure the company's wage bill remained manageable. NWR also introduced a voluntary separation initiative, which 130 staff members took up. These efforts were aimed at helping it reduce its employee costs.

NWR managing director Matthias Ngwangwama noted, "During the period under review, the Namibia Wildlife Resorts Hospitality Institute (NWR Hi) was successfully established. In collaboration with the National Training Authority, NWR's training arm (NWR Hi) was operationalised in 2020 and apprenticeship scholarships were awarded to 80 apprentices sourced from all of Namibia's 14 regions for the period 2020-2023".

Furthermore, in appreciating the role the media played during the financial year, Ngwangwama stated that "the negative media reports that characterized us in the past, also significantly reduced under review.

A positive media tonality index (positive media reports exceeding negative reports) was achieved in 2020. At one stage, the company was ranked in the 6th place in terms of positive media coverage in 2020 by NamMedia monitoring agency during the year".

On his part, public enterprises minister Leon Jooste thanked the company board and management for having done relatively well in coping with the disastrous effects of Covid-19 on the company in relation to industry trends.

NWR's held its AGM on 29 April 2021 in compliance with the Public Enterprise Act 2019. During the AGM, government was represented by public enterprises minister Jooste and the newly introduced environment deputy minister, Heather Sibungo.

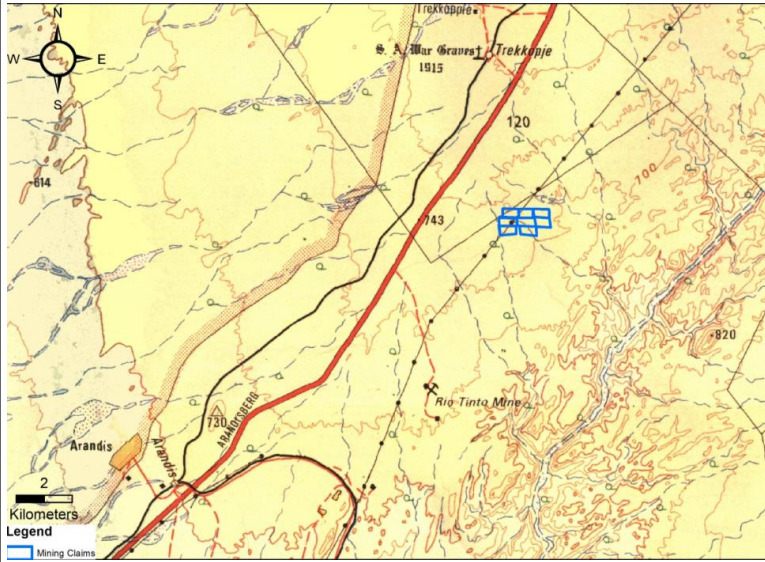

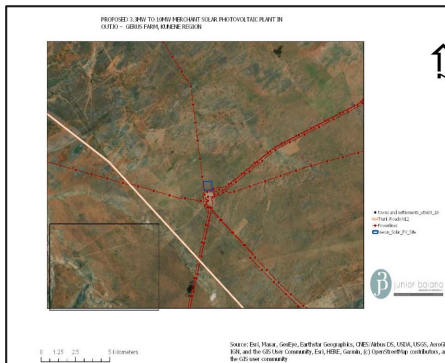

## Zambia marks anniversary of tragic plane crash

**T**he Zambian football fraternity on Sunday marked the 20th anniversary of the plane crash that killed its entire national football team - but still with no full report into the accident in sight.

Thirty people died, 18 of them players in the national team, when the military plane they were travelling in crashed into the Atlantic Ocean.

The plane went down soon after a refuelling stop in Gabon while heading to Senegal for a 1994 World Cup qualifier against the Teranga Lions.

Twenty years on, dozens turned up at the incomplete burial site on the grounds of the Independence Stadium to remember their heroes in Lusaka.

It was a familiar story of raised tempers among family members of the deceased who still want to know what exactly caused the crash.

"The government has to do the right thing by releasing the report - nothing more, nothing less," lamented widow Joyce Chabala, whose husband Efford, was the first choice goalkeeper.

Joyce's anger does not end at the government's failure to release the report.

At the time of the accident she was pregnant and a few months later delivered twins - Memory and David - who have grown up without knowing their father.

Joyce believes, had her husband been alive, she would not have had to shoulder the burden of raising her children alone.

"Wherever those people went, they were playing for their families," she told BBC Sport.

"Since they are no more, we have been left in misery. We are struggling while some of the children can't even go to school.

"Life would have been easy had they been alive."

One person who fondly remembers the team is the Football Association of Zambia (FAZ) president Kalusha Bwalya who was a member of the squad.

He was not on that flight as he was supposed to fly to Senegal from Holland where he played for PSV Eindhoven at the time.

"It seems like yesterday for some of us," he told BBC Sport.

"I am glad that I am still alive today to pay respects to talented, gallant and incredibly ambitious boys.

"We learnt a lot through the boys and for me it's a reference point for me as a player and an administrator."

Bwalya said he would always remain indebted to his bereaved friends, hence FAZ's initiative to organise a friendly match against Zimbabwe to mark the event.

Zambia's sports minister Chishimba Kambwili was not at the memorial service but was represented by Bernard Nakachinda, the director of sports in the ministry.

Nakachinda did not comment on the bereaved families' requests for a full report into the tragedy.

He instead encouraged the current national team to qualify for next year's World Cup finals as a way of honouring their fallen heroes.

The Zambian government has still not given relatives of the victims a full account of what caused the crash, other than blaming a mechanical fault in one of the plane's engines as well as pilot fatigue as possible reasons for the accident.

The families of the bereaved received financial compensation from the State in 2002, but promises that the official report would be released remain unfulfilled. -BBC

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# United fan violence condemned by government, mayor

**V**iolence during Sunday's protests from Manchester United fans, which led to the Premier League game with Liverpool being postponed, has been condemned by the UK government's sports minister and the mayor of Greater Manchester.

United fans protesting against the club's American owners, the Glazer family, stormed into the stadium which was closed to fans due to Covid-19 restrictions.

A flare was thrown at the broadcasters podium as fans ran on to the field and protesters clashed with police outside the ground.

Greater Manchester Police (GMP) said two officers were injured with one requiring hospital treatment after he was attacked with a bottle and suffered slash wound to his face.

"Passions are running high in football but there are ways to protest and make your voice heard without hurting or

endangering others," said Nigel Huddleston, Minister for Tourism and Sport.

"We understand the frustrations, but the violence by a small minority of fans at Old Trafford yesterday was unacceptable," he said.

The fan protests against the Glazers, which have been taken place since they bought the club in 2005, have been reignited since United's involvement in the attempt to create a breakaway European Super League.

Greater Manchester mayor Andy Burnham expressed support for the aims of the protesters but criticised the violence.

"I fully understand the long-standing concerns of Manchester United supporters about both the ownership and financing of their club and the wider running of football," he said. "It is important to make clear that the majority of supporters made their protest peacefully...however, there is no excuse for the actions of a

minority who injured police officers and endangered the safety of others," he added.

British foreign office minister James Cleverly said there was a need to understand the mood of football supporters.

"(We) cannot, cannot condone the images that we've seen about storming the ground," Cleverly told Sky News. "But we do need to understand the frustrations that fans have not just with Manchester United, but with a

number of clubs across the game." GMP Assistant Chief Constable Russ Jackson said the behaviour of the fans was "reckless and dangerous". "We have launched an investigation and we will be working closely alongside partners to ensure we establish the full circumstances surrounding today's events and prosecute those responsible," he said.

No decision has yet been made on the rescheduling of the match or about any sanctions for Sunday's events.

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



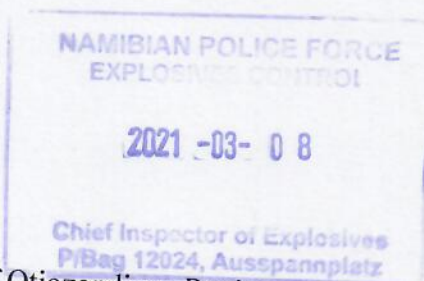
