The following conditions (imposed in terms of section 55(9) of the Act.) apply to this permit:

- a) A 1 KM buffer zone from the edge MC 70014 be created in which no mining activities should be allowed.
- b) NHC should access the proposed development, on proponent's cost once annually and submit a comprehensive report.
- c) That as per section 55 (9) (a) the activity authorised by this consent be supervised by a person with appropriate professional qualifications or experience in the identification and conservation of heritage.
- d) That any archaeological or palaeontological object or meteorite found in the course of the activity authorised by the consent must be recorded, conserved and dealt with as per the manual on Chance Find Procedures of heritage resources; and
- e) that Namibian citizens, especially members of the local community in and around the project area, be engaged in the activity authorised by the consent for the purpose of identification of heritage resources in the project area as well as of receiving professional training;
- f) That the consent holder reports back to the National Heritage Council every six (6) months on compliance with the conditions of this consent.
- g) This Consent does not exempt the holder from any conditions that may be imposed by owners, hosts or any other relevant authorities in consultation with NHC who have a stake in the project area.
- h) NHC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities related to this permit.
- i) This Consent is subject to the provisions of the National Heritage Act (Act 27 of 2004). Should any of the conditions contained herein conflict with the Act; the provisions of the Act as per section 55 (10) shall prevail.



- j) A no go area should be put in place where there is evidence of archaeological sites, historical rock paintings, cave/rock shelter or past human dwellings as per the Heritage Impact Assessment report.
- k) This consent is renewable, upon submission of an application at least two months before the current permit lapses
