1 PRESENTATION

IK the independent Environmental Practitioner conducting the EIA process welcomed all to the meeting and introduced SN and CR. IK then took the floor for his presentation.

IK presented the project background/motivation as well as the description and location of the proposed project and various project components.

IK also presented the ESIA process being followed and explained the potential key social and environmental issues that were identified as part of the initial stages of the ESIA process. He ended the presentation by discussing the way forward regarding the ESIA process.

2 DISCUSSION

Any issues and concerns raised during the meeting have been recorded in Table 1. Where a response was provided, the relevant response has also been included in Table 1.

Issue raised/ comment	Response
What is the exact depth where the devices will be deployed?	Upon further investigations, the proponent will be able to identify flat surfaces within the allocated boundary of the site to deploy the devices. But the location of such devices are normally about 6 - 10 meters deep, which should be about 500 m - 1 km from the shoreline.
My concern is on the impact on the sea life?	Correct. We have appointed a Marine Ecological expert to assess the potential impacts that the deployment of the devices may bring on sea life and develop mitigation measures to minimize these impacts.
Have you contacted the Ministry of Fisheries, regarding the project?	Yes. Communication with Fisheries has been made. In addition, the reports will be shared with Fisheries in order to obtain their input, comments and consent regarding the project. We have also communicated with the Maritime Affairs regarding the project.
Are you going to obtain some information from similar projects of this nature done elsewhere in the world?	Yes. There is an existing project of this nature in Portugal. That project is as well funded by AW-Energy who will be funding this project in Namibia. They have shared the Portugal report with us to guide us in our assessment.
Will the electricity that will be generated also be supplied to Wlotzkasbaken?	Yes. That is one of the aims of the project. To utilize renewable resources and generate electricity and feed it into the grid to supply the nearby communities with electricity, starting with the Wlotzkasbaken area.
It's great to explore wave energy but are you aware that there is another desalination plant next to Orano and which will also utilize the Nampower substation. So will this substation be able to sustain all this power?	Noted. The proponent is engaging with NamPower in terms of the substation capacity and whether there is a need to upgrade this substation to accommodate additional power.
Will there be any limitations in terms of access to the beach area?	No. Nothing at all. As mentioned, even the power cables will be underground.
How will the devices be visible at night to avoid any collision?	Lighting devices will be installed on the devices to indicate the presence of the devices.
What other structures will you have?	We are currently undertaking a subdivision EIA process for the land next to Orano Desalination Plant and which is within the Wlotzkasbaken Townlands earmarked for industrial development. Upon granting of the land, training facilities and research centers will be constructed on this piece of land.
Why did you decide on this location?	There is land availed to us by the Erongo Regional Council to develop an industrial area and as well as provide electricity to Wlotzkasbaken. Therefore it makes sense to have the devices near the research facilities and training centres.
Please bear in mind that this coastline is rocky.	The power cables in the sea will be placed on the

seabed. Only inland will it be underground.



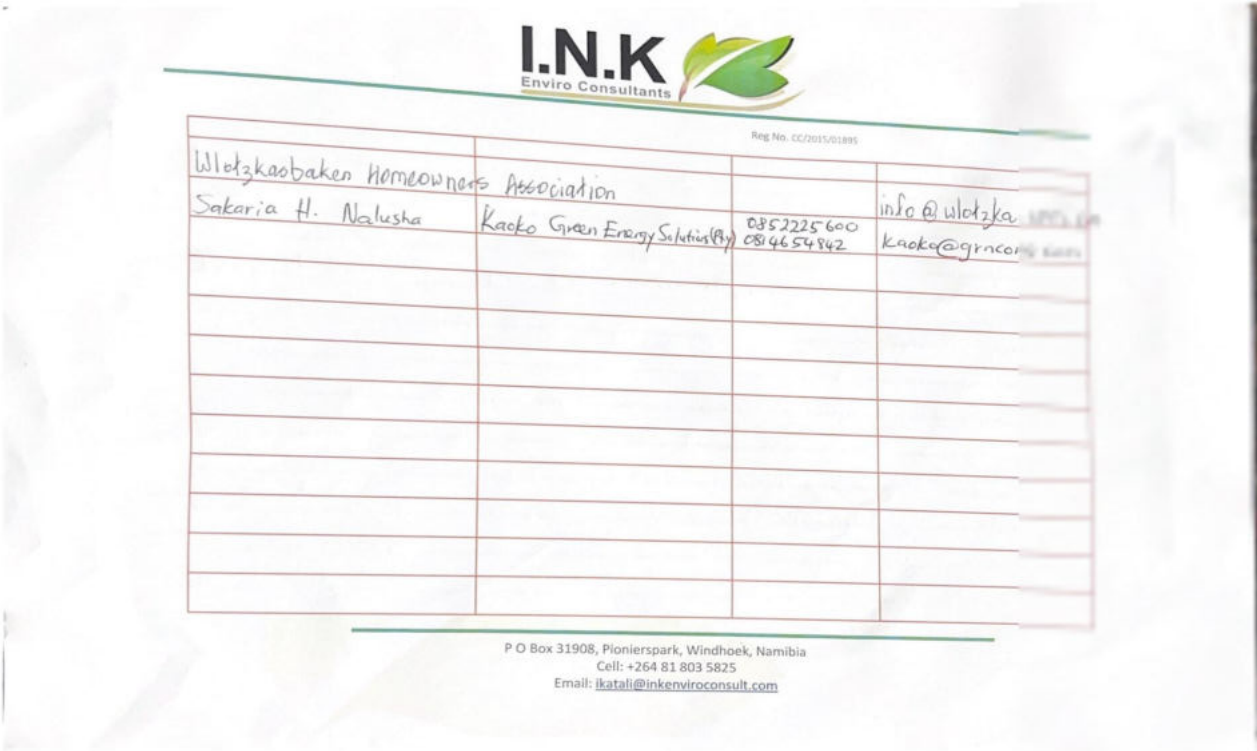

US giant picks Pretoria for major project

Nine new Ford models for South Africa



The manufacture of the new plug-in hybrid from next year, will see Ford's South African operations exporting vehicles to Australia and New Zealand for the first time in two decades.

Ford Motor Company's R5.2 billion investment to manufacture the first ever plug-in hybrid electric Ford Ranger from its Silverton plant is a major vote of confidence in its business in South Africa, says the head of its local operations.

Neale Hill, president of Ford Motor Company Africa, said it was crucial to remember that South Africa didn't just get given these build programmes, but had to compete with other parts of the world to offer a better business case.

In this context, it could be seen as a continued vote of confidence in South Africa, especially the local business' manufacturing capabilities, which were "very definitely" among the best in the world.

Hill was speaking to News24 at an event at the Silverton plant to celebrate 100 years of Ford's operations of South Africa, officially unveil the new plug-in hybrid electric Ranger, and officially launch a total of nine new vehicle products to the local market.

As things stand the company's Silverton plant in Pretoria is home to Ford Ranger, exporting to 100 markets from South Africa. The manufacture of the new plug-in hybrid from next year, will see Ford's South African operations exporting vehicles to Australia and New Zealand for the first time in two decades.

Europe will be another key market for the new vehicle. "We have four manufacturing locations that build Ford Ranger around the world, two in Thailand, one in South Africa and then one in North America. But the Silverton manufacturing operation is the only operation that is getting an investment to build the new plug-in hybrid for the Ford world."

"So, for any market that takes the Ranger and wants a plug-in hybrid, South Africa is their source, which is really exciting for the operation."

Rand rigging
Standard Chartered throws other banks under the bus

The UK-headquartered lender distorted bids, offers, bid-offer spreads and participated in dividing markets by allocating customers among banking peers in contravention of the Competition Act.

Standard Chartered will provide evidence against other banks implicated in manipulating the rand exchange rate, as part of a set-

tlement with competition authorities to avoid further prosecution beyond the R42.7 million administrative penalty it agreed to pay for its role in the forex rigging saga.

The settlement ends eight years of litigation between the British multinational bank and South African competition authorities, though it may have serious implications for other lenders charged with being part of an overarching conspiracy to manipulate the rand.

The settlement was confirmed as an order of the Competition Tribunal following a hearing on Wednesday afternoon during which the authority sought clarity on various clauses contained in the agreement with Standard Chartered.

"Standard Chartered has undertaken to cooperate in the prosecution of the other respondent banks," Makgale Mohlala, head of the cartels division at the Competition Commission, said during the tribunal hearing on Wednesday afternoon.

The tribunal later issued a statement saying Standard Chartered had agreed to provide evidence, written or otherwise, that is in its possession or under its control, which will assist in the prosecution of the remaining respondent banks in the forex rigging matter.

Settlement

As part of its settlement with competition authorities, Standard Chartered pledged to refrain from engaging in anti-competitive behaviour or any prohibited practice in the future.

It must also prepare and circulate a statement summarising the contents of the settlement agreement to its employees, managers and directors who have market-making responsibilities within 30 days of the agreement being confirmed, as an order of the Tribunal.

Hearings into the involvement of the other accused banks are being heard separately this week at the Competition Appeal Court (CAC) under the auspices of Judge Dennis Davis.

During those proceedings, legal representatives from respondent banks questioned the merits of the case against them, and queried whether local authorities have jurisdiction, given that much of the forex trading that impacts the rand takes place offshore.

Standard Chartered's settlement with competition authorities was premised on it admitting liability in distorting bids, offers, bid-offer spreads as well as other activities aimed at manipulating the rand-dollar exchange rate between 2007 and 2013.

It also participated in dividing markets by allocating customers in terms of which one trader withholds or pulls an existing bid or offer

from the market to allow another trader to execute and complete a separate trade.

Cartel

Though competition authorities said this cartel activity appeared to end in 2013, when the last of the implicated Standard Chartered traders left its employ, action against 28 local and international banks initially implicated first occurred about two years later.

The Competition Commission first lodged a complaint in April 2015 against various financial entities, including Barclays Bank, Barclays Africa Group, BNP Paribas, BNP Paribas South Africa, Citigroup, Citigroup Global Markets, JP Morgan Chase & Co, JP Morgan South Africa, Investec, Standard New York Securities and Standard Chartered Bank.

This complaint centred on allegations that the companies had been involved in a concerted effort to manipulate the rand exchange rate in violation of the Competition Act. Much of the alleged collusion is said to have occurred over instant messaging platforms on terminals leased from Bloomberg and Reuters, financial data providers that also supply live news feeds and trading systems.

In August 2016, the Competition Commission amended the complaint to add ABSA, Barclays Capital, Credit Suisse Group, Commerzbank, Bank of America Merrill Lynch, HSBC Bank, ANZ, Citibank, JP Morgan Nomura International, Macquarie Group, and JP Morgan Chase Bank.

The amendment included allegations of market allocation, an anti-competitive practice that involves dividing up customers among participants, as well as claims the respondent banks had assisted each other by allowing a trader with a significant open risk position to complete trades before others and by manipulating market liquidity.

Citibank

On 15 February 2017, the Competition Commission referred the matter to the Competition Tribunal for adjudication.

Though Citibank settled with the Competition Commission over similar allegations in April 2017, due to various legal challenges against competition authorities from other respondents, the matter has ended up in the CAC, where proceedings are ongoing.

Citibank's involvement in manipulating the rand occurred between September 2007 and October 2013, resulting in an administrative penalty of more than R69.5 million.

US-based Citibank also agreed to fully cooperate with local competition authorities in the prosecution of the forex rigging matter.
