Meeting 1 - Public and Wlotzkasbaken Community Members Meeting

1 PRESENTATION

IK the independent Environmental Practitioner conducting the EIA process welcomed all to the meeting and introduced SN and CR. IK then took the floor for his presentation.

IK presented the project background/motivation as well as the description and location of the proposed project and various project components.

IK also presented the ESIA process being followed and explained the potential key social and environmental issues that were identified as part of the initial stages of the ESIA process. He ended the presentation by discussing the way forward regarding the ESIA process.

2 **DISCUSSION**

Any issues and concerns raised during the meeting have been recorded in Table 1. Where a response was provided, the relevant response has also been included in Table 1.



Issue raised/ comment	Response
What is the exact depth where the devices will be deployed?	Upon further investigations, the proponent will be able to identify flat surfaces within the allocated boundary of the site to deploy the devices. But the location of such devices are normally about 6 - 10 meters deep, which should be about 500 m - 1 km from the shoreline.
My concern is on the impact on the sea life?	Correct. We have appointed a Marine Ecological expert to assess the potential impacts that the deployment of the devices may bring on sea life and develop mitigation measures to minimize these impacts.
Have you contacted the Ministry of Fisheries, regarding the project?	Yes. Communication with Fisheries has been made. In addition, the reports will be shared with Fisheries in order to obtain their input, comments and consent regarding the project. We have also communicated with the Maritime Affairs regarding the project.
Are you going to obtain some information from similar projects of this nature done elsewhere in the world?	Yes. There is an existing project of this nature in Portugal. That project is as well funded by AW- Energy who will be funding this project in Namibia. They have shared the Portugal report with us to guide us in our assessment.
Will the electricity that will be generated also be supplied to Wlotzkasbaken?	Yes. That is one of the aims of the project. To utilize renewable resources and generate electricity and feed it into the grid to supply the nearby communities with electricity, starting with the Wlotzkasbaken area.
It's great to explore wave energy but are you aware that there is another desalination plant next to Orano and which will also utilize the Nampower substation. So will this substation be able to sustain all this power?	Noted. The proponent is engaging with NamPower in terms of the substation capacity and whether there is a need to upgrade this substation to accommodate additional power.
Will there be any limitations in terms of access to the beach area?	No. Nothing at all. As mentioned, even the power cables will be underground.
How will the devices be visible at night to avoid any collision?	Lighting devices will be installed on the devices to indicate the presence of the devices.
What other structures will you have?	We are currently undertaking a subdivision EIA process for the land next to Orano Desalination Plant and which is within the Wlotzkasbaken Townlands earmarked for industrial development. Upon granting of the land, training facilities and research centers will be constructed on this piece of land.
Why did you decide on this location?	There is land availed to us by the Erongo Regional Council to develop an industrial area and as well as provide electricity to Wlotzkasbaken. Therefore it makes sense to have the devices near the research facilities and training centres.
Please bear in mind that this coastline is rocky.	The power cables in the sea will be placed on the



So it might be a challenge to bury a power cable seabed. Only inland will it be underground. in the sea.


