

#### 2 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Proponent proposes to establish a township on Portion A of the Remainder of Farm 38, Walvis Bay.

## 2.1 Need and desirability for the development

Walvis Bay is an important port town which operates an extensive fishing industry, and which is an important import and export point for many landlocked SADC countries. In terms of the Integrated Urban Spatial Development Framework for Walvis Bay (IUSDF) the town is expected to become a primary industrial city by 2030.

As such the Municipality of Walvis Bay has identified a need to develop an industrial township in order to meet the demands for industrial erven within the town.

#### 2.2 Description of Activity

#### 2.2.1 Site Location




Figure 1: Locality map of proposed township on Farm 38

The proposed township is located in the eastern part of Walvis Bay adjacent to the M36 and D1983 roads. Please refer to **Figure 1** for the locality Map and **Table 1** for the site location details.

#### 2.2.2 Proposed Development




Figure 2: Layout Map of proposed township on Farm 38

The proposed township will provide predominantly industrial and light industrial erven, with three public open spaces additionally provided in the township. The total number of erven to be created within the township are approximately 100 erven and the Remainder (Street). Figure 2 below depicts the layout of the proposed township.

The primary activities that may be undertaken on an Industrial erf ranges from industrial buildings, panel beating, scrap yard, service and light industry, service station, warehouse, storage and building yard as per the Walvis Bay Town Planning Amendment Scheme No 35. Light Industrial land uses are reserved for industry activities which are not noxious and may include accommodation for a caretaker on the premises or the selling of goods manufactured or processed on the premises.

#### 2.2.3 Engineering services and Access Provision

It will be the responsibility of the municipality to provide engineering infrastructure (electricity, water, sewage and roads) to be utilized for the development and to link the municipal services provided for by the Municipality of Walvis Bay.

#### 3 POTENTIAL IMPACTS

The following potential impacts have been identified from the proposed activity so far:

- Temporary job creation through the hiring of workers to be involved during the construction of the associated services.
- Impact on vegetation and fauna: some vegetation may need to be removed to during construction. This may also lead to habitat destruction for some fauna.
- Traffic safety: slow construction vehicles may compromise traffic safety in the area. Traffic may also be increased in the area once the areas are fully developed
- Environmental degradation through different types of waste generated on the site.
- Waste may be generated during construction on site which would have to be disposed of at an approved landfill site.
- Noise and dust generated by construction vehicles and activities.
- Health and safety risks which may result to workers operating on site.
- Surface and groundwater impacts may occur due to the storage, use and handling of hazardous substances during construction and operation.

In broad terms, the purpose of the EIA process is to assess the current environment (including the socio-economic and cultural setting) in which a proposed activity will take place and assess all potential impacts.

The process aims to ensure that all relevant factors are considered when evaluating the potential impacts of a project, as well as developing appropriate environmental management measures (in the form of an Environmental Management Plan – EMP) to mitigate these impacts.

## Delta variant crimps oil demand outlook

The Delta variant undermined deliveries in China, Indonesia and other parts of Asia.

lobal oil demand is expected to grow slower than previously forecast this year as the spread of Covid's Delta variant has prompted lockdowns in major consuming countries, the International Energy Agency said Thursday.

Demand surged in June as mobility increased in North America and Europe. But it "abruptly reversed course" in July as the Delta variant undermined deliveries in China, Indonesia and other parts of Asia, the IEA said in a monthly report. "The outlook for the remainder of the year has also been appreciably downgraded due to the worsening of the pandemic and revisions to historical data," the report

"New Covid-19 restrictions imposed in several major oil consuming countries, particularly in Asia, look set to reduce mobility and oil use." The agency now forecasts demand rising by 5.3 million barrels per day in 2021 to 96.2 mbd. That is down 300 000 bpd from its previous estimations. Global output, meanwhile, is expected to rise further after the OPEC group of major oil producers and its allies agreed to boost production, the IEA said. With US petrol prices rising, the White House complained on Wednesday that the production increase by the OPEC+ group was "simply not enough' to fuel the global economic recovery from the pan-

## China rejects need for further WHO probe

#### **LAURIE CHEN**

China on Friday rejected the World Health Organization's calls for a renewed probe into the origins of Covid-19, saying it supported "scientific" over "political" efforts to find out how the virus started.

Pressure is once more mounting on Beijing to consider a fresh probe into the origins of a pandemic which has killed more than four million people and paralysed economies worldwide since it first emerged in the central Chinese city of Wuhan.

A delayed and heavily politicised visit by a WHO team of international experts went to Wuhan in January 2021 to produce a first phase report, which was written in conjunction with their Chinese counterparts. It failed to conclude how the virus began.

On Thursday the WHO urged China to share raw data from the earliest Covid-19 cases to revive its probe into the origins

China hit back, repeating its position that the initial investigation was enough and that calls for further data were motivated by politics instead of scientific inquiry.

"We oppose political tracing and abandoning the joint report" issued after the WHO expert team's Wuhan visit in January, vice foreign minister Ma Zhaoxu told reporters. "We support scientific tracing."

That report said the virus jumping from bats to humans via an intermediate animal was the most probable scenario, while a leak from Wuhan's virology labs was "extremely unlikely". MA rejected suggestions of new lines of investigation.

"The conclusions and recommendations of WHO and China joint report were recognised by the international community and the scientific community," he said.
