

ocal authorities in the Democratic Re-■public of Congo have closed half a dozen mining companies in South Kivu to ease tensions between locals and Chinese gold miners.

The measure taken by

Governor Theo Ngwabidje Kasi concerns the territory of Mwenga, about 100 kilometres southwest of Bukavu, where many artisanal miners' subsistence operators working independently and competing companies operate. "Minerals are being exploited without respecting the mining code and regulations," said Christian Wanduma, a lawyer advising one of the most affected local communities. The move comes after the central government this week said it is reviewing its stake in a giant cobalt and copper mine in which a Chinese

state-owned group is the majority partner.

Activities by mining companies have resulted in agricultural land being razed and depleted so that "even peanuts" cannot be grown there, he said. It was "necessary to restore order to semi-industrial mining" to preserve "the interests of the local population, the environment and respect for human rights", the governor said in his decree issued on Friday. which was seen by AFP.

Doing so would also enable "the traceability of production" from sites, the decree said, naming x mining operations whose activities were suspended until further notice.

"All local and foreign personnel" of these companies must leave the mining sites immediately, the order said. Mining equipment will be immobilised until an ad hoc commission has studied the situation "case by case", it said.

All the suspended companies are Chinese or work with the Chinese, who have a strong presence in the mining sector in the country.






Figure 1 -210830_Office of the Governer




Figure 2-210827_Opuwo Spar




Figure 3 -210827_Opuwo Regional council
