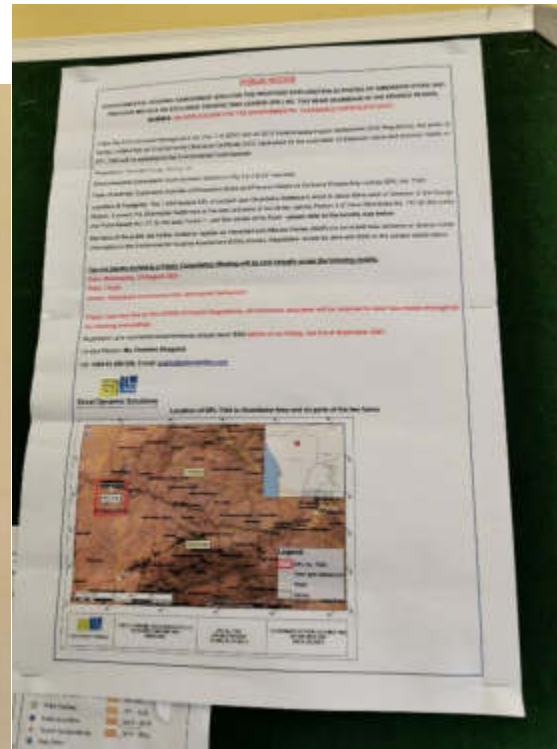



The community of Okombahe in the Erongo region is up in arms over a proposed marble mining project in their area, saying they will fight against the activity with all power.

Residents expressed their discontent over the planned mining that will be conducted on a 7 464-hectare of land that is part of the //Khan-heb Mountain. According to residents, not only is the planned project too close to the community and surrounding farms but also threatens their cultural heritage, tourist attraction sites and grazing.

The proponents of the project are denying that it poses an environmental hazard. The residents highlighted their fears during a consultative meeting with regards to an environmental scoping assessment (ESA) held by Excel Dynamic Solutions on behalf of Timecall Erongo mining. The company that plans to operate a marble mine was granted the exclusive prospecting licence (EPL) in 2018. Dãures councillor Kennedy Haoseb during the meeting said marble mining has become a challenge for his constituency as some companies never rehabilitated the mines when they left.

Venue: Okombahe Community Hall, Okombahe Settlement, Erongo Region

The Public Consultation Meeting was attended by forty-three (43) people, including three Environmental Consultants from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS) - **Please refer to the attached attendance register.** The distinct representatives that attended the Meeting are as follows:

- The Honourable Councilor of the Daures Constituency
- Representatives from the Okombahe Settlement Office
- The Headman of the !Oe-#Gan Traditional Authority
- Representatives from the Okombahe (#Eseb) Community Conservancy (Interim Vice Chairperson)
- Representative Member of the Parliament from the Okombahe Community
- Members of the Okombahe Community (farmers, residents, and others)
- Three Environmental Consultants from Excel Dynamic Solutions

COVID-19 REGULATIONS ADHERENCE

Upon arrival at the Community Hall entrance, all the attendees were hand sanitized by one of the Consultants (given the COVID-19 Health Regulations). To ensure that the meeting, as a form of gathering complies with the COVID-19 Regulations, the chairs were set up in a way that social distancing between the people is observed and every attendee had a face mask on.



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TRANSLATION OR INTERPRETATIONS OF LANGUAGES (ENGLISH AND DAMARA-NAMA)

Given the fact that some of the meeting attendees were elders from the area who only spoke Damara-Nama language and to ensure transparency and effective communication in the meeting, Hon. Kennedy !Haoseb, Mr. Simson Ochurub and Mr. Rossly Otsub volunteered to translate for the elders (from English to Damara-Nama) provided translation to Ms. Shagama (from Damara-Nama to English) to make sure that all comments and other inputs presented in the local language were recorded in the minutes for consideration in the ESA Report.

INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

The Honourable Councilor Kennedy !Haoseb welcomed everyone to the meeting and requested one of the community elders to open the meeting with a prayer. He then handed the floor to Ms. Fredrika Shagama (the Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) / Consultant) from EDS to introduce herself and her colleagues. Ms. Shagama expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting. She briefly explained to the attendees what the meeting was all about and why they were invited (with reference to the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation).

The meeting attendance register was then circulated for the attendees to write down their names, contact details and sign so that they could be added to the existing list of interested and affected parties (IAPs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

Ms. Shagama presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

2.1 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process and the Public Role in the Process

Ms. Shagama explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an environmental clearance certificate (ECC) from the Environmental Commissioner.

2.2 Brief Description of the Project

The Consultants presented the proposed exploration activities (where exploration would be carried out, what commodities would be explored for and their methodology briefly).



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Soon after hearing that one of the potential target areas (within the EPL boundaries) for prospecting activities is the mountain to the southeastern side of the Okombahe Settlement, the Honorable Councilor and the community members requested that a brief visit should be made near or at that specific mountain before continuing with the rest of the meeting. This was requested with the aim of ensuring that the community would be able to have an idea of the proposed site area for exploration and raise their concerns/issues accordingly. Therefore, a short site visit (about 15 minutes long) was undertaken by all the meeting attendees and returned to the meeting venue (Community Hall) to resume the meeting.

A brief description of the project activities was presented to the attendees by Ms. Shagama. This included a brief presentation of the activities and resources anticipated for the project activities.

2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, Ms. Shagama also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive and negative environmental and social impacts.

2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

The meeting attendees were then presented with an opportunity to raise their concerns/issues and or comment on the proposed project activities.

The issues and comments recorded are presented in **Table 1** below.

These were done in addition to the typical and required newspaper adverts, but, knowing how remote Okombahe is for newspapers to get here on time, we did not only rely on the newspapers in making sure that the notification reached the affected community of Okombahe and on time.
2.	(A) <u>Prior Community Consultation:</u> Can you please establish the extent to which the community is affected? It seems the EPL was granted but the community was not consulted until now.	Fredrika Shagama: The directly affected community is this of Okombahe because the EPL covers part of the Settlement to the east and then the farm owners whose properties are overlain by the EPL. The EPL was granted by the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) back in August 2018, which does not require any form consultation when an applicant applies for a license of this kind.

		<p>However, given the fact that the actual work on the EPL can only be done once the EIA Study has been done and an ECC granted by the Environmental Commissioner, the EMA Regulations require us independent Environmental Consultants (on behalf of the Proponents/License owners) to notify and consult with members of the public, including relevant authorities of the site area from the very beginning of the EIA process, which is what we are here for today.</p>
