

We, Kazongundu Tjambiru (Orupembe Conservancy Vice-chairman) & Farias Tjiningire (Otjikakurukouje Traditional Authority - Council Secretary), hereby acknowledge that at 10h00 on the 10<sup>th</sup> of September 2021 at the community meeting place at Onjuva village a consultation meeting was held between members of the community and the leadership of the Orupembe Conservancy + the Otjikakurukouje Traditional Authority to discuss expectations, suggestions, and inputs into the above subject matter. As members of the directly affected community it was resolved that the community is generally in support of the proposed project, however the final decision by Traditional leaders shall be taken at or after the scheduled annual general meeting planned for the 17<sup>th</sup> of October 2021. This is because the majority of the other traditional leaders will be present at this meeting. Furthermore, the community supports the idea subject to the following conditions:

1. That environmental management measures outlined in the environmental plan will be strictly enforced & implemented in close collaboration with the Orupembe Conservancy.

2. That a compensation agreement of a mutually beneficial nature is entered into between the Orupembe Conservancy / Otjikakarukoye Traditional Authority and the holder of mining claims 66714, 66731 & 66733 before the commencement of any quarrying.

- a) That as per section 55 (9) (a) the activity authorised by this consent be supervised by a person with appropriate professional qualifications or experience in the identification and conservation of heritage.
- b) That any archaeological or palaeontological object or meteorite found in the course of the activity authorised by the consent must be recorded, conserved and dealt with as per the manual on Chance Find Procedures of heritage resources; and
- c) that Namibian citizens, especially members of the local community in and around the project area, be engaged in the activity authorised by the consent for the purpose of identification of heritage resources in the project area as well as of receiving professional training;
- d) That the consent holder reports back to the National Heritage Council every six (6) months on compliance with the conditions of this consent.
- e) This Consent does not exempt the holder from any conditions that may be imposed by owners, hosts or any other relevant authorities in consultation with NHC who have a stake in the project area.
- f) NHC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities related to this permit.
- g) This Consent is subject to the provisions of the National Heritage Act (Act 27 of 2004). Should any of the conditions contained herein conflict with the Act; the provisions of the Act as per section 55 (10) shall prevail.
- h) Adopt the Chance Find Procedures

- i) This consent is renewable, upon submission of an application at least two months before the current permit lapses.
- j) Existing roads and access tracks should be rerouted to detour the burial sites by at least 50m.
- k) The local Community should be consulted about possible fencing of the burial sites
- l) Community should be properly consulted regarding the social and environmental impact arising from the proposed activity.
