The Public Consultation Meeting was attended by ten (10) people, which includes three Consultants from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS) - **Please refer to the attached attendance register.**

TRANSLATION OR INTERPRETATIONS OF LANGUAGES

The meeting was done in Afrikaans to make sure that all comments and other inputs presented in the local language were recorded in the minutes for consideration in the ESA Report.

INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

Honourable Councilor Martin Biwa welcomed everyone to the meeting, requested all the attendees to introduce themselves (including the EDS Consultants and the councilors of Vaalgras) and then handed the floor to Ms. Althea Brandt from EDS. Ms. Brandt expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting.

Ms. Brandt briefly explained to the attendees what the meeting was all about and why they were invited (with reference to the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations on Public Consultation).

The meeting attendance register was then circulated for the attendees to write down their names, contact details and sign so that they could be added to the existing list of interested and affected parties (IAPs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

Ms. Brandt presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

2.1 Explanation of what an ESA is, its Process and the Public Role in the Process

Ms. Brandt explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an environmental clearance certificate (ECC) from the Environmental Commissioner.

2.2 Brief Description of the Project

Ms. Brandt gave a brief description of the proposed project activities.

2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Consultant also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive & negative environmental and social impacts.

2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

The meeting attendees were then presented with an opportunity to raise their concerns/issues and or comment on the proposed project activities. The issues and comments recorded are presented in **Table 1** below.

Table 1: Comments and issues raised during the public meeting in Vaalgras on the 3rd of November 2021

Comment/ issue No.	Issue / comment / question	Response by EAP:
1.	The Proponent plans to explore for Dimension stones and Industrial Mineral, but what if they find other minerals? Are they supposed to apply for a new license?	Ms. Brandt: The EPL is only valid for the prospecting and exploration of the mentioned commodities; Dimension Stones and Industrial Minerals which the EPL has a potential for.
	According to the BID, it is mentioned that excavators and bulldozers will be used during the operational phase. Apart from the cattle and goats that we have, there are also other animals such as springboks that can be forced to run away when this machinery is used. How will the Proponent compensate for the loss of these animals if they run away?	Ms. Brandt: I have taken note of your question and will revert this question back to the Proponent. However, the bulldozers and excavators will not be used throughout the whole day. As I have mentioned that this is only prospecting and exploration and not full mining activities as the Proponent cannot mine on an EPL.
	Why should people from Tses be considered for job opportunities if there is such a high unemployment rate in Vaalgras itself, seeing that the EPL area is closer to Vaalgras than Tses?	It was not clear before coming to site which settlement is closer, therefore we stated that employment will be given to the people from Tses but since Vaalgraas is closer, employment will be provided to the people of Vaalgras and if more is needed it can always be extended to Tses or other local people. We will amend this in the ESA Report to indicate that the local community of Vaalgraas should be given priority for job opportunities before far communities.

Comment/ issue No.	Issue / comment / question	Response by EAP:
2.	<p>Seeing that this exploration activity will have a negative effect on the environment and the people of the affected farms, and there are enough minerals to eventually lead to a mine. Are we allowed to oppose against such further developments? This land is mainly used for farming and at this stage it is not enough for the survival of our animals.</p>	<p>It is important for us to focus on exploration works for this project. If exploration yields economic findings to advance to mining level (converting the EPL into a Mining License), the mining will require a more in-depth study. It is however still up to the affected farm owners and the Traditional Authority to also give their consent and/or objections of any sort for the commencement of the exploration works, if an ECC is issued by the MEFT. The information and comments obtained from this meeting as well as other comments received after the meeting will also be addressed within the ESA Report and EMP.</p>
3.	<p>If the Proponent does not adhere to what was highlighted in the ESA Report and EMP, what can we as the Traditional Authority or affected farm owners do about it?</p>	<p>The affected parties can always take pictures/proof and submit a complaint to MEFT if the EPL holder does not comply to what was stipulated in the reports or what they agreed on doing.</p>
4.	<p>What would happen if exploration activities commence and farmers start losing their animals due to theft? Will the EPL holder compensate for this?</p> <p>We are also in the process of asking for more land, so it makes it difficult to know that a certain area is being held for exploration works.</p>	<p>I take note of your concern and we will address this issue within the report. However, to add on this, should there be undisputed proof that the livestock were indeed lost due to exploration related activities, the Proponent will be held liable for this, and a Compensation Policy will be enforced and the issue resolved amicably.</p>

Comment/ issue No.	Issue / comment / question	Response by EAP:
5.	<p>This is a traditional and communal area which means we are not the only ones that can give consent for the proposed project.</p> <p>Most of the people are not physically on the farm. But in that area approximately 200-300 people are affected by this EPL.</p> <p>Is there an exact area that will be covered by the EPL that can be demonstrated to us on a map? We would want to see where the EPL starts and ends to know which part of which farm will be affected.</p>	<p>We take note of your comment.</p> <p>How many farmers/people live on the area covered by the EPL area?</p> <p>The EPL may be big in size however exploration will not be done everywhere on it. There will be selected site areas within the EPL that will be determined by geological mapping and other exploration methods before starting the actual works on the EPL. Therefore, only certain areas of the EPL will be explored.</p>

FINAL REMARKS AND CONCLUSION OF THE MEETING

Ms. Brandt thanked the attendees for their input through comments and raising their concerns. She indicated to the attendees that all their comments, concerns and inputs had been noted down for consideration and addressing in the Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) Report as well as incorporating their recommendations into the draft EMP.

Furthermore, she informed the attendees that the draft Environmental Scoping Assessment (ESA) Report together with the meeting minutes, EMP and associated documents will be shared with them for review and further comments. These documents will be made available through emails provided and a hard copy to be printed and couriered to the nearest office in the area and shared with the Traditional authority and local community.

Once review of the draft ESA Report and EMP is done, the Report will be finalized and submitted to the Environmental Commissioner at the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) for consideration of an ECC.

The meeting was adjourned at 13h40.

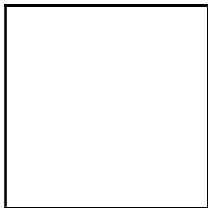
