


Figure 1: The locality map of EPL - 8092 located near Usakos in the Erongo Region

3 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Once the Proponent has been issued with the ECC and obtained all required permits such as land use consents, where necessary and is ready to commence the exploration activities, the planned activities will commence.

The proposed activities entail prospecting and detailed exploration activities to delineate the mineral deposits. This is to determine whether the deposit for the targeted commodities is economically feasible (to advance to the resources development and mining phase).


