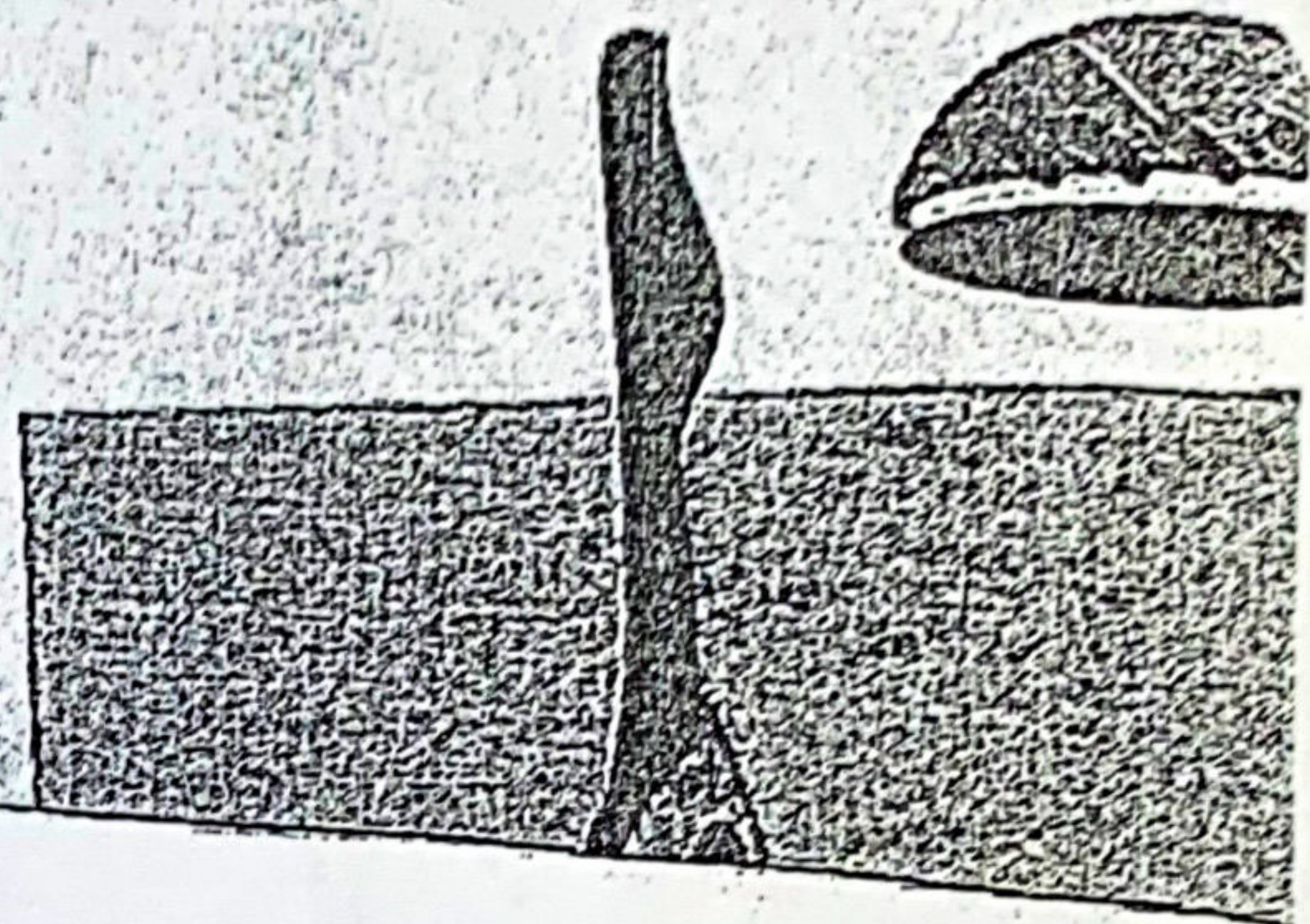
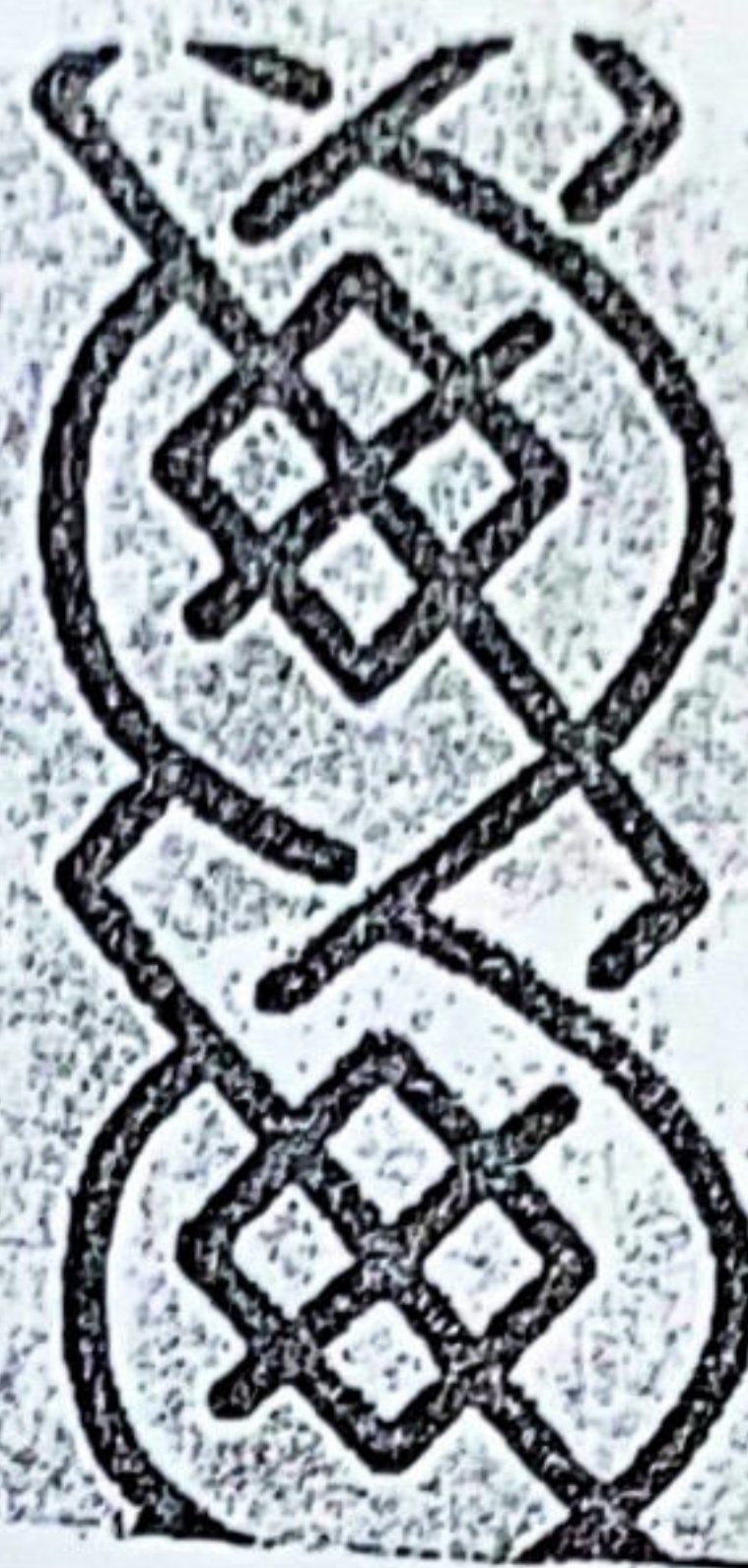
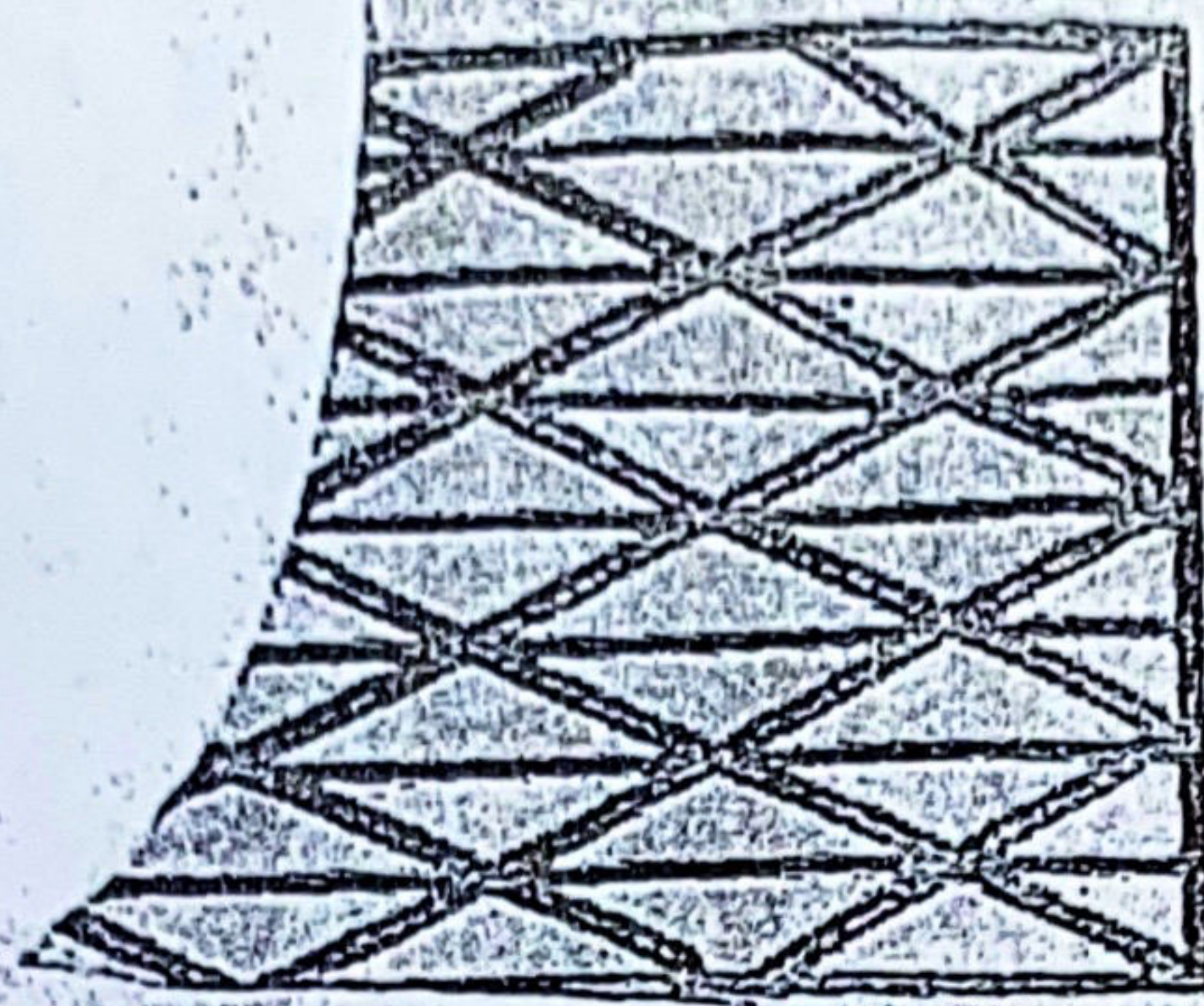
**CONSTRUCTION OF A 6.8KM ACCESS ROAD FROM MR120 OKATANA-ENDOLA-
 ONHUND MAIN ROAD TO AMUTANGA COMBINED SCHOOL AS AN EMERGENCY
 PROJECT BEFORE RAINY SEASON.**

Reference is made to a letter dated 07 August 2023 sent to our ministry from the Ministry of Finance and Public Enterprises with regards to the above-mentioned project MR120.

The Ministry of Works and Transport has availed finances to execute and construct a 6.8km access road from MR120 to Amutanga Combined School. The construction of this access road falls under the category of emergency as the rainy season is about to start. The main objective of constructing the access road is to provide learners and teachers access to the government facility without walking through the flood plains and risking drowning.

The access road is estimated to cost N\$ 22 million of which N\$10 460 889.50 is catered for under the budget 2023/24. The Treasury has granted approval on a phased approach construction of the access road that fits within the available resources of N\$10 460 889.50 under the current financial year 2023/24 in consideration that the Ministry budget accordingly under the next main budget for 2024/25.

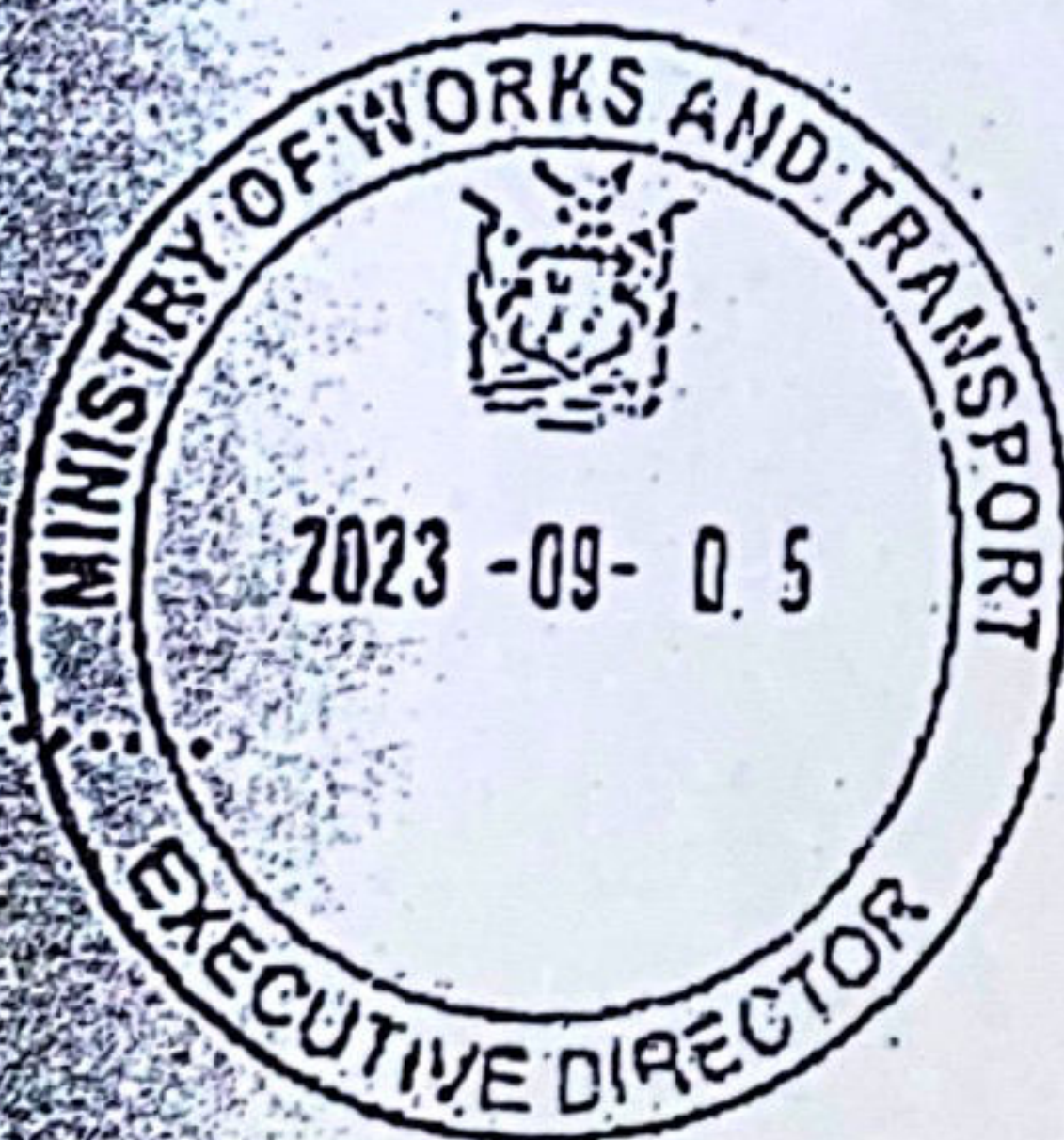
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The ministry has noted that through the MR120 project, a 1.2km access road that connects to the access road mentioned above was constructed and completed as a social responsibility on the project and is serving the community fully and productively. Therefore, the ministry would like to continue with the project through the existing project as a matter of urgency via the same team (consultant, SME - subcontractor) to expedite the process and progress to make this emergency a reality for the community. Disbursement can be prepared as before during the construction of the above - mentioned project.

It is against this background that the Ministry direct the Roads Authority to appoint same SME contractor to this project as a matter of urgency to commence as quickly as possible before the rainy season.
