Fritz credits high pain tolerance for Indian Wells success

₹aylor Fritz said his stubborn streak and a high pain tolerance helped him win the Indian Wells title on Sunday after an ankle injury almost forced the American to pull out of the final against Rafael Nadal. Fritz overcame excruciating pain to snap Nadal's 20-match winning run with a 6-3 7-6(5) victory in the ATP Masters 1000 tournament, becoming the first American to capture the crown since Andre Agassi over two decades

stubborn person. I also think I have a very high pain tolerance and not a lot of regard for potentially damaging myself. Worse if I think there's a chance to get on the court and play," said Fritz, who suffered the injury on Saturday.

"It's probably a lot of not-so-good things that get me on court. I was thinking about what I was going to have to say to the crowd if I pulled out ... It takes a lot to get me to not take the court."

Fritz had shown similar resilience last year when he returned at Wimbledon following knee surgery, only a month after exiting the French Open in a wheelchair due to injury.

The 24-year-old told reporters he had gone against the advice of some members of his team by facing Nadal on Sunday.

"I went to the doctor. We did a lot of work on it. I numbed it ... Went out again after maybe like an hour of work. I started hitting. I realised, 'wow, maybe I can actually play," Fritz said.

"I had this feeling of hope the next time I went back on the practice court. It was a game-time decision. A lot of members of my team wanted me to not play

the match.

"I'm never going to let them forget that because I went on the court, and it was a complete non-issue. I didn't feel it at all, it didn't hinder me at all." – Supersport.com

Mickelson will not play Masters in April

It appears Phil Mickelson is taking his break from golf seriously. The six-time major champion reportedly will not play the Masters next month (scheduled from 7-10 April), which would mark his first time missing the prestigious major since 1994.

"I'm an extremely

After Sports Illustrated noted on Monday that the official Masters website had quietly changed Mickelson's status from a 2022 invitee to a column called "Past Champions Not Playing", CBS Sports and Golf Digest reported that Mickelson was indeed out of the event.

Yesterday, Mickelson issued a lengthy mea culpa in which he addressed divisive comments made in a book interview about plans for a Saudi-backed golf league supposed to rival the PGA Tour.

The past 10 years, I have felt the pressure and stress slowly affecting me at a deeper level," the 51-year-old wrote at the end of his statement. "I know I have not been my best, and desperately need some time away to prioritise the ones I love most, and work on being the man I want to be."

Mickelson has not played in any event on the PGA Tour, the PGA Tour Champions or overseas since. PGA Tour commissioner Jay Monahan refused to reveal whether Mickelson had been suspended or faced any other discipline, but said he'd need to have a conversation with the lefty before he returned to the tour.

"He stepped away on his own accord, and he's asked for time," Monahan said. "He's been given that time. We don't comment on disciplinary matters, potential matters or actual matters. But every player is accountable for their actions out here."

However, the PGA Tour does not control who competes in any of the four majors, and many expected Mickelson would not want to miss one of the most important weeks on the golf calendar. He won green jackets in 2004, 2006 and 2010.

Mickelson received widespread blowback for comments he made on the record to author Alan Shipnuck, in which he admitted that the Saudi businessmen were "scary m—-f—s to get involved with", and he was only doing so to try to "reshape how the PGA Tour operates" in terms of the money its players receive.

Plans for the league have since fallen apart. LIV Golf Investments CEO Greg Norman instead announced an eight-event series dubbed the "LIV Golf Invitational" that will play exclusive tournaments in London, the US and parts of Asia.

I INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND




Figure 1: Locality map of EPL 7167

Resource 500 Namibia (Pty) Ltd (*The Proponent*), has applied to the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME) to be granted the Exclusive Prospecting License (EPL) No. 7167 on 09 May 2018. The license was granted on 26 March 2019 and expires on the 25 March 2022. Thus, a renewal application has been lodged. The area of EPL 7167 is 22,031.231 Ha in size. The EPL is located about 47 km South-east of Arandis in the Erongo Region (Figure 1). The EPL is prospective to Base and Rare Metals, Radioactive Minerals and Industrial Minerals.

Exploration and all the mining related activities are among listed activities that may not be undertaken without an ECC under the Environmental Management Act (EMA) (2007) and its 2012 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The relevant listed activities as per EIA regulations are:

• 3.1 The construction of facilities for any process or activities which requires a license, right of other forms of authorization, and the renewal of a license, right or other form of authorization, in terms of the Minerals (Prospecting and Mining Act, 1992).

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- 3.2 other forms of mining or extraction of any natural resources whether regulated by law or not.
- 3.3 Resource extraction, manipulation, conservation and related activities.

The Proponent is, therefore, required to obtain an ECC before commencement of works on the EPL. To fulfill the legal requirements, the Proponent has appointed Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd, an independent team of Environmental Consultants, to conduct the required Environmental Assessment (EA) process and submit the ECC application to the Department of Environmental Affairs and Forestry (DEAF) at the Ministry of Environment, Forestry & Tourism (MEFT).




Figure 2: EPL 7167 with affected land use and neighbouring farms

2 PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

It should be noted that the Background Information Document (BID) is not an EA Report but a non-technical summary of the EA, aimed for information purposes and a basis for public involvement from the beginning of the EA process. The motivation behind this document is to:

- Briefly introduce the proposed project and related activities to potential interested and affected parties (I&APs)/stakeholders.
- Give background information to I&APs of the task, along these lines giving a chance to them (I&APs) to get information, remark and raise issues with respect to the approval measure.

 Invite members of the public to register as I&APs and get added to the EA database so that they can stay informed about the EA progress throughout its process; and

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 Provide all I&APs with an opportunity to comment or provide inputs/concerns on the proposed project activities, which entails concerns/issues on the

biophysical and socio-economic aspects, and any other issues of concern related to the proposed project. The information from I&APs will then form basis of the EA and EMP documents that will help the regulatory and competent authorities (MEFT and Ministry of Mines & Energy (MME), respectively) to pass judgment on the acceptability of the undertaking.

3 NEED AND DESIRABILTY OF PROPOSED ACTIVITY

The mining sector plays an important role in economic development of many countries including Namibia. In Namibia, mining sectors form part of the backbone of the economy, in view of having a positive impact on the economy measured through job creation and income generation.

Mining is also an important source of government fiscal receipt and source of foreign exchange. In addition, mining sector forms a vital part of some of Namibia's development plans, such as the Vision 2030, National Development Plan 5 (NDP5) and Harambee Prosperity Plans (HPPs) I and II. Mining contributes to meeting the ever-increasing global demand for minerals, and for national prosperity. In Namibia, prospecting and exploration for mining purposes occurs mainly within the private sector. Therefore, successful outcomes from prospecting and exploration on EPL 7167 could lead to mining of the target commodities, which would feed into the national development plans.

4 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed activities will entail the detailed exploration activities and delineating the mineral deposits to determine whether the deposits for targeted commodity are economically feasible (to advance to the resources development and mining phase).

The prospecting and exploration of minerals are the first components of any potential mining project. This is done to acquire the necessary data required for further decision making and investment options. These activities are anticipated to last for about three (3) years. The planned activities and required

resources and infrastructure are briefly described below. The detailed exploration methods (techniques) will be presented in the ESA Report.

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The proposed phased approach for the exploration works is presented below. However, it should be noted that these activities will only be undertaken upon the approval of the ESA Report and issuance an ECC by the Environmental commissioner.

Once the Proponent has been issued with an ECC and obtained all relevant and required permitting licensing (such as consent and land use agreements), and ready to commence with the actual exploration activities (with financial, technical, and human resources in place), the planned activities will commence on site.

4.1 Project Processes

The proposed exploration activities (methods) are divided into the following categories:

Phase 1: Non-invasive techniques (prospecting) This phase includes geological field mapping and groundbased surveys, reviewing of existing geological maps and
historical drilling data as well as field evaluation and
sampling, in order to select and verify the target areas.

- Phase 2: Invasive techniques (detailed exploration) –
 The techniques involved herein include soil survey, rock
 sampling, drilling, trenching, and/ or pitting and detailed
 exploration.
- Once the target areas have been selected and verified under the prospecting phase, detailed exploration works will follow. The preferred extraction technique for this exploration programme is the quarrying via the cutting method.

4.2 Human Resources, Services, and infrastructure

The following services and infrastructure as provided below will be required for the project activities:

• Human resources and accommodation: About 10 people will be employed on site during the exploration phase. The workforce will include skilled, semi and unskilled workers, as necessary to complete the works. The exploration workforce will be accommodated at Arandis upon reaching an agreement and a consent is signed between the Proponent and the respective landowner or custodian (authority) prior to setting up accommodation structures (tented camps).

 Working Space (Administration and Control): Movable shade facility near the working spots and prefabricated temporary offices will be erected on site (subject to approval of landowner/custodian or authority).

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- Water supply: About 10,000 liters of water will be required per month for exploration activities. This water will be used for cooling down and washing of equipment, drilling related activities, and ablution. The water will be sourced from elsewhere and transported to site. Therefore, no project related water abstraction will be done onsite or within the site area.
- Potable water will also be made available for the exploration crew (workers) on site.
- Fuel Supply (machinery and equipment): Diesel will be used for machinery and equipment and fuel generator.
- Accessibility (roads): the EPL is accessible via C28 gravel road from Arandis. Therefore, project related vehicles will be using these existing roads to access the EPL. The Proponent may need to do some upgrade on the site access road to ensure that it is fit to accommodate project related vehicles, such as heavy trucks.

- Waste management: the different waste will be handled as follows:
- Sewage: mobile chemical ablution facilities will be provided on site. The wastewater will then be transported offsite to the treatment facility either by the Proponent or a designated/appointed external waste management contractor.
- General and domestic waste: Sufficient waste containers will be made available at both exploration sites and campsite for waste storage. The bins will be emptied into the main onsite container for disposal at the nearest landfill site, when necessary (upon reaching full capacity of the main waste container onsite).
- Hazardous waste: All vehicles, machinery and fuel consuming equipment will be provided with drip trays to capture potential fuel spills and waste oils. The waste fuel/oils will be carefully stored in a standardized container until such a time that it can be disposed of at the nearest approved hazardous waste management facility. The nearest considered facility town is Arandis; therefore, waste disposal agreement will be reached between the Proponent and the Town Council.

 Health and Safety: Adequate and appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be provided to every project personnel while on and working at site. A minimum of two first aid kits will be readily available at exploration sites to attend to potential minor injuries, while major injuries will need to be attended to further by transporting the injured to the nearest healthcare facility for treatment and necessary care.

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 Potential Accidental Fire Outbreaks: A minimum of basic firefighting equipment, i.e., two fire extinguishers will be readily available in vehicles, at the working sites and campsite.

4.3 Project Equipment, Material, Machinery and Vehicles

The following equipment and machinery will be required:

- 4X4 vehicles
- Truck
- Excavator / front-end loader
- Drilling fluids stored in manufacturers approved containers
- Air compressors

Generator for power supply

These equipment, machinery and vehicles will be kept at a designated storage site that will be established within the EPL.

4.2 Decommissioning: Rehabilitation of Explored Site

Decommissioning refers to the cessation of exploration activities, either upon discovering an economic feasible and worthy deposit or in the event of unsuccessful exploration results works. The Proponent will need to properly decommission the activity to either prepare the selected areas of the EPL for the next phase or upon unsuccessful exploration results, to rehabilitate the explored sites.

5 ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

This ESA process is conducted in accordance with the provisions stated out in the Environmental Management Act (No 7 of 2007) and its' Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (2012). The primary objective of the EA will be to identify potential negative impacts associated with the proposed activity, assess them, and recommend practical and effective mitigation measures to be implemented by the Proponent, to minimize these impacts, while maximizing positive impacts.

The main objectives of this ESA are to:

 Comply with Namibia's Environmental Management Act (2007) and its EIA regulations (2012).

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- Identify potential impacts associated with the proposed Activity.
- Inform Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) and relevant authorities about the mining activities and to provide them with a reasonable opportunity to participate during the EA process.
- Assess the significance of issues and concerns raised.
- Compile a report addressing all identified issues and potential impacts related to various aspects of the activity.
- Compile a Draft Environmental Management Plan (EMP) which includes impacts' management and mitigation measures.

5.1 Potential Impacts

The following potential impacts have been identified so far for the surrounding towns, settlements, and property:

POSITIVE:

- Socio-economic development through employment creation and skills transfer,
- Opens up other investment opportunities and infrastructure-related development benefits,
- Produce a trained workforce and small businesses that can service communities and may initiate related businesses,
- Boosting the local economic growth and regional economic development.
- Improved geological understanding of the area regarding targeted commodity, and
- Increased support for local businesses through the procurement of consumable items such as Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), machinery spare parts, lubricants, etc.

NEGATIVE:

• Potential disturbance of existing pastoral systems,

 Physical land / soil disturbance: The invasive exploration activities could possibly lead to soil disturbance. The potential damage to subgrade due to traffic compaction along access roads,

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- Impact on local biodiversity (fauna and flora) and habitat disturbance: Vegetation and animal species may be disturbed by e.g., by off road driving or being removed to create access roads and working spaces.
- Potential impact on water resources and soils particularly due to pollution,
- Air quality issue: dust may be generated from driving on site, surface excavation, drilling, and diamond wire sawing from could temporarily compromise the surrounding air,
- Visual impacts due to scars May occur on the landscape and relief.
- Potential occupational health and safety risks May occur due to movement / operating of machinery and equipment on site.

- Vehicular traffic safety and impact on services infrastructure such as local roads: the temporary potential increase in vehicular traffic during exploration may exert additional pressure on the local roads, especially by heavy vehicles such as trucks carrying project materials and equipment (drilling rig),
- Vibrations and noise associated with drilling activities may be a nuisance to locals,
- Environmental pollution through different types of waste generated on the site, particularly from the mishandling of hydrocarbons (fuels) and wastewater,
- unintentional uncovering of unknown archaeological objects or sites by certain project activities such as exploration drilling and excavation as well as known and marked heritage sites on targeted sites on the EPL and surroundings,

 Potential social nuisance and conflicts between

Archaeological or cultural heritage impact through

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 Potential social nuisance and conflicts between affected farmers / landowners and or neighbouring land users and Proponent due to the lack of communication or cooperation on raised issues and land use during exploration.

The potential impacts listed above are pre-identified and therefore should not be deemed as final or the only ones. Other potential impacts will be identified as the EA process progresses i.e., upon site visit and consultation with the public (I&APs). All impacts and public concerns/comments will be incorporated and addressed in the Environmental Assessment Report and EMP.
