

Suicide by hanging

Johny Sam (37), was found hanging from the roof of his place of residence by his housemate on Saturday afternoon, 27 March. According to police reports, no suicide note was found and no foul play is suspected. The deceased's next of kin were informed. Police investigations continue.

Noble shocked when he saw drugs in container

Grant Noble who stands accused of smuggling a record quantity of cocaine into Namibia four years ago said in the Windhoek High Court this week he was shocked and couldn't believe what he was seeing.

Noble said the container was supposed to have been filled with A4-size printing paper, which a Close Corporation, Zeeki Trading CC, of which he is the sole member, ordered from Brazil.

However, when customs officials, police officers and a police sniffer dog searched the container, they found boxes containing compressed blocks of cocaine among the boxes of paper inside.

Noble and Azhar were arrested on 15 June 2018 after a container they imported was found loaded with 412kg of cocaine worth an estimated N\$206 million.

Noble (40), and a fellow Walvis Bay resident, Dinath Azhar (65), are charged with dealing in 412kg of cocaine, alternatively possessing the cocaine and also face a count of money laundering. Noble told the court that Azhar asked him for help to set up a corporate entity which he could use to do business as he, (Azhar) did not want to do that in his own name, as he had unpaid debts and had been blacklisted, and he could not open a bank account in his own name.

Noble said, "I registered Zeeki Trading CC to assist Azhar, and while he was the sole member of the Close Corporation, Zeeki Trading was actually a business

He said Azhar never spoke to him about anything illegal or illicit and thatthe container with A4 paper which Zeeki Trading imported from Brazil was the first business the close corporation had conducted.

Azhar, told the judge while doing research about products he could import and sell in Namibia, he came across a company in Brazil that sold paper, and after doing his calculations, he realised he could make a good profit from sourcing A4 paper from that company and selling it in Namibia. "Noble and I never discussed the importation of cocaine. It wasn't even in our vocabulary" Azhar

He further told the court, he and Noble did not know there was something wrong with the contents of the container shipped from Brazil until it was opened by the police and cocaine was found inside.

Defence Lawyer, Sis Namandje, had introduced the statements as evidence after prosecution did not call witnesses. Paul Ndefhilile and Linekela Hilundwa, who had made statements to the police before the arrest of suspects Noble

The two statements make mention of Ndefhilile who is a clearing agent in Walvis Bay being visited by "white men" who wanted him to clear a container that had a customs stop order attached to it.

Ndefhilile further said he then contacted Hilundwa, who is attached to the Port Security and asked him to join them during their next meeting and pretend that he did not understand. During the subsequent meeting, Naethille said, the "white men" asked him to clear the container and offered him N\$500 000 which he increased to N\$2 million.

He further said he refused as the container was stopped by customs and it would be too risky to open it. The men further told him that the container contained drugs, which was situated at the third pallets and that there was also another seal which they can use to reseal the container after removing the drugs.

Hilundwa made a confirmatory statement and also said he informed his superiors at the port and that they informed the police.

Noble has during his testimony questioned why the court was not made aware of the information by the State. Prosecutor Timo Itula said the State did not deem it necessary as Noble and Azhar were the importers of the container and it was their drugs.

After the defence closed their case, Windhoek High Court Judge Orben Sibeya ordered that Ndefhilile and Hilundwa who made statements to the police be summoned to testify. The case is been postponed to 25 and 26 April for their



CRAN Imposes Temporary Stand Still Period On The Award Of Class Telecommunications And Broadcasting **Service Licences**

The Communications Regulatory Authority of Namibia (CRAN) subsequent to various stakeholder consultations in 2021, was implored to conduct a market study for the telecommunication and broadcasting sectors. The aim of the research is to determine the current market level of competition, market saturation, and any existing barriers to entry.

"CRAN conducted preliminary research by studying the preceding Sector Review Reports and international best practice. Through this investigation, it was determined that the envisaged market study on the telecommunication and broadcasting markets must be based on a fixed data set, parti-cularly the number of Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licensees currently in the market. Therefore, it is apposite that CRAN maintain a still market, in terms of market players, while conducting the study," states Emilia Nghikembua, Chief Executive Officer, CRAN.

CRAN therefore resolved, to temporarily suspend the award of new telecommunication and Broad-casting Service Licences for the period 1 October until 30 September 2023. In order to mitigate the potential impact of the temporary postponement, and cognizant of the provisions of the Communications Act (No. 8 of 2009), from 1 April, CRAN will accept new applications for Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licences, and consider such applications before 30 September. These applications must be submitted to the Authority before 30 June.

"CRAN will not accept or consider new applications for Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licences from 1 October until 30 September 2023. CRAN will, however, consider applications for amendment, withdrawal, transfer, and cession of existing Telecommunications or Broadcasting Service Licences when practically possible, and if such shall not result in a change of the data-set," added Nghikembua.

During the duration of the market study, CRAN will accept and consider applications for Spectrum Licences from existing service licensees only, and will also accept Spectrum applications for bands that are service licence

The market study research will include public stakeholder consultations, and the final report and recommendations will be submitted to the Minister of Information and Communications Technology (MICT) Honourable Dr Peya Mushelenga as per the provisions of the Communications Act. In consultation with the Honourable Minister CRAN will adopt and implement the conclusions of the Market Study in order to achieve a competitive market and eliminate barriers to market entry.

"While the temporary postponement of the award of new Telecommunication and Broadcasting Service Licenses will impact the business plans of prospective providers or Telecommunication and Broadcasting services, it is paramount that CRAN continuously intervene in the market dynamics to ensure fair competition, and remove barriers to market entry for the benefit of consumers," concluded Nghikembua.

291 Mass Houses un-occupied in Swakopmund Sharlien Tjambari

During his visit to the coast on Thursday, 31 March, Vice President of Namibia, Nangolo Mbumba visited Swakopmund's Mass Housing site. The construction of 291 mass houses in Swakopmund was put on hold, because the main contractor failed to pay the sub-contractor.

In the first phase of the Swakopmund Mass Housing project, 133 houses were completed, and are all currently occupied. Speaking to the media during the site visit, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Swakopmund Municipality, Alfeus Archie Bemjamin said the remaining three sites/phases could not be completed because of the main contractor failed to pay the sub-contractor. The matter has been in court for the past seven years. According to Benjamin, some of the 291 unoccupied houses are ready for occupation and can be reconstructed. Benjamin said the Mass Housing Project is a very important project, because 22 000 people in Swakopmund are in need of housing. "We hope that with the Vice President's visit, this matter can be taken up, and can be addressed at national executive level as soon as possible. Going forward, once the issue is resolved, council is forever ready to see what we can do to get the houses occupied so that people can move in." Benjamin

Second Vice President of Namibia, Nangolo Mbumba also visited the Swakopmund Urban Agricultural Project on Friday, 1 April.

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
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
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
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
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



























MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, 14 APRIL 2022 REGARDING THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT FOR THE: PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF !NARA NAMIB FREE ECONOMIC INDUSTRIAL ZONE ON PORTIONS 2, 3 AND 4 OF FARM 58, WALVIS BAY, ERONGO REGION.

INTRODUCTION

In terms of Section 21 of the EIA Regulations a call for open consultation with all I&APs at defined stages of the EIA process is required. This entails participatory consultation with members of the public by providing an opportunity to comment on the proposed project. A public meeting was convened for this purpose and was attended by representatives of the Municipality of Walvis Bay and the Namibian Navy in addition to the proponent's and consultant's team, with a low or no-show from the general public.

WELCOMING

Mr. Namene welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the ECT team.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

Mr. Namene provided a background on the proposed !Nara Namib Free Economic Industrial Zone on Portions 2, 3 And 4 of Farm 58, and that an environmental clearance is required before such a development can proceed. He further explained the environmental assessment (EA) process and the reasons why EAs are carried out.

The public was also informed about the public participation process that has taken place so far, including newspaper advertisements, public notices on site, and communication to other pre-identified Interested and Affected Parties. Information was given on the components of the development touching on aspects such as the locality, engineering services and access.

Potential environmental concerns were provided to the community, while urging them to contribute any other impacts that they foresee this development will have on the environment. After the presentation the floor was opened for questions and input from the community.

INPUT

As indicated the meeting was open for the general public but was attended by two organisations only. Most input given came from the Municipality of Walvis Bay officials present. Below is a summary of the input from the Walvis Bay Municipality officials:

Mr Andre Burger - General Manager: Roads and Building Control

Mr Burger raised a few pertinent issues related to the water and sewer infrastructure; roads, previous studies, and alternative sites.

- Given that the proponent is considering tapping into the existing Namwater pipeline
 for water supply to the development, It is advised to engage Namwater and the
 municipality as there has been challenges experienced with water pressures from
 that pipeline before, and the nearest borehole is approximately 20km away from
 the development site.
- The Municipality also has plans to provide infrastructure service in the area including sewerage works. The proponent's design team is encouraged to consult the municipality's engineering department to consider cost-sharing opportunities.
- While the proponent is looking at the development of Portions 2,3 and 4, perhaps consideration should also be given to look at the bigger picture in terms of providing water and sewer infrastructure servicing.
- A rail and road servitude has been provided for along the northern border of Portion 3 of Farm 58, as well as another one further north along Portion 8 of Farm 58.
 These will make it possible for long term access to this and other developments in Farm 58 once the road work on the New Walvis Bay interchange is completed.
- Since the proponent is in partnership with NIDA on this development, the proponent may want to consider other industrial properties that already belong to NIDA and are more ready than the proposed sites. An example is the Peugeot Plant and Extension 14.
- With the previous EIA exercise done for Xaris, whose allocated property is adjacent to the study area some issues were raised regarding the impact on tourism in respect of Dune 7 in the vicinity. Concern was raised on the visual intrusion and potential emissions.

Ms Nangula Amutenya-Amatsi - Environmental Coordinator

 There are other stakeholders such as the investors who have also been allocated land on adjacent portions in Farm 58. It is imperative that these parties are also consulted and informed of the proposed development. The list of those allocations can be obtained from the town planning division of the Municipality of Walvis Bay.

CONCLUSION

After the interactive session information on the way forward was shared with the attendees, in terms of the timeframe left for additional input before the comment period ends. The contact details of Environam Consultants Trading (ECT) was shared with the public.

The meeting was closed off and officially adjourned at 12:00
