account of Spot-On Discount Liquor and made payments of N\$60 000 to employees of Spot-On Discount Liquor.

In addition, the State charge, he also pretended to Taiyo Namibia that the bank account number of Walcon Construction changed from Bank Windhoek to Standard Bank and that Taiyo should pay an amount of N\$720 000 for work done by Walcon into the Standard Bank account. It was for this last offence that he was arrested in January 2020 in

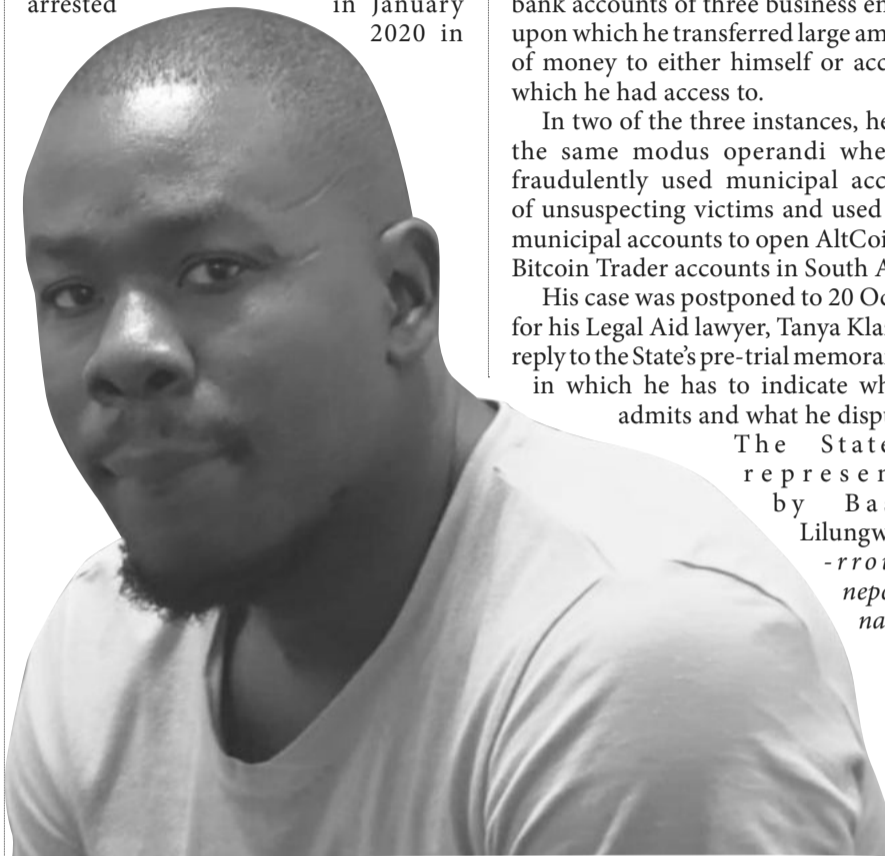
Oranjemund and appeared in the Walvis Bay Magistrate's Court where he was refused bail.

According to the summary of substantial facts in the indictment, Nestor is a former police officer who studied information technology at the Institute of Information and Technology where he gained knowledge on computer software and programming. With this knowledge, he fraudulently accessed the bank accounts of three business entities, upon which he transferred large amounts of money to either himself or accounts which he had access to.

In two of the three instances, he used the same modus operandi where he fraudulently used municipal accounts of unsuspecting victims and used those municipal accounts to open AltCoin and Bitcoin Trader accounts in South Africa.

His case was postponed to 20 October for his Legal Aid lawyer, Tanya Klazen to reply to the State's pre-trial memorandum in which he has to indicate what he admits and what he disputes.

A former police officer who studied information technology made a first appearance at the Windhoek High Court yesterday on charges of fraud, alternatively theft, money laundering, forgery and uttering.

It is alleged by the State that Ricardo Nghilifavali Nestor used the skills he acquired through his studies to swindle Namibia Marble and Granite (NAMAGRA) near Karibib and/or Carmen Bianca Wittreich out of N\$10 million. He allegedly hacked the internet banking profile of NAMAGRA and authorised the payment of N\$10 million from the company's Call Account to its business account.

From there he allegedly made payments of N\$5.515 million as follows: N\$4 million to AltCoin Trader, N\$500 000 to Sanele Nkosi, N\$500 000 to Lethuvuyo Trading and Projects, 16 x N\$20 000 salary payments and 39 e-wallet payments to the tune of N\$195 000.

This allegedly happened on 11 August 2018.

It is further alleged by the State that upon or about 11 and 12 September 2018 Nestor logged into the internet banking account of Spot-On Discount Liquor and made a once-off payment of N\$55 481.91 in favour of a Trader Account held in South Africa.

He also hacked the internet banking account of SR van Wyk or Meransha Properties during the same period and transferred N\$34 500 to a Bank Windhoek account held by Spot-On Discount Liquor, the State alleges. Furthermore, the indictment read, he hacked into the

Councillor unmasked for defaulting on campaign material

Kalahari constituency councillor Ignatius Kariseb is in hot water after he allegedly refused to pay for campaign materials worth N\$7 000.

A Windhoek business owner, Meite Nguvauva, claims she is seeking N\$7 000 from Kariseb for the 145 masks she provided him as campaign material before the 2020 local and regional authority elections, which resulted in Kariseb's reelection as the constituency councillor.

Kariseb is a Swapo heavyweight in Omaheke and is the current chairperson of the Omaheke regional council.

"I am a single mother of five - hustling my way around just to be robbed by those tasked to protect us. I provided campaign materials to many Swapo leaders during the 2020 elections, but almost all of them have paid, apart from Kariseb," she said.

"Every time I call him, it is either he is waiting for money from GIPF or from somewhere. It has been two years now," she added.

Contacted for comment, Kariseb this week acknowledged having received the items, he claimed they were too small and therefore they were not useful and that Nguvauva



might pick them up from his office if she so desired.

He accused Nguvauva of having ulterior motives, which is to tarnish his "good reputation" that he has maintained over the years.

"Why is she bringing up this now? Her actions are very clear. She wants to tarnish my name because of the upcoming congress," said Kariseb who is vying for a spot on the Swapo central committee at the elective congress later this year.

"You are busy contesting and running to be a part of the Swapo central committee for 2022. Your manifesto states that you are all for 'youth and women empowerment', however, your actions state otherwise," read a text sent to Kariseb by Nguvauva this week.

"Have you forgotten the single mother of five that you have scammed out of her N\$7 000? Or does your empowerment for our women only apply when it's for beautiful manifestos to further your agenda?"

"Pay up the money if you truly believe in your own campaign. It has been over three years of not taking up ownership and responsibility, which shows us the public, what kind of leader you most certainly will be, once elected," the text reads.

Nguvauva said, "at one time, the councillor promised to pay me with constituency funds to which I refused."

Mentally challenged woman's rape baffles police

RUNDU - The Kavango East police in Mukwe are struggling to gather evidence to make an arrest after a mentally challenged woman was raped allegedly on 5 September 2022 at an unknown time at Biro village.

The Kavango East crime investigations coordinator, Bonifatius Kanyetu, told *New Era* the suspect is known but cannot be arrested at this stage, as the police still need to complete their investigations before handing it to the prosecutor general to grant them a warrant of arrest.

"The investigations must just finish, then the docket will be sent to the prosecutor general for a decision. The suspect is the step father," Kanyetu said.

"Cases with people that have mental challenge are complicated. You have to look at the affected person's evidence, then at least put the facts together. The victim's case was reported late and family managed to take her to the doctor but what samples will one take after a week? It's only the evidence on the scene that can be used as an exhibit," he noted.

According to the police report seen by *New Era*, the incident was reported that the young woman was allegedly raped in her young brother's room.

"Circumstances: It is alleged that the suspect in the case called the victim, who is impaired (believed to have mental illness), sent her to do household work then he instructed the victim to go into her young brother's room. The suspect followed the victim into that room and again instructed her to lay on the bed and had sexual intercourse with her without consent. The victim is not able to give consent due to her condition," the report said.

This was said by Erongo governor Neville Andre during the launch of the Namport Maritime Week at Walvis Bay.

The launch coincided with World Maritime Day that was celebrated around the world yesterday, and observed under

The day celebrates the significant impact of the maritime industry on the world and global trade, the importance of safety to the shipping industry, and the

significance of marine security and the environment.

The launch presented learners from Walvis Bay schools a chance to explore first-hand some career opportunities as well as the economic benefits of the maritime

sector.

Andre, who encouraged learners to consider taking an interest in maritime opportunities, said the awareness week should not only serve as an educational activity, but also as a precursor to further endeavours of unlocking economic activities in the region post-Covid-19.

"As we may all remember, our region has borne the harshest brunt of the pandemic, having been declared an epicentre several times. Nonetheless, we find resoluteness in our uniqueness as a region and in the work of our good corporate citizens such as Namport and other stakeholders upon whom we count on to build back our regional economy better and stronger," he noted.

According to Andre, the coastline and only deep-sea port of Walvis Bay gives it an advantage against other regions to champion development, and make a salient contribution towards the country's economy.

Legendary educator Denys Nandi remembered

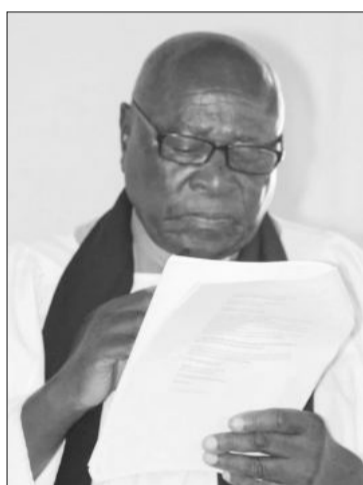

Denys Kamulipakua Nandi, a former inspector of education, political veteran and a man of faith, wore many hats. He died last week at the Rhino Park Hospital in Windhoek at the age of 83.

Nandi was the elder brother of the Deputy Prime Minister, Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah.

Being only the second Oshiwambo-speaking person to obtain a degree in education after legendary author, the late Daniel Namuhuja, Nandi invested his knowledge of education in his community and served in several profiles of education that included being a teacher, school principal and an inspector. He was also a member of the Ovamboland Bantustan Homeland Assembly during the apartheid South African regime, where he served alongside other veterans such as the late Katutire Kaura, Peter Kalangula and Dirk Mudge, amongst others.

As a family man, his daughter

Faith Nandi-Sheya described him as a loving father, "one who respected our will, rights and decisions in life. He was a principled man, full of humility. Our gem. He will be forever in our hearts."

Nandi was likewise a former deacon and a church secretary for the Church of England in Namibia, which is now known as

the Reformed Evangelical Anglican Church of Namibia (REACH-NA).

As eulogised by bishop Lukas Katenda of REACH-NA, Nandi leaves behind a rich legacy, not only as a husband and father, but as a unique person in his own right and a national leader, especially in the education sector.

He started his elementary education at St Cuthbert's Primary School at Onamutai, which was started by his father, and then continued to St Mary's Senior Primary and High School (an Anglican Church School) at Odibo, where he became a teacher and principal after completing his junior certificate and matric.

He pursued his further education at the then famous Augustineum Teachers' College at Okahandja before he continued at the University of Turfloop, now known as the University of Limpopo in South Africa.

Upon returning from South Africa, Nandi played an important role in establishing some secondary schools such as the Ponthofi Senior

Secondary School in the Ohangwena region, the Ongha Secondary School, also in Ohangwena, as well as Oluno (now Andimba Toivo ya Toivo) Secondary School in the Oshana region.

"Nandi, with other educationalists of their time such as Namuhuja, were key leaders in the promotion of educational culture in Ovamboland, alongside other education leaders in other homelands within the territory, as it was then organised before independence," remembered Katenda, adding that despite the challenges he and others endured, they persevered to inspire and enforce the culture of education in Ovamboland.

On the religious front, Nandi became involved in the establishment of the Church of England in Namibia, the Reformed Evangelical Anglican Church of Namibia.

REACH-NA started as a result of the ordeals of 1969 within the Anglican Diocese of Namibia.

He was later made a deacon

in 2000.

He served as the first secretary and interpreter of the church, work which he has done diligently for about 40 years until his retreat in 2017. His successor, Lasarus Hakwaake, was elected the new secretary.

"He has been a delegate to annual general synods of REACH-SA, representing REACH-Namibia. He also translated some materials into Oshikwanyama for usage in the church. These materials included Eitavelo and the Catechism of the Church of England.

After the death of bishop Peter Kalangula in the year 2008, church secretary Nandi was requested to be the chairman of the executive committee of REACH-Namibia, work he executed with humility and diligence for nine years until a new movement was mooted in 2017, taking effect in 2018, when the young folk converted to and joined REACH-Namibia," Katenda said.

He is also remembered as a believer in education as a key to the future for young people.

"He was humble and full of wisdom. He was reserved in many ways, and spoke only when it was necessary. He was trustworthy, and indeed had a special love for children and young people. He was also a farmer," said Katenda in the obituary.

Nandi's burial, which will take place on Saturday, 2 October 2022 at the Onamutai cemetery of the Ongwediva constituency, will be preceded by his memorial service that will take place at the Christ-REACH Church in Ondangwa.

He is survived by six children and his siblings.

LOCALITY PLAN 9331M² POS

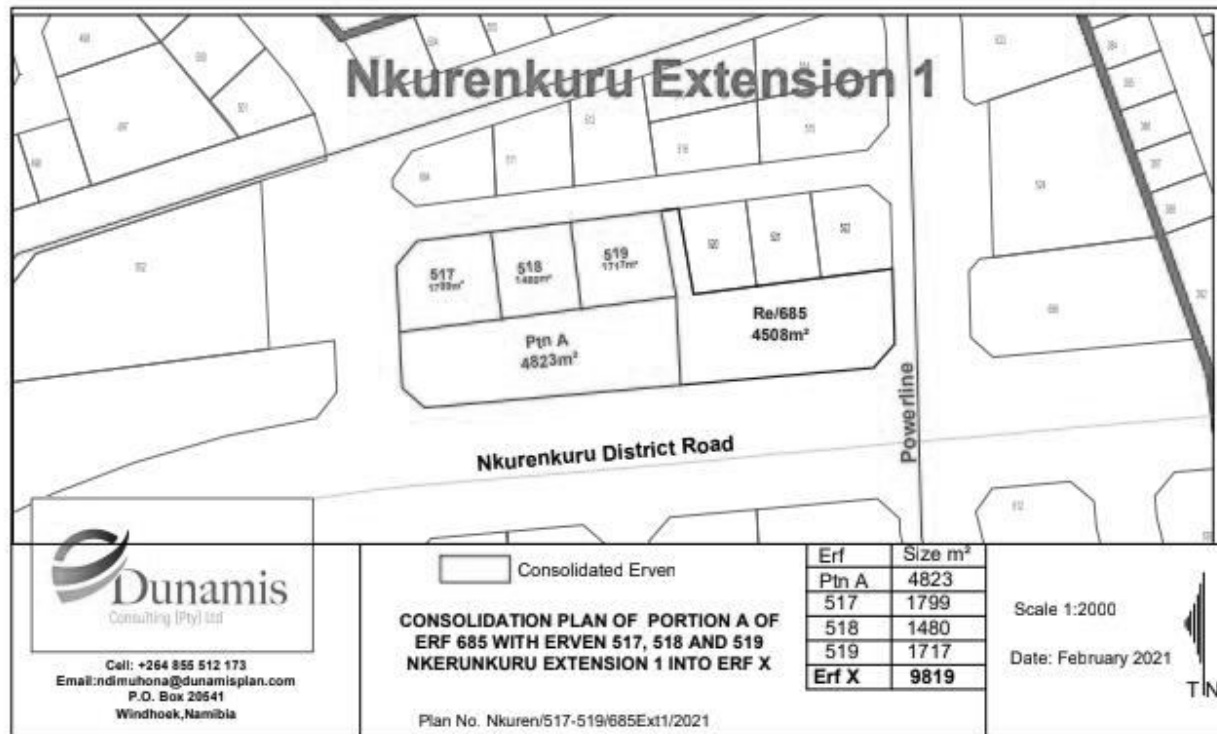


SUBDIVISION PLAN P/A 4823M², REM (4508M²)

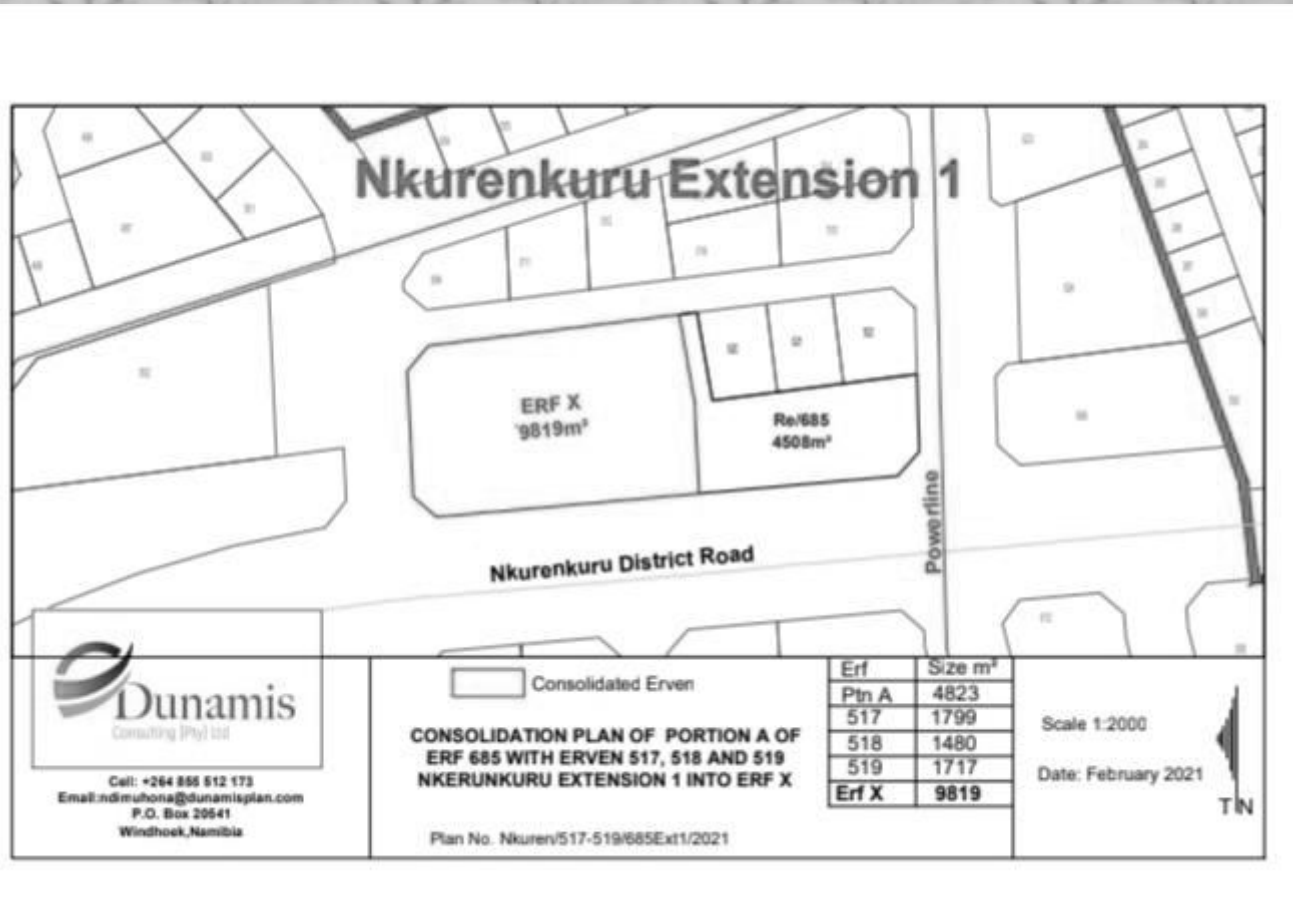


CONSOLIDATION PLAN:
