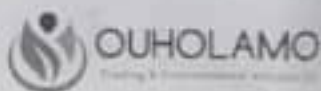

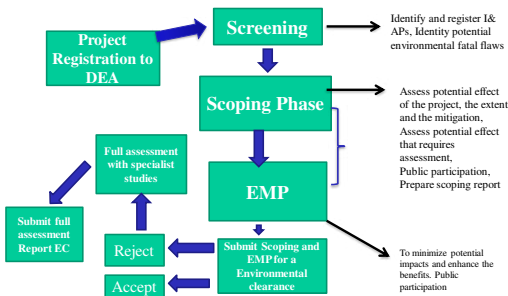

She stated the purpose of the meeting that is to inform public about the project and to allow the public to obtain information about the proposed project and to view documentation as well as to provide input and voice any concerns concerning the project in a way that they are to be given the opportunity to comment, to ask questions and to raise any concerns be it environmental or social regarding the Okalago Piggery proposed. She further explained in details the aim for the consultation with the public that is to:-

- ❖ Inform Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) of the proposed project;
- ❖ Identify issues, comments and concerns as raised by I&APs;
- ❖ Promote transparency and an understanding of the project and its consequences;
- ❖ Serve as a structure for liaison and communication with I&APs; and
- ❖ Provide local knowledge and input in identifying potential environmental (biophysical and social) impacts and “hotspots” associated with the proposed development.

She further informed the public that their comments will be recorded and considered in the Environmental Assessment report that will be submitted to the Ministry of Environment for review.

## **7. LANGUAGE USED IN THE MEETING**

English and Oshiwambo were the languages used during the meeting. When people gathered during the meeting, Ms. Vakuwile announced that the presentation was to be held in English, as it is the official language and that there is an interpreter the Proponent. People requested Ms. Vakuwile from the consulting team to present in both languages Oshiwambo and English were necessary since all people that attended were oshiwambo speaking and that she knew more about the project than

the interpreter. She then informed people to communicate in any of the two languages they feel comfortable with or known to them.

## **8. CHAIRPERSON'S INTRODUCTORY REMARKS**

### **8.2. Conduct at meeting**

Ms. Vakuwile chaired the meeting and provided all the information and guidelines of the meeting and announced the agenda. She further provided the rules of the meeting that focused mainly on how participants should behave in the meeting in order to finish the meeting in a positive way. Below are the meeting rules that people were requested to abide to:

- ❖ All participants were requested to put their phones on silence or to switch them off
- ❖ Participants were told to remain silent during presentation
- ❖ Questions were to be reserved till after the presentation for the discussion period
- ❖ Order was given that only one person was allowed to speak at a time during the discussion season
- ❖ Participants were required to state their names before asking any questions or raise any comment.

### **8.3. PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The meeting presentation was mainly focused on the topics listed below:

- ❖ The purpose of the public meeting
- ❖ Project Background
- ❖ Legal and regulatory framework
- ❖ Environmental Impact Assessment Phases
- ❖ Scope of EIA
- ❖ Identified positive and negative impacts of the project

- ❖ Management of the impacts
- ❖ Questions and comments

Ms Ileka was second to speak, and she informed the community that her idea for the project was initially small but ended up being big when she started putting ideas together. The original plan was to sell only to the community, but as the ideas popped up, it looked like it would require supplying to more than just the immediate community.

Ms. Ileka explained further that when she started with the idea of the piggery project, she did not know that an EIA would be required for the project and that the information was only made known to her after the Okahao traditional authority gave her the approval for the land use and informed her of the need for the land to be divided and a portion given to her by the title holder, Mrs. Anna Ileka. Ms. Ileka also informed the community of the future need for employment, starting with +/- 20 employees.

Mr. Thomas lileka spoke about his knowledge of the project in his capacity as the headman of Okanya Village and the permission given to Ms. Ileka from the Traditional Authority Council of Okahao, of which meeting he was also in attendance. He spoke about the need for employment and advancement of the community from projects like these. He vocalized his agreement for this project.
