Meeting Proceedings:

1. Welcome Remarks

- **Erongo Consulting Group:** Welcomed all attendees to the EIA Consultation Meeting for the Net Zero Industrial Park. Emphasized the importance of public participation in the project's environmental and social impact assessment.

2. Project Background

- **Erongo Consulting Group / Institute for Impact Sciences and Research Design:** Provided a brief overview of the Net Zero Industrial Park project, highlighting its key objectives and components. The project aims to create a sustainable industrial park powered by renewable energy sources, with the Locomotive and Wagon Workshop being a key component. The workshop will provide essential maintenance and repair services for locomotives and wagons operating in Namibia.

The purpose of the application is to bring the use in line with the Windhoek Zoning Scheme. Sufficient parking is provided for on-site in line with the requirements of the Council.
