The public consultation meeting was attended by fifty-five (56) people, including: An Economic Consultant, a GIS technician, an Archaeologist; all from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS), EPL Proponent, constituency councilor and community members affected by the EPL.

1. INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

The meeting started with a prayer and was officially opened by Hon. Councilor Edward Mate with welcoming remarks and pleaded for tolerance of the Consultants and EPL Proponent with questions from the community members. Mr. Stefanus Johannes (a GIS technician / Consultant) introduced himself and his colleagues. He also introduced the EPL Proponent, during which he informed the meeting about the independence and non-existence of relationship between the Consultants (*vis-à-vis*; Consulting Company) and the EPL Proponent. He assured the meeting that Consultants would do a fair and unbiased assessment of the EPL. Mr. Stefanus expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting.
