### **RE.: CONSTRUCTION OF SOLAR PLANT - REHOBOTH**

The subject above has special and significant reference.

This letter serves to inform you that the process of Expression of Interest to establish a solar plant in Rehoboth has been concluded.

As you may be aware that Council and Alensy have been engaging in constant negotiation to try to arrive at a conclusive business understanding with one another, Alensy was thus requested to submit options / offers to Council for consideration. It follows therefore that after due diligence and technical advice from competent advisors, your options were submitted to Council for consideration and approval.

We are thus glad to inform you that Council, at its Ordinary Council meeting held on 01 June 2022 has resolved, under resolution **RTC 08/01/06/2022/04<sup>th</sup> OCM**, resolved in favour of Alensy to construct a solar plant in Rehoboth. This is to say option No. 2 as presented to Council, was the basis of the approval. **This option entails:**

- (a) System size offered: 4717kWp
- (b) Term: 25 years
- (c) Tariff: NAD0.72 / kWh or Equal to Nampower Off-Peak Tariff Escalation:

#### **Notes:**

- Installed at Rehoboth, behind Nampower Meter, to avoid "Nampower Losses Charge".
- Social Responsibility includes 2 light mast for RTC
- PPA to include an option for extension of additional 10 years (council has the right of first refusal)
- Capacity is limited by Modified Single Buyer Market Model, to 30% of annual consumption

**The approval was granted with the following condition:**

- That the agreement be entered into between RTC & Alency.
- That the agreement be prepared and submitted to ECB for scrutiny before it's signed by both parties
- That the two solar high light must be build first before the actual plant.
- RTC holds first right of refusal to extend PPA after 25 yrs. – considering technology advancements and great potential for cheaper options.

In the meantime, Council will do all necessary statutory processes before any agreement is entered into.
