African titles at stake

TWO African title fights will be at stake when the MTC Salute Boxing Academy hosts a boxing bonanza at the Safari Hotel on 12 November. Immanuel Josef will defend his WBO Africa flyweight title for the second time, and faces a tough opponent in Tisetso Modisadife of South Africa. The 30-year-old Josef is more experienced, with a record of 13 wins, four losses and one draw. He won the WBO title in East London, South Africa, in July last year, when he beat the home town favourite Sihle Jelwana on a fifth round TKO, and then defending it five months later when he beat Muhsin Kizota on a unanimous points decision in Windhoek. Modisadife turned pro six years ago and has built up a promising record of seven wins and three losses. Like Josef, he also fought Jelwana, in December 2020, but ended on the losing side as he went down via a fifth round TKO. Since then he has won two consecutive fights against South African opponents, but he has lost three of his last six fights. At a press conference yesterday, Josef said his belt was going nowhere. "I don't have a lot to say, but I'm proud, especially when I see this belt in front of me. This is my baby, and every time I go to sleep I have to look at it, and it's going nowhere," he said. "I'm going to fight Tisetso from South Africa on 12 November. I just know his name, I've never seen him fighting. I heard he is good, but he hasn't beaten me and I'm going to show him. I'm ready, my sparring partners are busy sharpening me and I've got my coaches who are always there," he

said. Josef called on boxing fans to come out in numbers. "It's going to be my night, I'm going to steal the show. I'm not even going to predict a knockout or anything, but I'll win. That's the only way I'll be able to move higher up the rankings," he said. "So I'd like to call upon all the fans to come and witness a great night. Whatever my opponent is coming with it won't help, because I'm going to destroy him, that's a promise and I mean my words," he said. The other title fight sees Fillemong Ngyhutenanye defending his WBA Pan Africa flyweight title against Ally Ngwando of Tanzania. Ngyhutenanye is still unbeaten after 10 fights with nine wins and one draw, while Ngwando has a record of eight wins, one loss and two draws. There will be six other fights on the undercard, including Harry Simon Junior, unbeaten after 17 fights, up against Chikondi Makawa of Malawi (30F, 14W, 15L, 1D), while Abed Shikongo (7F, 7W) will take on Simon Shafodino (9F, 2W, 5L, 2D) for the vacant national welterweight title. Fredrich Ngyhiyolwa of the MTC Salute Boxing Academy thanked Safari Hotel for coming on board to host the event. "It's quite important that we acknowledge Safari Hotel for coming on board. As we all know, in the past Safari did not host such events, so we should be thankful that they have become a co-partner in meeting the government halfway in reaching its developmental objectives through the sport of boxing," he said. Tickets are available at N\$200 for general seats, N\$10 000 for a table of 10, wine and dine, and N\$20 000 for a VIP ringside table of 10.

Eleven (11) people, including one Environmental Consultant, and one Archaeologist from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS) attended the Public Consultation Meeting. - **Please refer to the attached attendance register.**

INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

Mr. Mandume Leonard, an Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) from Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd officially opened the meeting. He expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting.

The meeting attendance register was then circulated for the attendees to write down their names and contact details and sign so that they could be added to the list of Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

The agenda of the meeting included the following main points:

2.1 Brief Description of the Project and the EIA/ESA process

Mr. Leonard briefly explained to the meeting attendees on the proposed project activities. He further indicated that the Environmental Management Act (EMA) No. 7 of 2007 and its 2012

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations requires that before the project activities can be undertaken, an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) or ESA should be undertaken by an independent environmental consultant. For this reason, the Proponent appointed Excel Dynamic Solutions (Pty) Ltd (EDS), to carry out the EIA and apply for the Environmental Clearance certificate (ECC).

2.2 The ESA Process and the Public Role in the Process

Mr. Mandume an Environmental Assessment Practitioner from EDS explained to the attendees what the meeting was all about and why they were invited (with reference to EMA and its 2012 EIA Regulations on Public Consultation (Section 21 to 24). Mr. Mandume explained what an ESA is and that the proposed exploration activities are one of the listed activities in the 2012 EIA Regulations of the EMA that cannot be undertaken without an ECC from the Environmental Commissioner.

2.3 Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

To ensure transparency and that the attendees understand both sides of the proposed project activities, the Environmental Consultants also presented the potential pre-identified potential positive & negative environmental and social impacts.

2.4 Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)
