The Public Consultation Meeting was attended by over fourteen (14) people (excluding the four (4) members of the consultant team). Please refer to the attached attendance register.

TRANSLATION OR INTERPRETATIONS OF LANGUAGES (ENGLISH AND AFRIKAANS)

Given the fact that some of the meeting attendees were elders from the area who only spoke Damara and Afrikaans language and to ensure transparency and effective communication in the meeting, Mr. Clemens Naomab translated for the elders (from English to Damara and Afrikaans where necessary) and provided translation to the Consultant from Damara to English to make sure that all comments and other inputs presented in the local language were recorded in the minutes for consideration in the ESA Report.

INTRODUCTION AND WELCOMING REMARKS

The meeting was opened with a prayer by the Traditional Authority Senior Leader, Vice-Captain Cornelius Bowe who handed over to Senior Traditional Authority Councilors, Mr. Joseph Seibeb and Samson Baku Awaseb for welcoming remarks. The floor was then

handed over the floor to Mr. Alexander Shapumba (the Consultant) who expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting and briefly introduced himself and the consulting company to the community members. All attendees were given an opportunity to introduce themselves, starting with the rest of the team of consultants. The Consultant then explained the purpose of the meeting to the attendees and why they were invited.

The meeting attendance register was circulated for the attendees to write down their names, contact details and sign so that they could be added to the existing list of interested and affected parties (I&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

The attendees were provided with copies of the Background Information Document before the consultant presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

1. Brief Description of the Project

The consultant introduced the Proponent (in absentia), highlighting their interests as the EPL holder. EPL8613 was also introduced in detail, covering the application date, mineral commodities covered, date of receipt of preparedness to grant from MME and conditions of approval amongst others. The status of the EPL at the time was discussed, highlighting the need for ECC. The provisions and limitations of a successful EPL applicant/EPL holder were discussed, including the difference between an EPL and a Mining License. A summary of the EIA process was given, outlining the Public Consultation Process and the role of I&APs in the process, as well as other stakeholders involved.

The Environmental scoping report (ESR) and Environmental management plan (EMP) were discussed as the desired outcome of the EIA process, including their use as part of the ECC application. Emphasis was put on the importance of I&APs in the formulation of

both the ESR and EMP through their comments and engagement, and therefore encouraged.

A brief description of the project activities was then presented to the attendees, covering the scope of proposed activities, and a brief description of each activity.

2. Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

The consultant presented the pre-identified potential positive (i.e., creation of employment opportunities, boosting of local economy etc.) and negative (environmental disturbance of farming land, impact on biodiversity, surface scars, occupational health, and safety etc.) and social impacts to the attendees, this was done to ensure that the community understand both sides of the activities on the proposed project.

The Archaeological and Heritage Impact Assessment Practitioner (AHIA), Mr. Baron Mabhumbo was given the floor to explain the importance of heritage or cultural sites. The AHIA asked the community to inform him of any known heritage sites, to which the house indicated that there are no known sites. Mr. Hendrik Afrikaner indicated the presence of old graves, but do not fall within the farms that lie within the EPL boundary.

3. Public Open Discussion (Interactive Session)

The meeting attendees were then presented with an opportunity to raise their concerns/issues and or comment on the proposed project activities. The issues and comments recorded are presented in Table 1 below.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by #Khoadi-//Hôas Conservancy representatives. The floor was then handed over to Mr. Alexander Shapumba (the Consultant) who expressed gratitude to everyone in attendance for making time to attend the meeting and briefly introduced himself and the consulting company to the community members. All attendees were given an opportunity to introduce themselves, starting with the rest of the team of consultants. The Consultant then explained that Conservancy representation at the initial round of consultations was not adequate, and that the consultant team resolved to hold meetings specifically with the concerned conservancy management committees and or representatives.

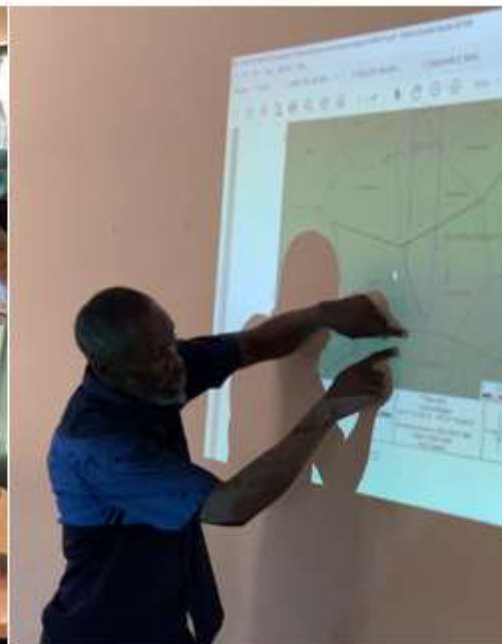

The meeting attendance register was circulated for the attendees to write down their names, contact details and sign so that they could be added to the existing list of interested and affected parties (I&APs) and receive further information on the ESA process.

MEETING AGENDA AND PRESENTATION

The attendees were provided with copies of the Background Information Document before the consultant presented the agenda of the meeting which included the following main points:

1. Brief Description of the Project

The consultant introduced the Proponent (in absentia), highlighting their interests as the EPL holder. EPL8613 was also introduced in detail, covering the application date, mineral commodities covered, date of receipt of preparedness to grant from MME and conditions of approval amongst others. The status of the EPL at the time was discussed, highlighting the need for ECC. The provisions and limitations of a successful EPL applicant/EPL holder were discussed, including the difference between an EPL and a Mining License. A summary of the EIA process was given, outlining the Public Consultation Process and the role of I&APs in the process, as well as other stakeholders involved.

The Environmental scoping report (ESR) and Environmental management plan (EMP) were discussed as the desired outcome of the EIA process, including their use as part of the ECC application. Emphasis was put on the importance of I&APs in the formulation of both the ESR and EMP through their comments and engagement, and therefore encouraged.

A brief description of the project activities was then presented to the attendees, covering the scope of proposed activities, and a brief description of each activity.

2. Presentation of Potential Project Impacts

The consultant presented the pre-identified potential positive (i.e., creation of employment opportunities, boosting of local economy etc.) and negative (environmental disturbance of farming land, impact on biodiversity, surface scars, occupational health, and safety etc.) and social impacts to the attendees, this was done to ensure that the community understand both sides of the activities on the proposed project.

The Archaeological and Heritage Impact Assessment Practitioner (AHIA), Mr. Baron Mabhumbo was given the floor to explain the importance of heritage or cultural sites. The AHIA asked the community to inform him of any known heritage sites, to which the house indicated that there are no known sites. Mr. Hendrik Afrikaner indicated the presence of old graves, but do not fall within the farms that lie within the EPL boundary.

The attendees were also provided with printed copies of the following revised documents for review:

- The Notice to applicant of preparedness to grant application EPL 8613 from the MME,
- the draft ESA for EPL 8613,
- the draft EMP for EPL 8613,
- the draft AHIA for EPL 8613,
- the Proof of Consultation for the first round of consultations for EPL 8613.

The consultant then presented the key aspects of the draft Environmental Scoping Report and the Environmental Management Plan in detail.

The consultant made a point to:

- iv. Highlight and clarify the fact that the ECC sought through the EIA process was for mineral prospecting and exploration, and not for mining activities.
- v. Demonstrate that the potential impacts were not similar to those expected from mining activities.
- vi. Discuss potential impacts, drawing lessons learned from exploration and mining projects in the surrounding area. The lessons learned from the happenings

stemming from the activities on the mining claim on Mesopotamie 504 were used to discuss potential impacts, and propose mitigating actions.

The floor was then opened to the attendants to raise those concerns.

The issues and comments recorded are presented in Table 6 below.

Comment/issue No.	Issue / Comment / Question	Response and name of responder:
1	What will happen to our livestock after the EIA is completed and mining activities start?	The current EIA process will result in an ESR and EMP, which will form part of an ECC application. Approval of this application will result in issuance of ECC for activities required for prospecting and exploration only. Should the proponent wish to commence mining, another EIA process must be started for the application of an ECC for the mining activities. The EMP is drafted to ensure minimal impact on livestock.
2	Will the EPL owner chase locals who are currently mining small pockets/deposits?	Not necessarily. The objective of the ECC is to allow exploration activities towards the discovery of an economically viable deposit. It is not to permit mining at this stage. Small scale mining, as long as it is not mechanized, will not have a material impact on the size of the deposit should there be any.

FINAL REMARKS AND CONCLUSION OF THE MEETING

The Consultant thanked the attendees for their input through comments and raising their concerns. He indicated to the attendees that all their comments, concerns and inputs had been noted down for consideration and addressing in the ESA Report. The meeting was concluded with closing remarks and a prayer by Mr. Wicklief Gaseb.

The meeting was adjourned at 16h30.
