Euphorbia tirucalli (rubber euphorbia)
Jatropha curcas (physic nut)
Moringa oleifera (Moringa)\*\*
Parkensonia aculeata (Jerusalem thorn/kraal naboom)
Psidium guajava (guava)
Alternanthera pungens (khaki weed)

- \* Can seriously impact groundwater of not managed.
- \*\* Often mistaken for the indigenous species and should especially not be planted where M. ovalifolia occurs.
