## Ex-Arsenal boss Wenger joins Fifa as global development chief

Former Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger has been appointed as Fifa's new chief of global football development, with the Frenchman set to oversee the growth of the sport plus technical matters, soccer's world governing body said on Wednesday.

The 70-year-old was recently linked with the Bayern Munich job following the sacking of Niko Kovac but said that while he was approached he was never a candidate for the job.

Wenger will be the leading authority on technical matters on Fifa's Football and Technical Advisory Panels involved in the International Football Association Board (IFAB) review and decision-making process on potential changes to the game's laws.

He will also be the chair of a technical study group.

"I look forward to taking on this important challenge, not only because I have always been interested in analysing football from a broader perspective but also because Fifa's

mission... is truly global," Wenger said in the Fifa statement.

"I believe that the new Fifa we have seen emerging in recent years has the sport itself at the heart of its objectives and is determined to develop the game in its many different components. I know I can contribute to this objective and will put all my energy into this."

Wenger will also focus on educating coaches and contribute to the development of an executive programme that will help former professionals enter management.

Wenger left Arsenal in May last year after a reign of 22 years during which he redefined the Premier League club and became their most successful manager.

He led the Gunners to three Premier League titles - including in 2003-04 when his 'Invincibles' team went unbeaten for an entire season - as well as seven FA Cups and took Arsenal into the Champions League for 20 years in a row. SUPERSPORTS

## 'Go back to baseball' - Ibrahimovic confirms Galaxy exit

Swedish star Zlatan Ibrahimovic confirmed his departure from the Los Angeles Galaxy on Wednesday, but gave no clue over his future plans or possible retirement.

The 38-year-old striker's departure from the Galaxy had been widely expected following the club's elimination from the Major League Soccer playoffs last month.

Ibrahimovic, who joined the Galaxy in the opening months of the 2018 campaign, announced the end of his Californian sojourn in a characteristically enigmatic post on Twitter.

"I came, I saw, I conquered. Thank you @lagalaxy for making me feel alive again," Ibrahimovic wrote. "To the Galaxy fans - you wanted Zlatan, I gave you Zlatan. You are welcome."

"The story continues... Now go back to watch baseball."

The Galaxy said in a brief statement the club had parted company with Ibrahimovic by mutual agreement.

"We would like to thank Zlatan for his contributions to the LA Galaxy and Major League Soccer," said LA Galaxy President Chris Klein.

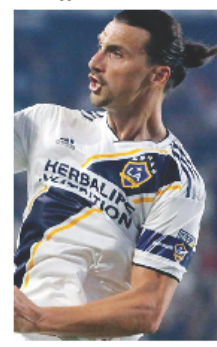
"Since his arrival in 2018, Zlatan has positively influenced the sport of soccer in Los Angeles. We are grateful for his work ethic and passion. We thank Zlatan for his professionalism and immeasurable impact on the Los Angeles community and the soccer community in North America as a whole."

Ibrahimovic has been strongly linked with a return to Italian club AC Milan, where he played for two seasons between 2010 and 2012, scoring 42 goals in 61 league appearances.

Major League Soccer Commissioner Don Garber hinted last week that Ibrahimovic may make a return to Italy, telling ESPN in an interview the striker was being "recruited" by Milan.

Ibrahimovic has also reportedly been targeted by Serie A side Bologna, according to Italian daily Corriere dello Sport.

Although Ibrahimovic was unable to help Los Angeles Galaxy return to the pinnacle of Major League Soccer, the Swede has been one of the most successful foreign players ever to grace the league, scoring 53 goals in 56 regular season appearances. -MSN

# Rare vintage and classic cars going under the hammer in Joburg

**J**OHANNESBURG - Fancy South Africa's oldest Fiat, or a Humber from that's also more than a century old? Perhaps a more modern classic performance car like a Mercedes-Benz Pagoda SL or a Ferrari 308 GTSi is what you need in your life.

Either way, there will be a full house of legendary vintage and classic cars going under the hammer at the Killarney Country Club in Johannesburg this weekend in an auction hosted by Stephan Welz & Co.

Also worth looking out for is the British Racing green 1969 Jaguar E-Type 4.2 Series 2 Convertible, with original black leather interior in full concours condition, and the 1981 Ferrari 308 GTSi (as made famous by Tom Selleck in Magnum PI). There are also several Rolls Royce and Bent-

ley cars on auction and various classic Mercs, including a fully restored 220S Ponton, a W108 Merc 280SE and the aforementioned Pagoda SL.

"The sale promises to attract enthusiasts, collectors and investors from across the spectrum with a treasure trove of rarities to suit a variety of tastes and budgets," the organisers said.

## Car Security tips

**Y**our car will be most secure against thieves if kept in a locked garage or secure car park. But it could be more likely to get bumped or scraped that way, so your insurer may increase your premium slightly to reflect this.

If you park your car on your driveway, consider installing a CCTV camera or motion detector lighting to deter criminals. If your only option is to park on the street, make sure it's in a well lit area. But be aware that if you park away from your home — even just around the corner — you must inform your insurer.

**Remove temptation for opportunistic thieves**  
Keep valuables out of sight, and ideally don't leave them in

your car at all. Even low value items can tempt thieves — and while these things might not cost a lot to replace, you could end up losing your no claims bonus by making a claim for a forced lock or broken window.

Don't forget to hide any signs of expensive equipment too, such as windscreen marks left by sat-navs.

**Get a car alarm**  
You might also want to consider fitting an alarm if your car doesn't have one, or even an additional alarm if it does.

Insurers are more likely to give discounts for factory or professionally fitted alarms, but a DIY-fitted proximity alarm could prove to be a good deterrent for thieves. -uswitch
