

INTRODUCTION

Background and Methodology

Tourism statistics in Namibia have until recently been very limited and only published on an irregular basis. The area of visitor arrival statistics, providing information on the volume and type of tourism and normally forming part of a broader national immigration statistics, has been particularly weak.

Prior to Namibia's Independence, registration of border crossing travellers was only undertaken at South Africa's international borders as Namibia was a South African province. Consequently, no statistical information on the number of arrivals and departures to/from Namibia is available from that period.

In connection with Independence, the Ministry of Home Affairs introduced an immigration arrival and departure registration system. The system was based on the collection of a series of travel and personal information about all arriving and departing travellers through the completion of the arrival and departure forms respectively. The information collected from the immigration forms were computer entered for statistical processing by a specially developed software programme, the INFLUX system, on the Government mainframe computer, handled by the Directorate of Data Systems and Services under the Office of the Prime Minister. Unfortunately though, the Ministry of Home Affairs has not had the sufficient resources and experience to handle the large amount of immigration records. The Ministry was thus experiencing a tremendous backlog in the processing of collected immigration forms with the result that no immigration statistics were ever compiled and published. At the same time, the Central Statistics Office was only in the process of being established and did not have the additional resources to ensure a viable arrival and departure statistical system.

In general, information on past and current levels of tourism, disaggregated according to important visitor characteristics such as country of residence (source market), purpose of visit, average length of stay, etc., is absolutely essential for the planning, development and marketing of tourism in Namibia. The poor state of tourism statistics in Namibia was identified during the preparation of the European Community financed Namibia Tourism Development Plan Study, undertaken in 1992 by the Danish consultancy firm Hoff & Overgaard. The Tourism Development Plan made a series of recommendations regarding the establishment of viable tourism statistical systems in order to develop adequate information tools for the proper planning, operation and management of the tourism sector. Subsequently, as part of a technical assistance programme provided by the European Community, the Tourism Policy, Planning and Management Information Unit (PPMIU) was established within the Ministry of Environment and Tourism, among other things, with the objective to institute appropriate tourism statistical systems for the benefit of both the Government and the private tourism sectors.

Since the beginning of 1994, the PPMIU has liaised closely with the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Central Statistics Office (CSO) and the Directorate of Data Systems and Services on a revision of the immigration statistical system and how best to make optimal use of past and current statistical data.

In order to cope with the considerable backlog developed during the early years of Independence in the computer entering of the collected information from immigration arrival and departure forms introduced in early 1990, the National Tourism Development Plan recommended a series of procedures aimed at speeding up the data entry process, including non-entry of old records, entry of arrival forms for non-citizens only and simplification of the data entry procedures through the omission of non-essential information from the arrival forms.

The Ministry of Home Affairs adopted these recommendations with the encouraging result that by May 1994, data entry of arrival forms for all non-citizens were completed for the first six months of 1993. This enabled the Policy, Planning and Management Information Unit (PPMIU) with the assistance of the Directorate of Data Systems and Services to compile and publish a series of visitor arrival tabulations as part of the Compendium of Selected Tourism Statistics. The Compendium represented for the first time a useful source of information on the actual visitor and tourist arrivals in Namibia.

In addition, the Ministry of Home Affairs on the basis of recommendations made by the PPMIU by July/August 1994 introduced new arrival and departure declaration forms. The new forms were designed to provide information on visitor profile characteristics in line with international standards and definitions.

The joint efforts of the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Central Statistics Office, the Directorate of Data Systems and Services and the PPMIU continued with the establishment of a joint management group to monitor the processing of arrival forms. As a result, the PPMIU is for the first time in a position to present actual visitor arrival statistics for the complete calender year of 1993. In addition to the 1993 visitor arrival statistics presented in Tables 1 - 12, tourist arrivals at Windhoek Airport for the first nine months of 1994 are presented in Tables 12 - 15.

DEFINITIONS AND CONCEPTS OF TOURISM TERMS

In order to understand correctly the statistical information on visitor arrivals as presented in this paper, it is found useful to provide a summary of the most important definitions of tourism terms as recently revised by the World Tourism Organization (WTO) and adopted by the United Nations Statistical Commission and the Statistical Division of the European Community (EUROSTAT) for the compilation of international tourism statistics.

In accordance with the WTO definitions, Tourism is defined as:

The activities of persons travelling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes.

All travellers engaged in tourism are described as "visitors" as distinct to "other travellers", making the term "visitor" the basic concept for the whole system of tourism statistics. A further distinction is made between tourism within a country (domestic tourism) and tourism between countries (international tourism).

For the purpose of tourism statistics, the term International Visitor describes:

Any person who travel to a country other than that in which s/he has his/her usual residence for a period not exceeding 12 months and whose main purpose of visit is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the country visited.

Subsequently, international visitors are divided into two broad categories:

International Tourists (overnight visitors):

International visitors who stay at least one night (but not longer than one year) in a collective or private accommodation in the country visited.

International Same-day Visitors:

International visitors who do not spend the night in a collective or private accommodation in the country visited.

On the basis of the WTO recommendations, the following classification of international tourists according to their main purpose of visit (in the absence of which the visit would not have taken place) is applied for Namibia:

- leisure, recreation and holidays
- business, conference and professionals
- visiting friends and relatives
- transit/stop-over
- other purposes.

The WTO also separates tourists coming for health treatment and for religion/pilgrimage purposes. However, these groups are found insignificant for Namibia and included under "other purposes".

Further, the Policy, Planning and Management Information Unit is applying where possible the WTO's recommended classifications of international tourist according to other visitor characteristics such as mode of travel, age groups, etc.

COMMENTARY

Each of the arrival statistical tabulations presented in this paper are briefly summarised in the following:

Tables 1a and 1b: Total Arrivals in Namibia by Month and Category of Travellers, 1993

This table will in future provide information on the total number of travellers entering Namibia through one of the country's immigration posts, disaggregated into returning residents, intending residents and foreign visitors. As a result of the backlog in the processing of arrival forms, forms completed by Namibian citizens have not been analysed. Therefore, Table 1a only include information on foreign visitors as well as non-citizen residents. On this background, Namibia recorded a total of 316,104 arrivals during 1993, excluding arrivals of Namibian citizens. Of the total arrivals, 288,443 were foreign visitors, while approximately 23,000 were returning residents (excluding Namibian citizens) and 4,600 came for other or non-stated purposes. Of the total number of foreign visitors, 88.4 percent or almost 255,000 were tourists, i.e. overnight visitors spending at least one night in the country, while 11.6 percent or approximately 33,500 were sameday visitors. Most visitor arrivals were recorded in July with about 33,200 followed by December and June with about 28,600 and 27,800 respectively. In accordance with the analysis of the utilisation of accommodation establishments, the lowest number of visitor arrivals was recorded in February with approximately 18,600.

Tables 2a and 2b: Quarterly Visitor Arrivals in Namibia by Visitor Category and Country of Residence, 1993

Of the total number of visitor arrivals of nearly 288,500, South Africa accounted for as much as 61.8 percent with 178,180 arrivals. Germany represents the second largest source market, generating 10.6 percent of the total number of visitor arrivals with almost 30,500 arrivals. All other European countries together generated about 21,600 visitors, corresponding to 7.5 percent of the total number of visitor arrivals in Namibia in 1993. The neighbouring countries of Angola, Botswana and Zambia each accounted for a little less than 5 percent of all visitor arrivals, corresponding to just under 14,000 visitor arrivals from each of these countries.

The highest number of visitor arrivals was recorded during the third quarter with almost 81,000 arrivals or 28 percent of the annual total. On the other hand, least visitor arrivals was recorded during the first quarter with 60,750 arrivals.

Tables 3a - 3c: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Month and Country of Residence, 1993

Of the total of almost 255,000 tourists (overnight visitors) visiting Namibia in 1993, more than 155,000 or 60.8 percent came from South Africa while the second most important market, Germany, generated close to 30,000 tourists or 11.7 percent of the total. All other European countries together still generate less tourists to Namibia than Germany, i.e. a total of approximately 20,500 or slightly more than 8 percent of the total number of tourist arrivals in

While South African tourists peak in May-July and in December, tourist arrivals from Germany and other European countries peak in March-August and July-November.

Tables 4a - 4c: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Month and Purpose of Visit, 1993

1993.

Of the total number of tourist arrivals, the great majority, 71 percent or almost 181,000, came for leisure, recreation and holiday purposes. In this connection, it should be noted that the old arrival form used in 1993 did not contain a pre-classification of visitors by purpose of visit. The classification was undertaken by the immigration officials according to the purpose stated by the travellers. At the time, the Ministry of Home Affairs did not distinguish separately the important category of tourists visiting friends and relatives (the so-called VFR travellers). As a result, VFR travellers have normally been classified as holiday tourists, thereby contributing to this group's exceptionally high proportion of the total number of tourist arrivals in Namibia. Business tourists accounted for 15.2 percent of all tourist arrivals with approximately 38,800, while about 7,100 or 2.8 percent stated that they were in transit to other destinations. Approximately 28,000 tourists or 11 percent of the total stated other purposes for their visit to Namibia.

While the largest number of holiday tourists was recorded in July, December and April, in that order, and the lowest number of holiday tourists recorded in January-March and October-November, business tourists showed a more uniform arrival pattern over the year.

Tables 5a and 5b: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Month and Mode of Travel, 1993
Almost 7 out of every ten tourists to Namibia (67.3%) or a total of more than 171,600 arrived by road, while 32.4 percent or approximately 82,500 came by air. A negligible 810 tourists stated that they arrived by rail. While most road tourists were recorded in June-July and December, tourists arriving by air peaked in July-October and in March-April.

Tables 6a - 6c: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Country of Residence and Purpose of Visit, 1993 Expectedly, South Africa accounted for the great majority of tourist arrivals regardless of their purpose of visit. In particular, they accounted for more than 86 percent of tourists in transit and more than 71 percent of all business tourists. Of the total number of holiday tourists, 57.9 percent or almost 105,000 came from South Africa including tourists visiting friends and relatives. Germany generated a little more than 28,000 holiday tourists, accounting for 15.5 percent of all holiday tourists to Namibia in 1993. Namibia's other neighbouring countries of Angola, Botswana, Zambia and Zimbabwe together generated about 23,200 holiday tourists, accounting for 12.8 percent of all holiday tourists. While two thirds of the South African tourists came for holiday, as many as 94.4 percent of all German tourists came for this purpose. Tourists from African countries, except from Zambia, more often than other tourists came for business purposes. For instance, more than 32 percent of the tourists from "Other Africa" and more than 24 percent of all Zimbabwean tourists came to Namibia for business. Also the Scandinavian countries recorded a high proportion of business tourists with 30 percent.

Tables 7a - 7c: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Country of Residence and Mode of Travel, 1993 Not surprisingly, the great majority of tourists from South Africa and Namibia's other neighbouring countries arrived in Namibia by road, varying from two thirds (Angola and Zimbabwe) to more than 90 percent (Botswana and Zambia). Oppositely, between two thirds and 87 percent of all European and North American tourists arrived by air. As a result, European tourists accounted for almost half of the total number of air arrivals with about 39,300. A little less than 28,000 South African tourists arrived by air, accounting for almost 34 percent of the total of 82,554 air tourist arrivals. Expectedly, more than 9 out of every 10 of the few tourists arriving by rail were from South Africa.

Tables 8a and 8b: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Country of Residence, Intended Length of Stay and Tourist Nights, 1993

On the basis of information provided by the tourists at the time of entry into Namibia regarding their intended length of stay, it is estimated that the approximate 255,000 tourists visiting Namibia in 1993 intended to spend a total of almost 4 million nights (3,928,196) in the country. This indicates an overall average intended length of stay of 15.4 nights. Obviously, the intended length of stay may vary to some extent from the actual length of stay as tourists may either shorten or extend their stated intended length of stay. Tourists from Scandinavia recorded the largest intended length of stay with 22.6 nights followed by tourists from Other Countries (21.2 nights), Angola (19.6 nights), Zimbabwe(19.5 nights) and Germany (19.4 nights). Zambian tourists on average recorded the shortest intended length of stay with 11.1 nights, while South African tourists stated an average intended length of stay of 13.9 nights.

More than 45 percent (115,108) of all tourists recorded an average intended length of stay of one week or less, of which more than 60,000 or 23.5 percent of all tourists only stayed between 1 - 3 nights. A little less than 58,000 tourists (22.6 %) stated an intended length of stay of 1 - 2 weeks, while 20 percent of all tourists or approximately 51,000 intended to stay longer than 3 weeks in the country.

More than 50 percent of all German tourists intended to stay longer than two weeks, while this was the case for 34 - 47 percent of other European tourists. On the other hand, Zambian tourists recorded a higher proportion than other tourists, intending to stay only 1 - 3 nights, followed by tourists from Botswana (34.7%) and South Africa (28.7%).

Tables 9a and 9b: Tourist Arrivals in Namibia by Country of Residence, Sex and Age, 1993 About 167,700 or almost two thirds (65.8%) of all tourists to Namibia in 1993 were male, while a little less than 87,300 (34.2%) were female.

The largest age group was the middle age group of 30 - 39 years accounting for almost 25 percent of all tourist arrivals with slightly less than 63,000, followed by the 20 - 29 years category with 57,800 (22.7%) and the 40 - 49 years category with a little less than 52,000 tourists (20.3%).

Table 10: Quarterly Tourist Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Visitor Category and Country of Residence, 1993

In a tourism planning context it is interesting to analyse separately visitors arriving to Namibia by air at the country's main international airport, Windhoek Airport. In addition, Windhoek Airport is the only port of entry for which preliminary statistics on visitor arrivals are available for the major part of 1994, enabling initial trend analysis during the period 1993 - 1994. Table 10 shows that of the almost 80,000 visitors arriving at Windhoek Airport during 1993, South Africa still accounted for the largest proportion with 33.4 percent or about 26,700 arrivals. However, Germany followed closely after with approximately 23,300 arrivals constituting almost 30% of all visitor arrivals at the airport. Other European countries together accounted for 19.4 percent with approximately 15,500 arrivals.

During the year, most visitor arrivals were recorded at the airport in the third quarter with 22,917 followed by the quarter October-December with slightly more than 21,000 visitor arrivals. A little more than 94% of all visitor arrivals were tourist arrivals (overnight visitors) while same-day visitors accounted for slightly less than 6% with about 4,600 arrivals.

Tables 11a - 11c: Tourist Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Month and Purpose of Visit, 1993 Of the total of 75,241 tourist arrivals at Windhoek Airport during 1993, 71 percent or 53,416 came for leisure, recreation and holiday purposes (including tourists visiting friends and relatives), the same relative proportion as recorded for the country as a whole. A little more than 20,000 tourists came for business purposes, accounting for 26.8 percent of all tourist arrivals at the Airport, compared to 15.2 percent for the country as a whole. Most tourist arrivals were recorded during the period July-October while the lowest number of tourist arrivals was recorded in January and May with about 4,800 for each month corresponding to 6.4 percent of the annual total.

Table 12: Quarterly Visitor Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Visitor Category and Country of Residence, January-September 1994 (Preliminary figures)

As for 1993, South Africa and Germany together accounted for the great majority of all visitor arrivals at Windhoek Airport during the first nine months of 1994, with almost 40,500 out of a total of 62,748 visitor arrivals, corresponding to 64.5 percent of all arrivals. It is however, interesting to note that German visitor arrivals at Windhoek Airport during this period surpassed arrivals from South Africa. Other European countries retained their combined share of 19.4 percent of the total number of visitor arrivals at the airport.

Tables 13a - 13c: Tourist Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Month and Purpose of Visit, January-September, 1994 (Preliminary figures)

Almost 40,000 tourists out of a total of 59,638 tourist arrivals at Windhoek Airport during the first nine months of 1994 came for leisure, recreation and holiday purposes (including tourists visiting friends and relatives), corresponding to 66.5 percent of all tourist arrivals at the airport. This proportion is less than the similar proportion in 1993, where 71 percent came for holiday purposes, mainly due to a low registration of holiday tourists in August. This may be due to incomplete processing of forms at the Ministry of Home Affairs for this month. Of the total number of tourist arrivals at the airport 27.7 percent or about 16,500 tourists came for business, while 5.8 percent or almost 3,500 came for other purposes or were in transit.

Table 14: Total and German Tourist Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Month, January-September, 1993 and 1994 (Preliminary figures)

During the first nine months of 1994, total tourist arrivals at Windhoek Airport increased by 4,400 to 59,638, compared to 55,236 for the same period in 1993. This correspond to an 8 percent increase in total tourist arrivals. Compared to 1993, an increasing number of tourist arrivals were recorded in all months in 1994 except for August, where a decrease of more than 26 percent was recorded. This, however may be a result of incomplete processing of arrival forms for August.

The German market with an increase of 3,930 tourists accounted for almost 90 percent of the registered total increase in tourist arrivals during the first nine months of 1994. Thus, German tourist arrivals at the airport increased by a staggering 24.2 percent to more than 20,000 during the nine-month period compared to the same period in 1993. In some months like May and June increases in excess of 50 percent in German tourist arrivals were recorded. The considerable growth in the German market should be seen in connection with increased flight frequencies from Germany to Namibia by both Air Namibia and Lufthansa as well as the introduction of flights between the two countries by the German airline LTU.

Table 15a and 15b: Tourist Arrivals at Windhoek Airport by Main Market Areas, January-September, 1993 - 1994 (Preliminary figures)

Also the Scandinavian market recorded a considerable growth of 25.8 percent during the ninemonth period in 1994, and Other Countries recorded a 32.6 percent increase compared to the same period in 1993, however in both cases at a much lower level than the German market. Other markets recording an increased number of tourists include North America (13.9%) and France (10.1%).

The British market, in spite of serious promotion efforts by the national carrier in this market, remained stagnant as did South Africa, recording a marginal increase of 1.7 percent from the 1993 figures. Other African markets together experienced a decline of almost 20 percent.

European countries as a whole, excluding Germany and the United Kingdom, recorded an increase in tourists arrivals at Windhoek Airport during the nine-month period under review corresponding to 7.7 percent, compared to the same period in 1993.

Overall, German tourists arriving at the airport increased their share of total arrivals from 29.4 percent during the first nine months of 1993 to almost 34 percent during the same period in 1994. At the same time, South Africa's and Other African Countries' shares of total tourist arrivals at Windhoek Airport declined from 32.3 and 11.4 percent in 1993 to 30.4 and 8.5 percent respectively in 1994. European countries other than Germany retained their combined share of about 20 percent of all tourist arrivals at the airport.




