Objectives of Counting


1 To estimate the total numbers of game HOW MANY?

- estimating biomass to manage the veld conditions and inter-species competition
- setting reasonable off-take quotas
 determining the value of the Park's wildlife

- monitoring veld condition in areas of high game concentration

IS WILDLIFE INCREASING OR DECREASING?


- monitor changes per species
- assist management to achieve its objectives for wildlifemanagement, biodiversity conservation and the protection of rare / vulnerable species
